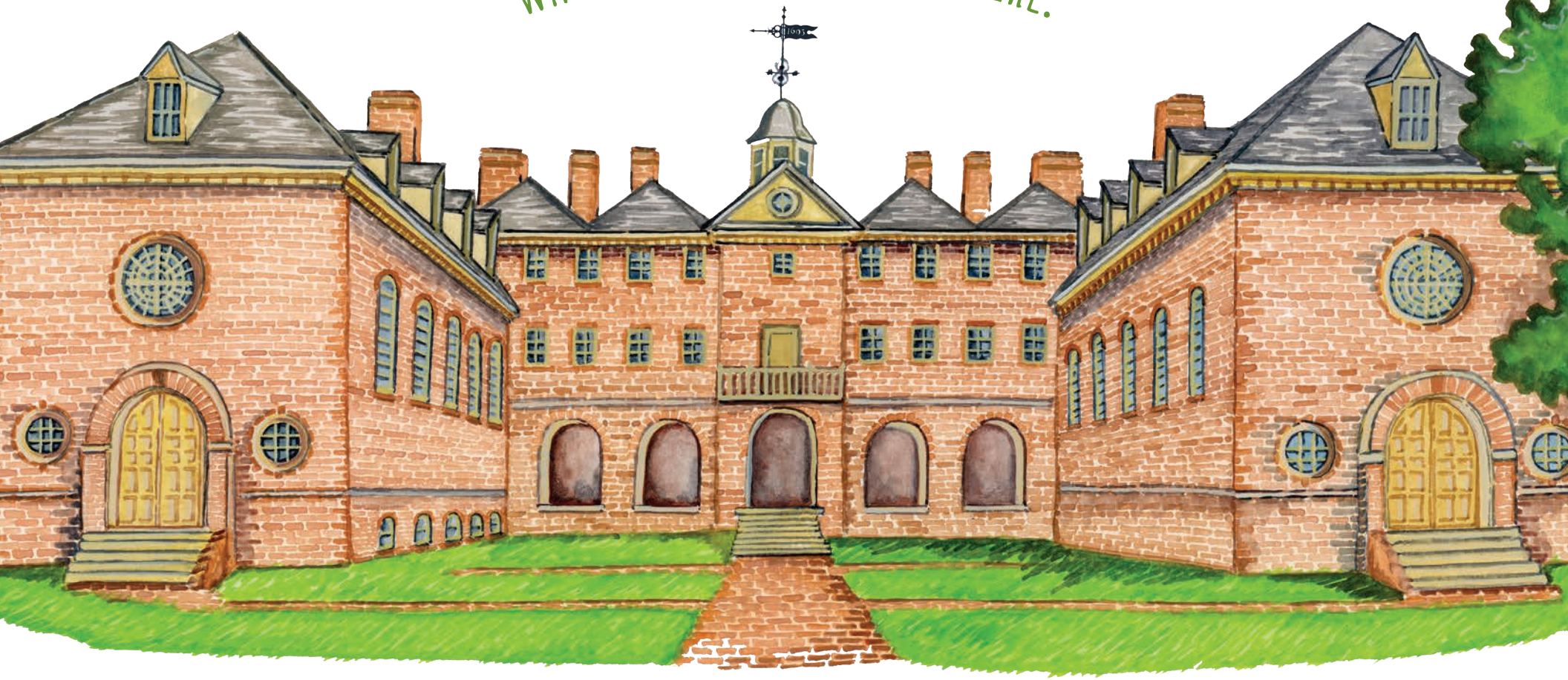
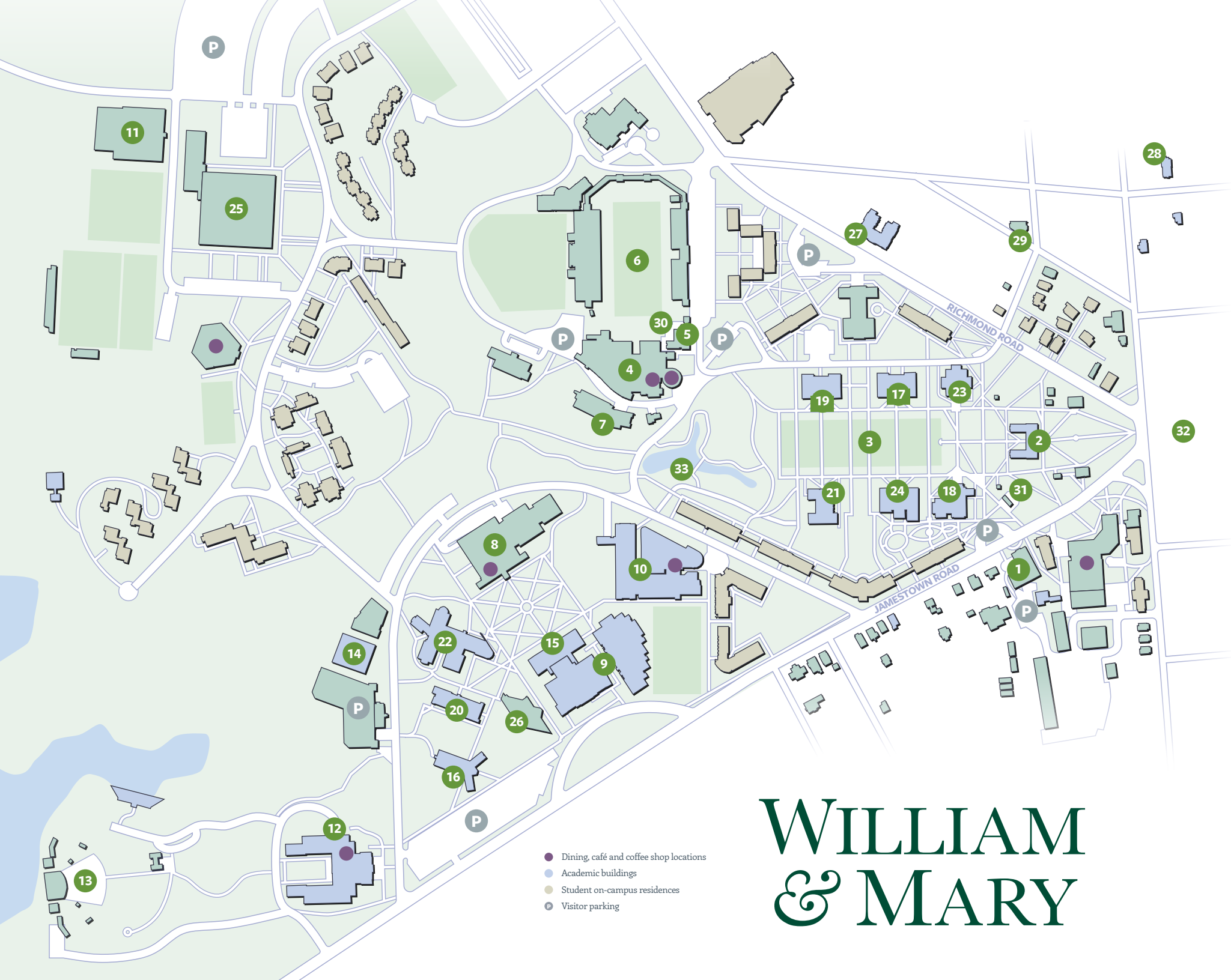

## 1 Office of Undergraduate Admission

The **admission office** is open most weekdays from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The office hosts a variety of visit opportunities and can help answer your questions about the W&M experience and the application process. ## 2 Sir Christopher Wren Building

Originally constructed between 1695 and 1700, the **Wren Building** serves as a welcoming gateway to our university and the backdrop for many of W&M's most beloved traditions. Imagine studying in the oldest academic building still in use in the U.S., where generations of leaders have convened to forge innovative solutions and advance ideals that changed the future.

## 3 Sunken Garden

The **Sunken Garden** is William & Mary's quad — and a favorite gathering spot in the heart of campus. It was constructed in 1935 with the help of the Civilian Conservation Corps created by President Franklin D. Roosevelt as part of his New Deal economic recovery plan. Lined on its longest sides by six academic buildings, this open area is the perfect place to relax in the sun between classes or play a spirited game of football or frisbee.

## 4 Sadler Center

The **Sadler Center** is William & Mary's student union, a hub for campus life. Grab lunch, pick up essentials from the campus convenience store or learn more about our 450+ clubs and organizations focused on community service, sports, student government, social events and more. You can also shoot some pool, catch a Homebrew student performance or see a movie in the Commonwealth Auditorium. Newly renovated and expanded, the Sadler Center is also home to almost a dozen Student Affairs offices, including the Center for Student Diversity, Community Engagement and Dean of Students.

## 7 McLeod Tyler Wellness Center

## 8 Earl Gregg Swem Library

One of the university's most innovative and beloved spaces is **Swem Library**. Ranked #10 best college library by Princeton Review, Swem features dynamic and interactive spaces like the Makerspace and the Reeder Media Center, with sound-proof studios and production equipment. Loaded with traditional study rooms and quiet nooks, the library is also home to the Writing Resources Center and the TutorZone, which provide academic assistance, and the Special Collections Research Center, which documents the university's centuries-old history. ## 9 Arts Quarter

The new **Arts Quarter** sets the stage for an incredible future for the arts at William & Mary. The heart of this 180,000-square-foot project features a modernized and expanded **Phi Beta Kappa Memorial Hall** and a new music building, which includes six high-quality performance venues with 1,500 audience seats. The Arts Quarter also includes an extensive expansion to the **Muscarella Museum of Art (26)**, which has nearly 6,000 items, including works by Pablo Picasso, Henri Matisse and Georgia O'Keeffe. ## 10 Integrated Science Center (ISC)

The **ISC** offers 500,000 square feet of STEM facilities that provide the perfect place to cultivate your curiosity and explore cross-disciplinary collaboration. State-of-the-art classroom and lab spaces welcome future biologists, chemists, neuroscientists, mathematicians, psychologists, data scientists and applied scientists under one roof. ## 11 Bee McLeod Recreation Center

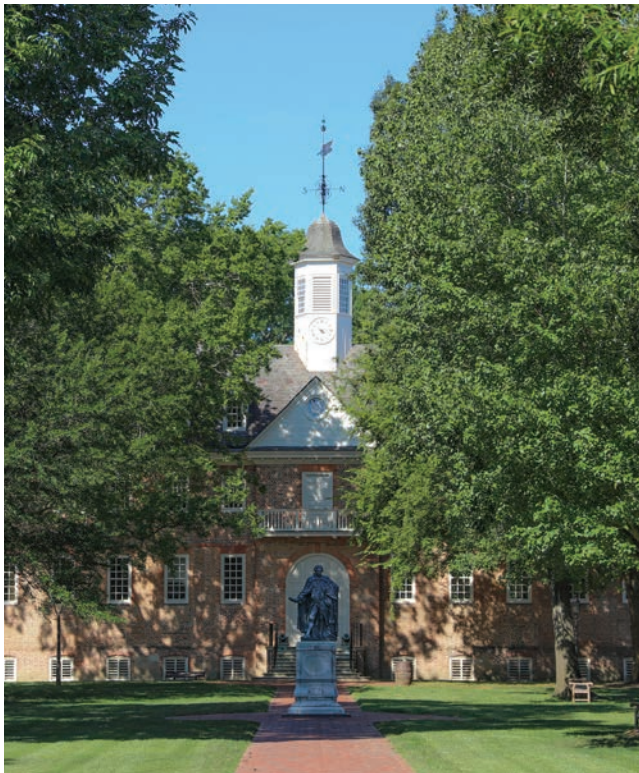

The university recently erected **Hearth: Memorial to the Enslaved (31)** as a distinguished landmark of inclusion and a local hub for community building. The memorial is designed to resemble a fireplace and features the names of people who are known to have been enslaved by the university. It was a key priority of **The Lemon Project: A Journey of Reconciliation**, which was established to research and publicly report on the university's role in slavery.
