

THE BENJAMIN STODDERT EWELL AWARD



In 1987, the Student Association (now the Student Assembly) established an award to honor well-rounded graduating students -- both graduate and undergraduate -- of the College, those who best exemplify a liberal arts education through their activities as well as studies. This award was named in honor of Benjamin Stoddert Ewell, the President of the College of William and Mary, who by ringing the Wren Building Bell kept the College alive when its doors closed during the Civil War. Ewell recognized that students are the heart of the College's existence and continued the spirit until the students could bring life back to campus.

Recipients of the Ewell Award will receive a certificate at the Spring Awards Reception and will be listed on the awards sheet at graduation. Up to 40 recipients will be selected. Candidates for the award must be full or part-time students with a minimum of a 2.0 cumulative GPA who are eligible to participate in the Commencement ceremony in May 2012.
