Meeting called to order at 12:00 pm.

1. Curriculum Review Committee Executive Summary Discussion (Teresa, Michael and Joshua)
 - Update on timeline is posted on Blackboard site
 - Faculty of Arts & Sciences Meeting scheduled on December 4 for Executive Summary discussion
 - EPC will vote on December 7, 2012 – EPC will not vote on the language, it will be voting on the content of the guiding principles and conceptual framework
 - January 18, 2013 – EPC will review the resolution - prepared by Kim Wheatley and CRSC members. No voting on the resolution
 - FAS will vote on the resolution at their February 5, 2013 meeting
 - If this is approved, EPC will be responsible for moving this forward. EPC will set up working groups, one per domain and one for each level (100, etc). Working groups will consist of EPC members, with other members of faculty and CRSC members as consultants.
 - Curriculum Review Committee agreed to make two changes to the Executive Summary after their discussion with EPC members. Changes are the following:
 - a) Page 2 (First Bullet) – #3 – Guiding Principles Embodied in the College Curriculum
Original version – Be taught by William and Mary Faculty
Revised version – Be largely taken at William and Mary
 - b) Page 3 – (Third Bullet) #3 – Guiding Principles Embodied in the College Curriculum
Original version – Enlarge our students’ global perspective through an experience beyond the traditional classroom
Revised version – Enlarge our students’ global perspective through an experience that engages the world beyond campus
 - Dean Teresa Longo will remain the Ad Hoc Dean for Curriculum Review
