**Overview**

2020-2021 marked the sixth year of the COLL curriculum. EPC approved 135 proposals for COLL attributes, 27 Course changes, 24 Curriculum changes, 26 new course proposals without COLL attributes, 5 applications for non-traditional modes of instruction, and 3 course domain attributes. Among these were the first 11 courses with the CONS prefix for Integrative Conservation. In addition, the Faculty of Arts & Sciences (FAS) approved a revision to the COLL 300 requirement brought by EPC.

In consideration of the extenuating circumstances faced by students during the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, EPC voted to recommend increased flexibility in the Pass/Fail policy during the Fall, 2020 semester. The normal Pass/Fail policy was reinstated for the Spring, 2021 semester.

## Changes to the COLL Curriculum

- On March 2, 2021, the Faculty of Arts & Sciences voted to approve a revision of the COLL 300 requirement brought by EPC. The changes eliminate overlap with the new COLL 350 requirement, and eliminate the prescription of themes and visitors by the Center for the Liberal Arts (CLA). In addition to internal EPC deliberation, a separate subcommittee hosted two faculty focus groups and two town hall discussions, and considered surveys of faculty and students previously obtained by the Center for the Liberal Arts. The subcommittee consisted of Ben Boone (CLA), Francie Cate-Arries (ISAC), Victoria Costa (ISAC), Josh Erlich (EPC), Christine Nemacheck (CLA), Kristin Wustholz (EPC).

The COLL 300 description approved by the faculty is as follows:

COLL 300 courses explore the diverse perspectives and socio-cultural values of people and communities of countries outside the geographical boundaries of the United States, and/or within these boundaries for the study of sovereign Native nations, indigenous communities, and U.S. territories.

COLL 300 directly connects students with people, places, and ideas that enhance their comprehension of different ways of thinking and being in the world. Students synthesize their knowledge, their emerging expertise in framing questions for analysis, and their communication skills to engage global issues in a self-reflective, cross-cultural way.

Students will be able to:

- demonstrate their understanding of how people across cultures and societies experience the world
- make connections between those perspectives and course content
- analyze how cultural and societal differences manifest globally
- reflect on their own identity as global citizens

## **Policy Actions**

- On 8/21/2020, EPC voted to endorse a modified Pass/Fail policy for Fall 2020: All students are allowed to select one Pass//Fail course, not including COLL/major/minor courses. The Pass/Fail deadline is extended to the last day of classes.
- On 9/4/2020, EPC voted to recommend amending the Fall 2020 Pass/Fail policy to disallow students from electing P/F in a course for which they have received a grading sanction from the Honor Council.
- On 10/22/2020, in light of increasing pandemic-related stresses as expressed by students, EPC voted to recommend allowing the P/F option to apply to major, minor and COLL courses for Fall 2020.
- On 10/30/2020, EPC recommended amending the Fall 2020 Pass/Fail policy again to postpone the P/F deadline to 11:59pm on the final day of grading.
- On 1/28/2021, EPC approved a proposal that transfer credit for short courses be based on meeting and study hours, and not to require a minimum of four weeks for the course.
- On 2/19/2021, EPC approved a proposal that students may register for 16 credits total for the summer, not restricted to 8 credits/summer session.
- On 2/19/2021, EPC approved the COLL 300 revisions brought to FAS on 3/2/2021.

## **New Majors, Minors, Programs, Department Names**

- On 10/6/2020, EPC brought to FAS two motions regarding Kinesiology and Health Sciences: 1) elimination of the B.A. in Health Sciences; 2) renaming of the B.S. in Health Sciences to the B.S. in Human Health. Both motions were approved by FAS.
- On 3/5/2021. EPC approved the Minor in Integrative Conservation, which will be listed under Interdisciplinary Studies until a program in Integrative Conservation is established. Brought to FAS for a vote, and approved by FAS, on 4/13/2020.
