Oversight of Study Abroad

• Winter 2021 Study Abroad

- ➢ 3 programs postponed: Rwanda; New Zealand; Argentina
- I program offered virtually with co-curricular cultural activities and guest speakers: Geneva

• Summer 2021 Study Abroad

- ➤ 18 in-person programs cancelled
- Sufficient enrollment to pivot 1 of 18 to virtual program: Cambridge
- 2021 Program Directors of cancelled programs given right of first refusal for 2022
- Winter 2022 Study Abroad
 - New Zealand program cancelled by host and moved to Winter 2023

Oversight of Study Abroad (cont'd)

- COLL 300 Revision: ISAC acquired new role approving COLL 300 designation for study abroad courses
 - Developed assignments and evaluation rubric for students to qualify non-WM Study Abroad courses for COLL 300 designation.
 - Revised Summer Study Abroad Program Director Application Form to reflect revised COLL 300 expectations.

 - Embedded Programs for Spring 2022: Mexico & Bahamas. Additional programs rolled over from 2021: Ecuador & Gibraltar.

Pandemic Emergency Response

- Developed set of 'best practices' for emergency response virtual study abroad based on experiences of faculty who converted study abroad to a virtual COLL 300 in Summer 2020, as well as GEO staff's research on emerging practices
- Advised Global Education Office on strategies to encourage study abroad participation post-COVID.
- Advised Global Education Office on strategies to strengthen international institutional partnerships
- In ongoing discussions and consultations with the Global Education Office and the Vice-Provost for International Affairs on Study Abroad cancellations and planning, Spring semester travel policies, etc.
