# Spring 2019: 6 meetings

New initiative: Recruitment of STEM faculty in Study Abroad activities.

- *Objective:* Increase Study Abroad opportunities for students with STEM interests and needs.
- Solution: Recruit STEM faculty into Study Abroad programs to offer STEM courses.
- Actions: Recruitment talk given at Physics Department faculty meeting. E-mail recruitment campaign targeted to STEM departments (Biology, Computer Science, Mathematics, Chemistry, Physics) and the Sociology Department.
- *Results:* Three STEM faculty Program Directors selected for summer 2020 Study Abroad. Also, three STEM faculty were selected as Study Abroad site reviewers for summer 2019. Finally, a STEM faculty reviewer was also selected to review a new St-Andrews U. (Scotland) STEM-inclined summer Study Abroad pilot program (summer 2019).

## **Primary Work**

- Selection of Program Directors for summer 2020 Study Abroad programs: Goa (India), Cadiz (Spain), Potsdam (Germany), Rio (Brazil), Rome-Pompeii (Italy), Santiago de Compostela (Spain), Prague (Czech Rep.), Adelaide (Australia), Cambridge (England), Galway (Ireland), Beijing (China), Montpellier (France), Cape Town (South Africa). STEM faculty were encouraged to apply (3 STEM faculty selected).
- Selection of faculty site reviewers for Study Abroad, summer 2019: Cape Town, Goa, Santiago de Compostela, Galway. STEM faculty were encouraged to apply (3 STEM faculty selected).
