Course Description

This course will explore basic historical and theoretical underpinnings, and current applications, of the perspectives, values, principles, obligations and dilemmas of health ethics, including public health ethics, medical ethics and biomedical ethics. Emphasis is placed on discussions and practical use of frameworks for problem-solving of public health ethics and medical ethics challenges, with past and present examples. This course is designed for Kinesiology & Health Sciences majors. Enrollment is limited, and instructor approval for enrollment is required.

Course Objectives

Goal 1. The purpose of the Health Ethics course is to provide students with knowledge and understanding of the unique characteristics of health ethics.

By the end of the course, the students will understand these concepts:

- Accurately describe the underlying philosophies and ethical perspectives on which Heath Ethics are based.
- Correctly differential between medical ethics and public health ethics.
- Accurately explain how servicing populations influences the ethical framework for public health approaches as compared to the interpersonal dynamics of clinical practice.
- Correctly differentiate between an aspirational code and a code of conduct and describe how an aspirational code can guide an ethics discussion.
- Effectively describe the four elements of ethical analysis of public health actions enumerated in the 2019 Public Health Code of Ethics.
