The Director of the National Institute of American History and Democracy (or a designee) must approve the choice of at-large courses and the internship.

To receive a Certificate of Participation in the program, students must submit a list of courses taken along with a W&M Transcript or a Degree Audit Report showing that all necessary courses have been completed or are in progress.
