Coordinator: **John (Jack) Lott** is a member of the Chesapeake Bay Writers and its Williamsburg Critique Group. He teaches courses for the Christopher Wren Association. He completed one of Dorothy Anderson's writing classes, from which this idea for a writer's interest and support group within the Christopher Wren Association was developed.

Description: This is a structured opportunity for writers within the Christopher Wren Association to meet and share their work with other writers. The first two sessions will introduce the group to each other. The coordinator will schedule the remainder of the semester to allow two writers to read their work, up to a 1500-word selection, at each session. Each reading will be followed by a 15-minute opportunity for the other writers to respond to the selection. The goal is to give each writer's work exposure, give them feedback on their effort, and encourage the development of a community of interest in writing. Be prepared to give a five minute (500 word) introduction at one of the first two sessions and to read for 15 minutes (up to 1,500 words) when scheduled.

D08. FILM BEYOND HOLLYWOOD - SPECIAL EDITION: THE JEWEL IN THE CROWN

Coordinator: Richard Pflederer lectures on a number of subjects at Christopher Wren Association, The College of William & Mary, Old Dominion University and Virginia State University. He has lived overseas for many years and brings his own experience to the analysis of the six foreign films to be shown.

Description: Unlike previous editions of this activity, this semester we will screen a single program in seven parts. The Jewel in the Crown is the BBC adaptation of a series of novels by Paul Scott known collectively as the 'Raj Quartet'. It follows several fictional characters through the turbulent years of World War II, partition and independence on the Indian sub-continent. The historical setting is quite accurate and the memorable characters represent the various ethnic, political and religious segments of Indian society in the period. This activity is different from past editions, which were essentially one-off sessions. Because of the continuity of the story, each session depends on the previous one. To get the most out of the experience, it is important to attend all seven sessions. The format of each session will follow past years: a brief introduction including a review of the previous session, then the screening of the day's program followed by a break and then a group discussion. Note: Reading some or all of the Paul Scott books would add to the appreciation of this program.

She is also an orthopaedic nurse and now teaches yoga and meditation in Williamsburg.

Description: Yoga is an outstanding segment of an ancient educational and remedial legacy, which is seen to be valid, relevant and supportive in a new millennium with ever-growing health and well being concerns. Athletes use it to tone muscles and increase flexibility. Corporate executives rely on it to de-stress. Doctors prescribe it for everything from sore backs, respiratory problems to chronic fatigue. These classes will focus on gentle yoga postures, the importance of progressive breathing as well as introduction to the healing benefits of sound meditation. Bring a mat or blanket to use on the floor and wear comfortable clothing.
