





Total enrollment: percent full-time and part-time (Fall 2013)



Undergraduate enrollment by race/ethnicity (Fall 2013)




Undergraduate enrollment: percent women (Fall 2013)


Undergraduate admittance and yield (Fall 2013)






Undergraduate graduation rate by gender

(August 31, 2013)




Bachelors as percentage of total degrees

(Awarded between July 1, 2012 and June 30, 2013)





Percentage of total degrees by level
















Total expenses per FTE student








(FY 2013)







Undergraduate alumni giving participation rate (FY 2013)





Graduate alumni giving participation rate (FY 2013)





Average alumni donor gift (FY 2013)





Average undergraduate alumni donor gift (FY 2013)







Average graduate alumni donor gift (FY 2013)








Average alumni giving to endowment per alumni donor (FY 2013)




Total corporate giving




Total private support per student



Total price for students living on campus (2013/2014)





Percent of undergraduates receiving financial aid (2012/2013)




