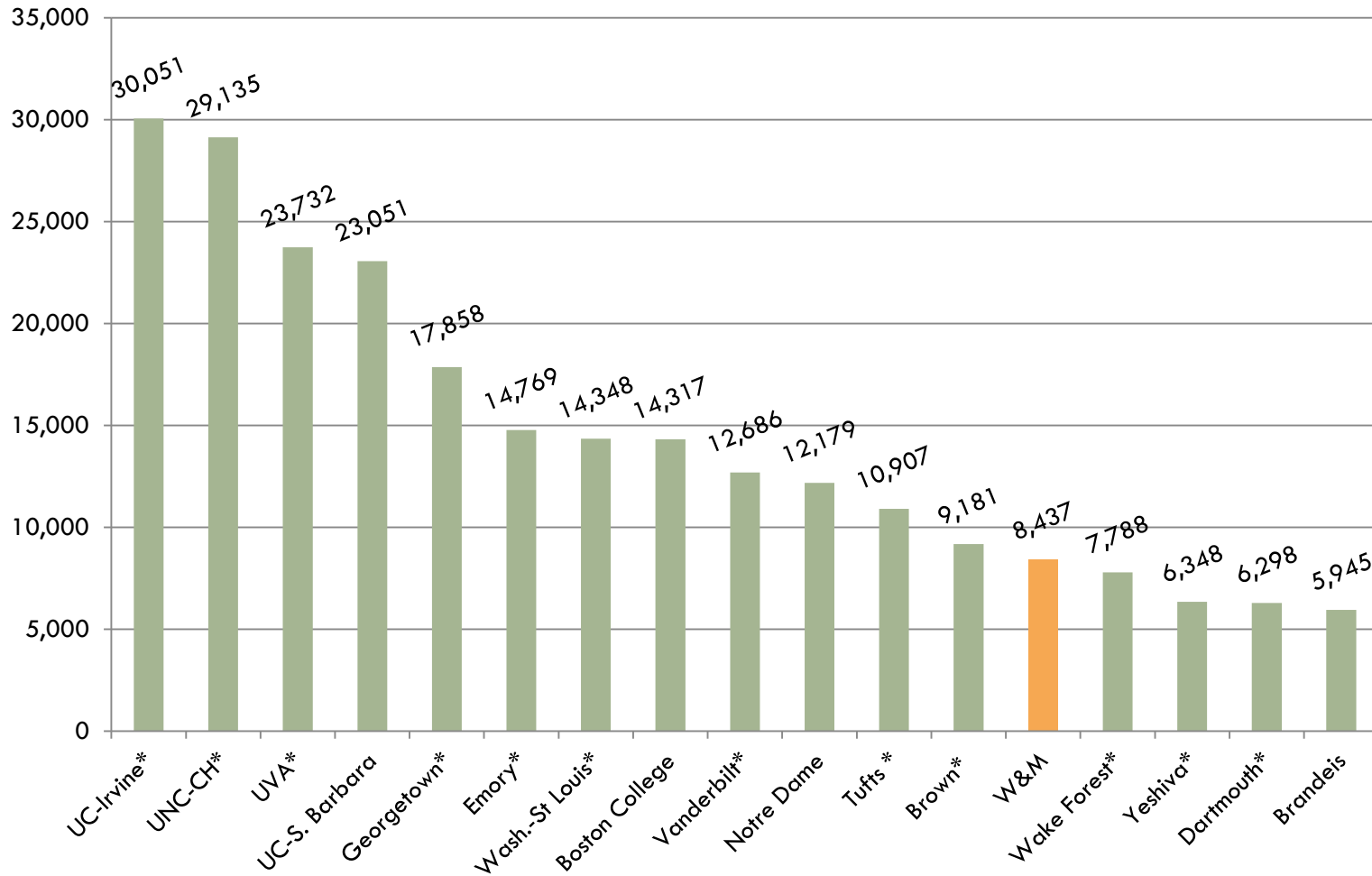


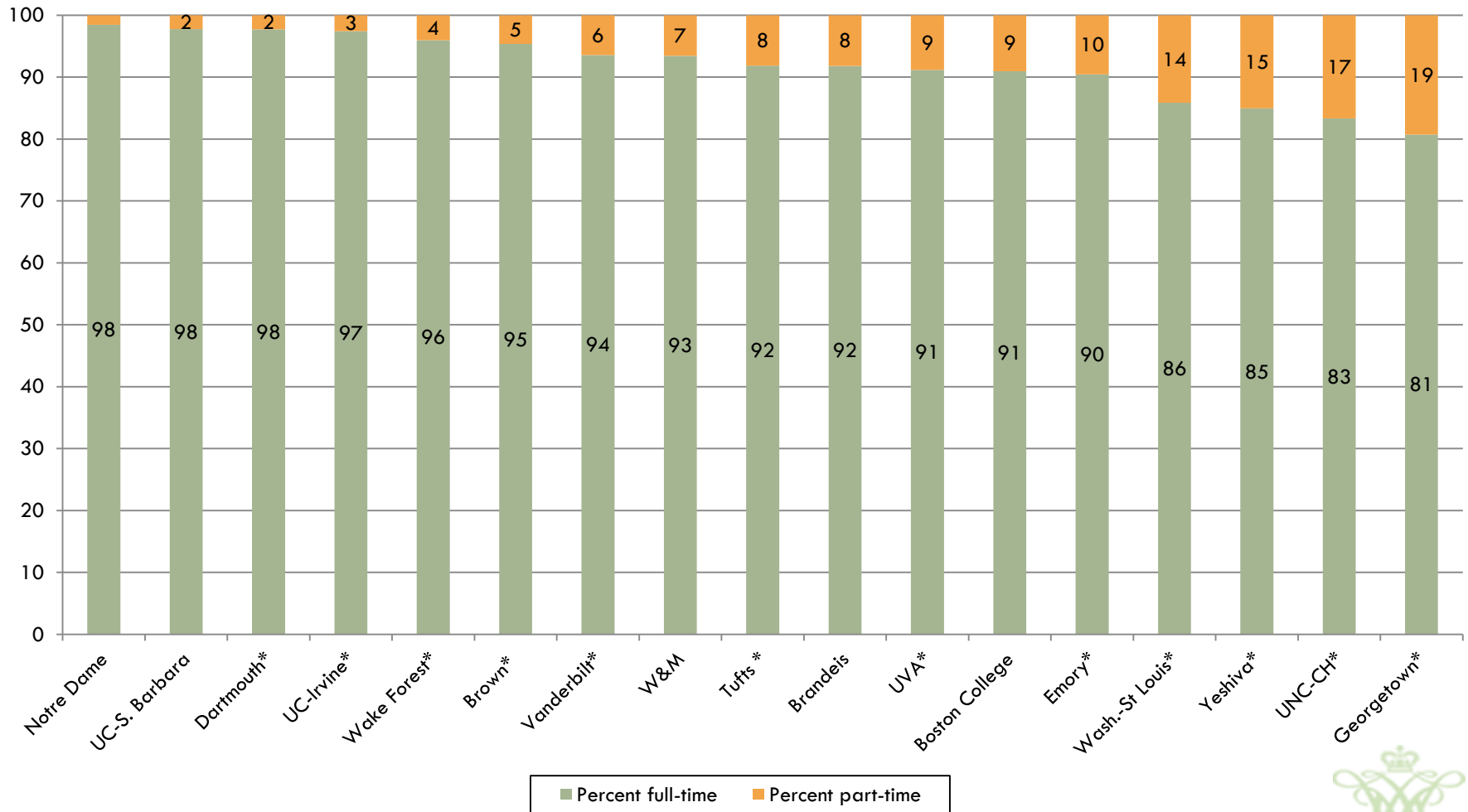

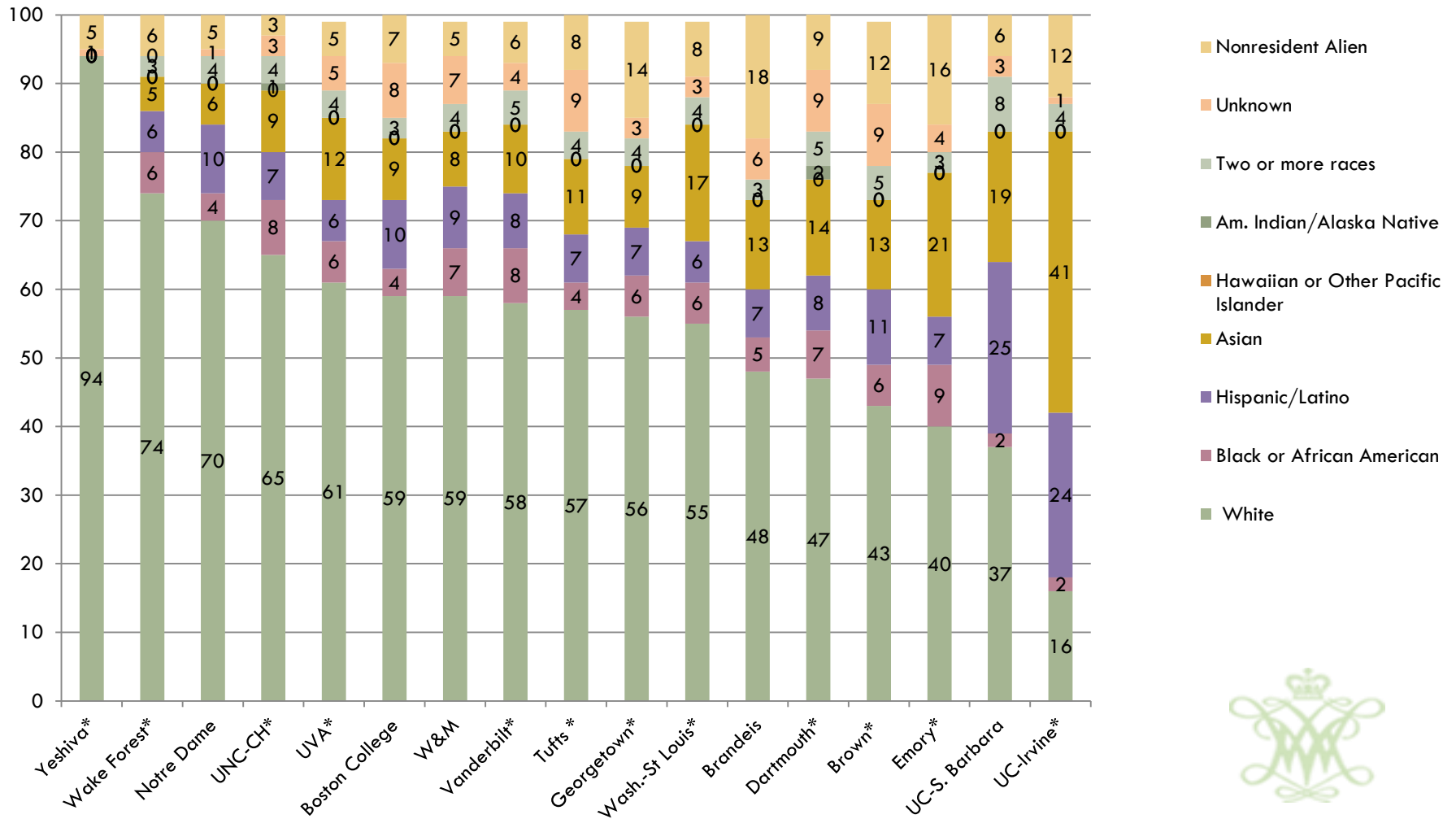
Total enrollment (Fall 2014)



Total enrollment: percent full-time and part-time (Fall 2014)



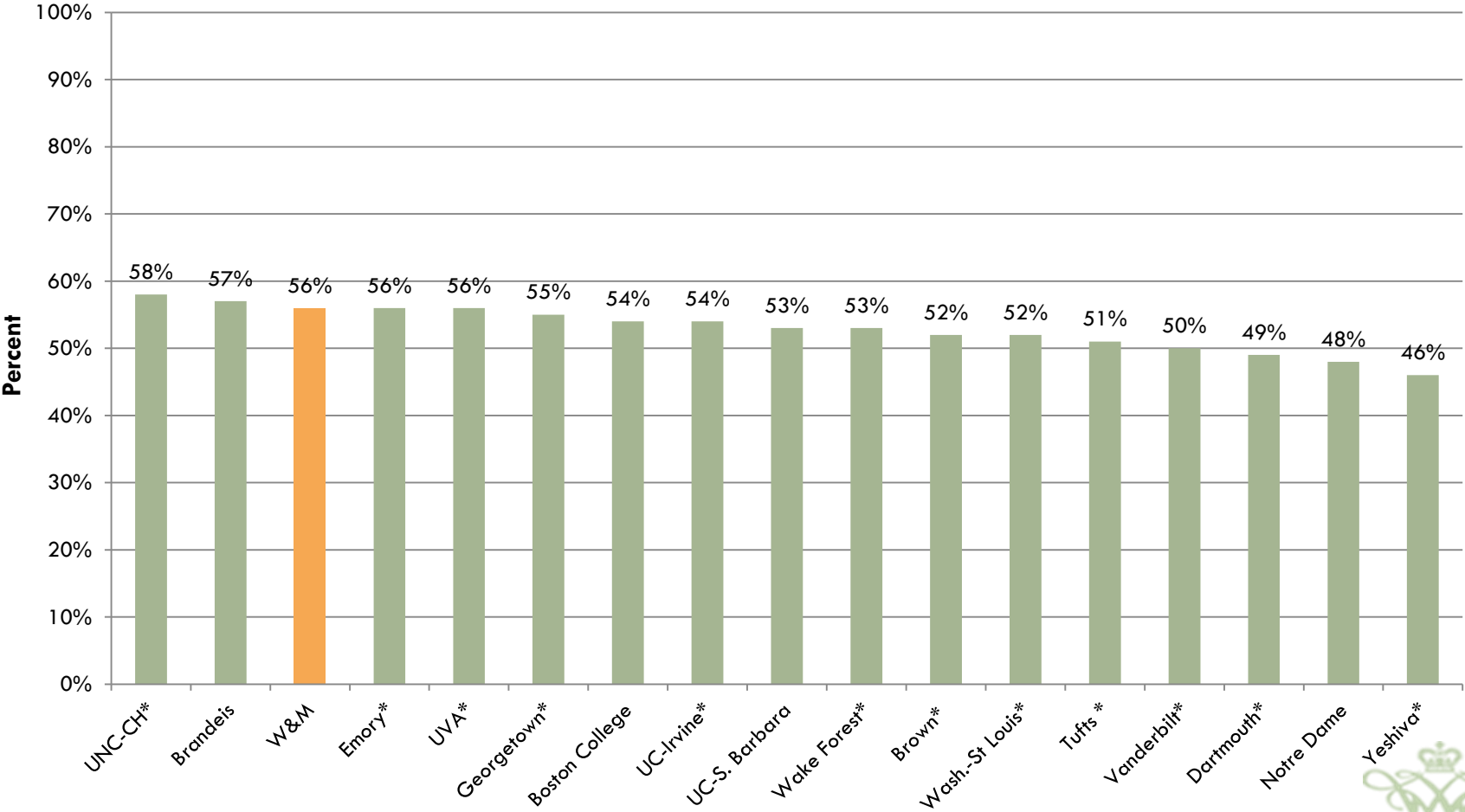
Undergraduate enrollment by race/ethnicity (Fall 2014)

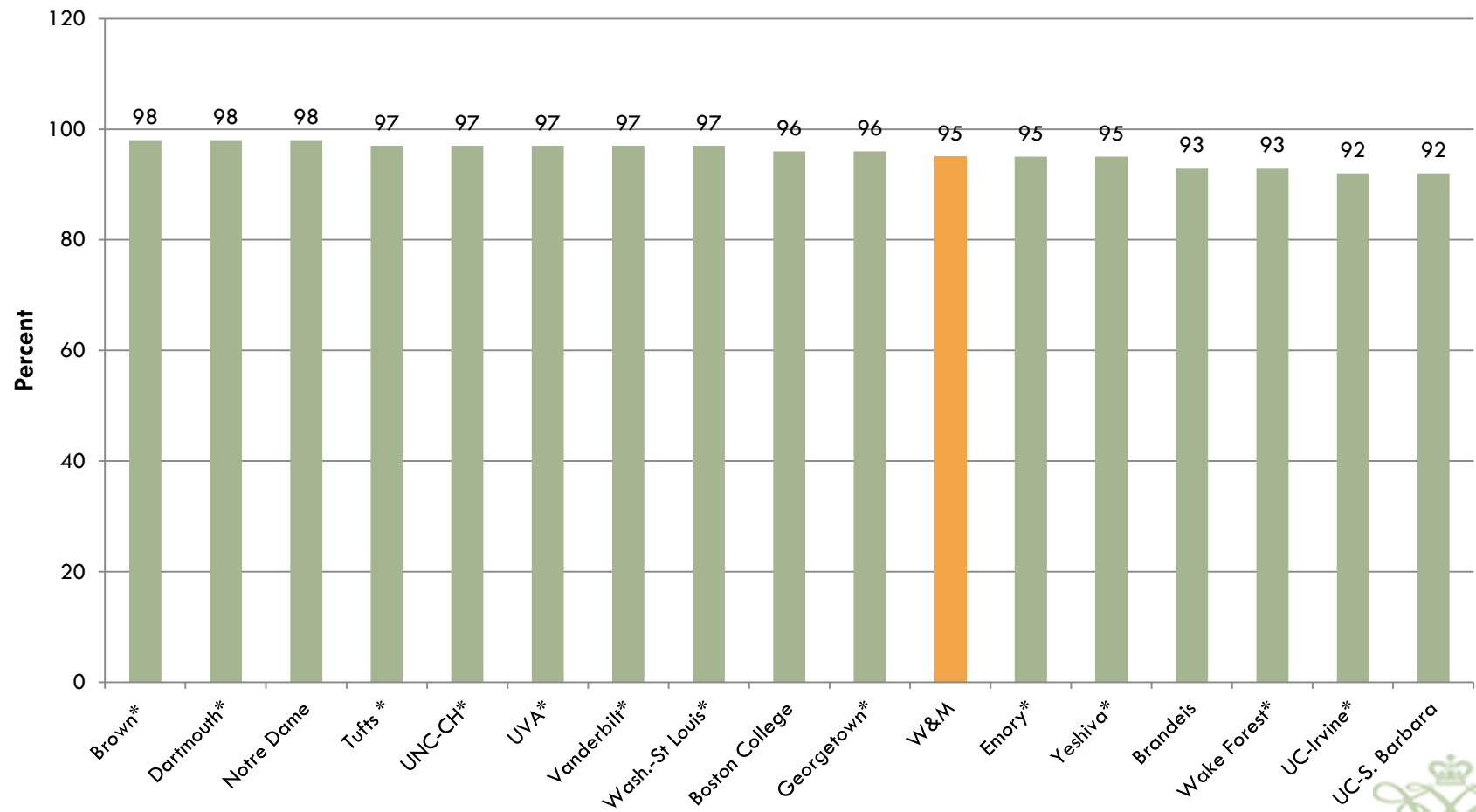
Undergraduate enrollment: percent women (Fall 2014)

First time full time degree-seeking undergraduate retention rate (Fall 2014)



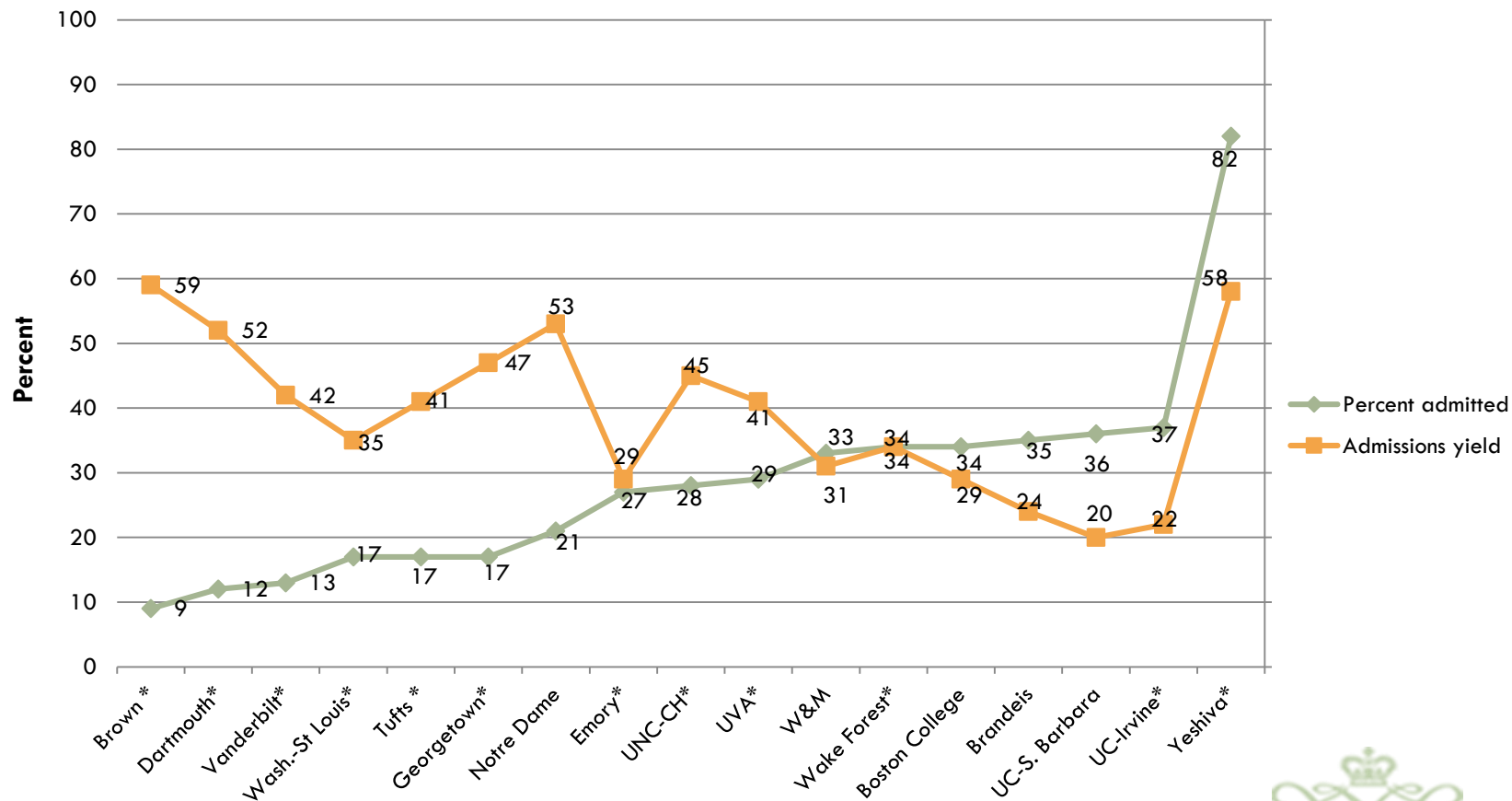

Undergraduate admittance and yield (Fall 2014)

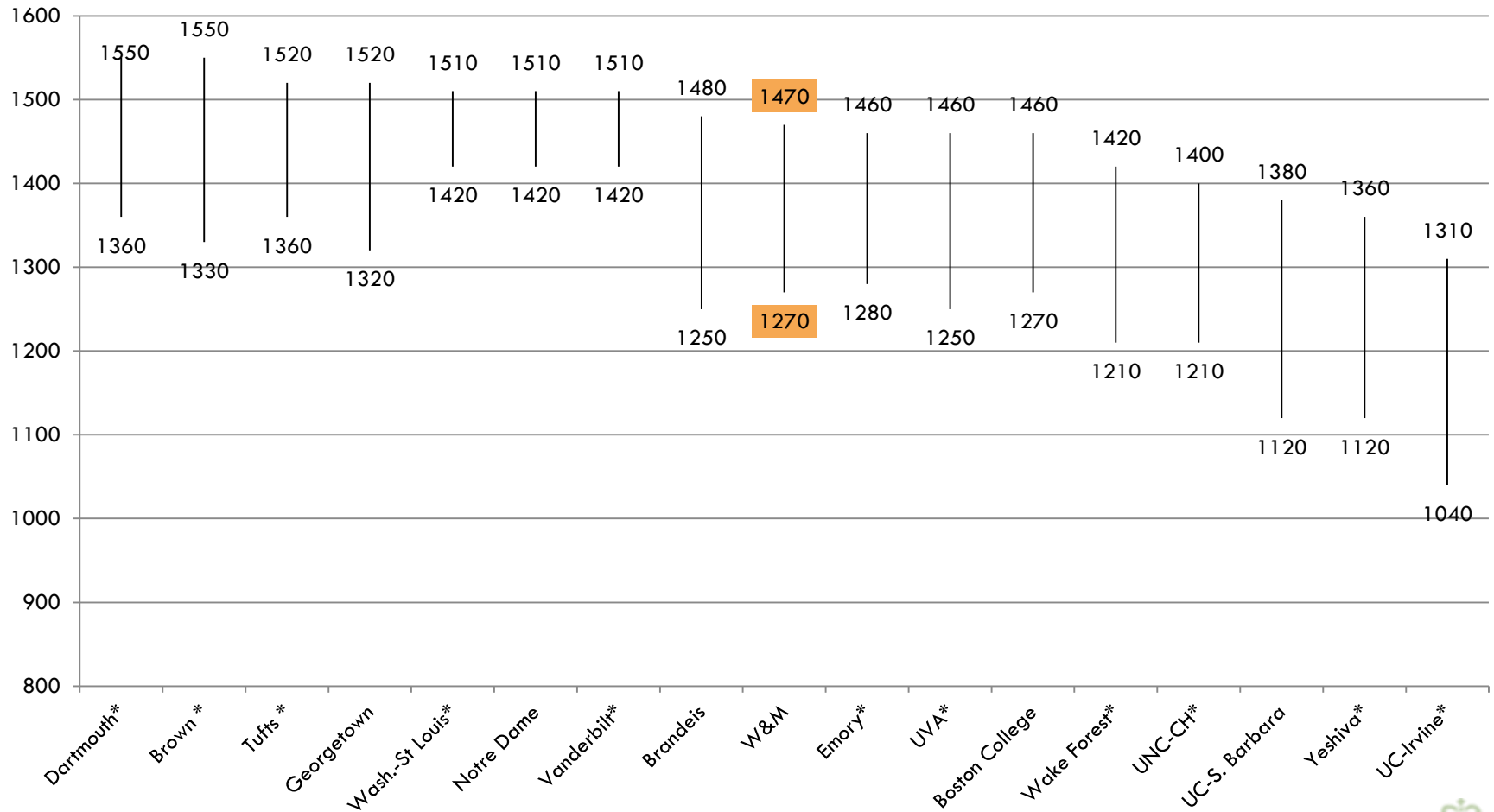

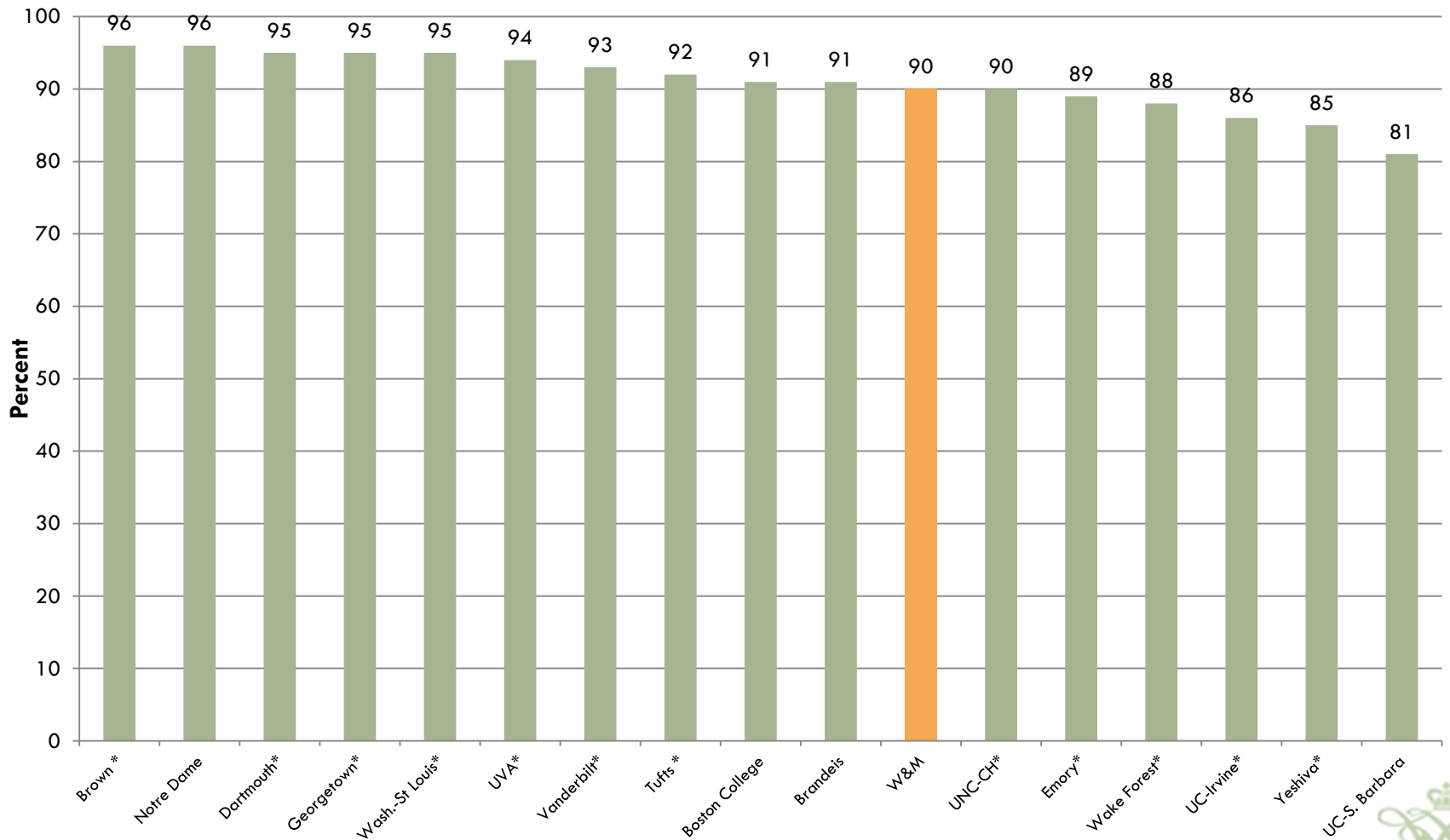

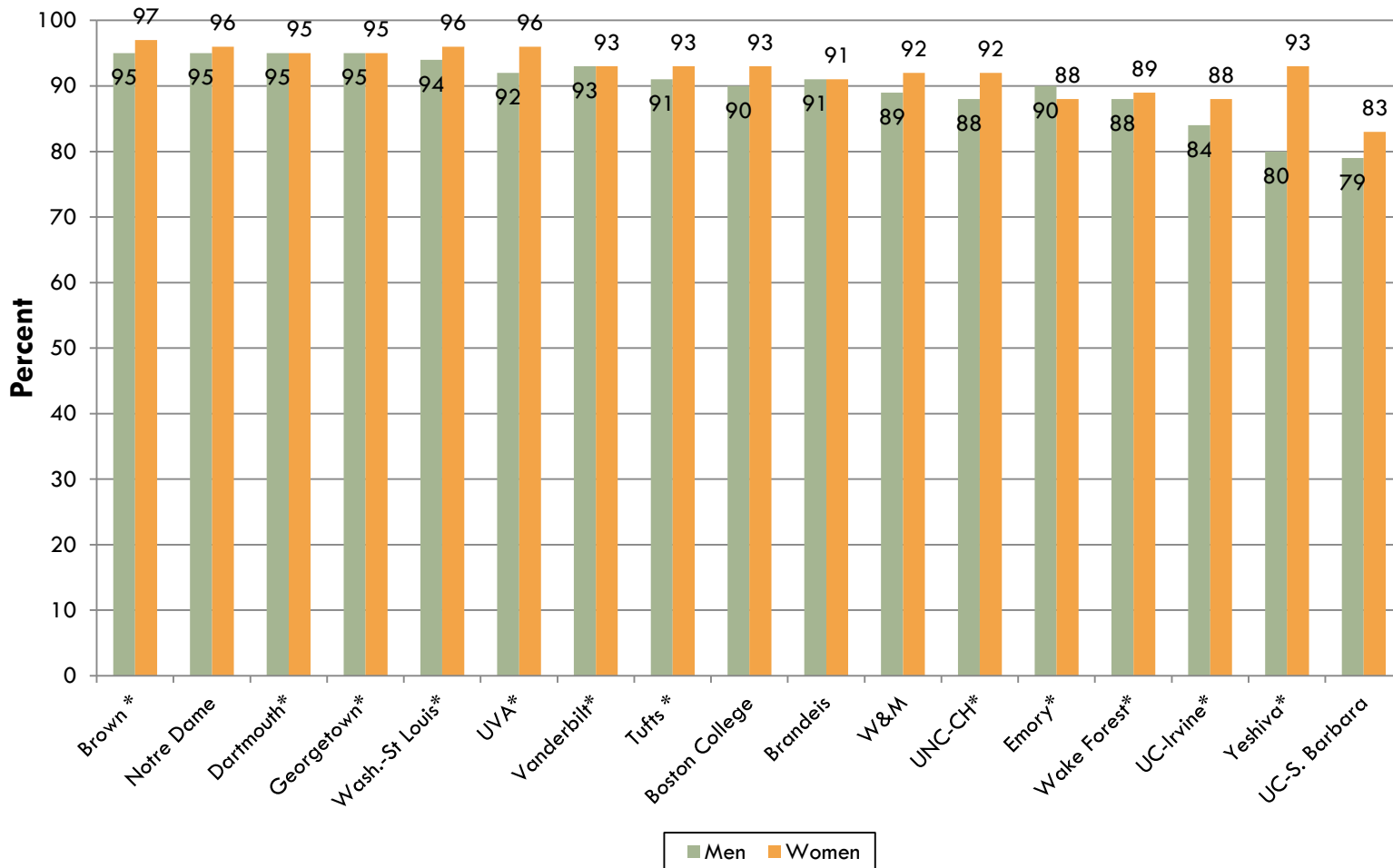
Undergraduate graduation rate

(Fall 2008 cohort, as of August 31, 2014)



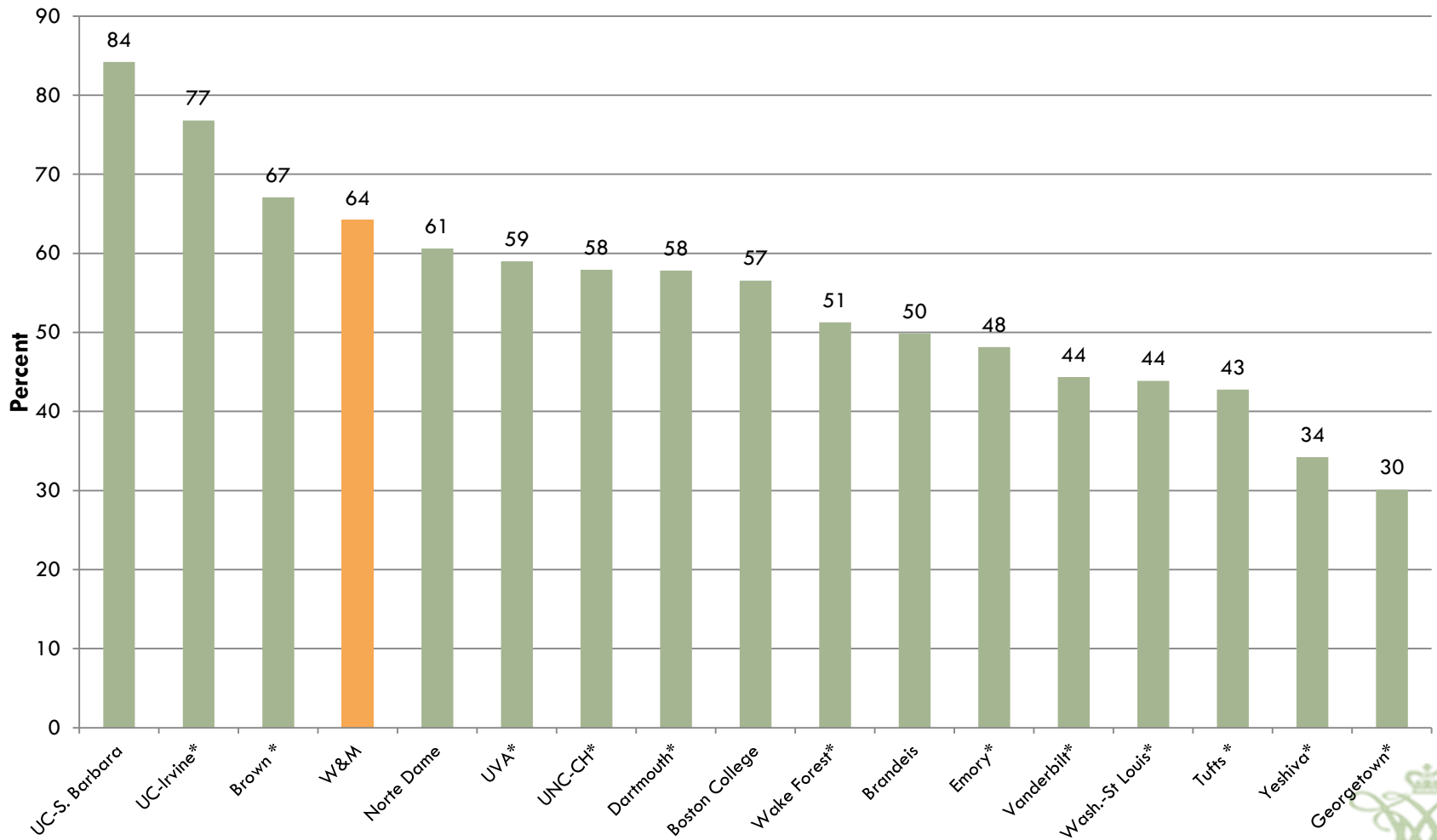
Undergraduate graduation rate by gender

(Awarded between July 1, 2013 and June 30, 2014)



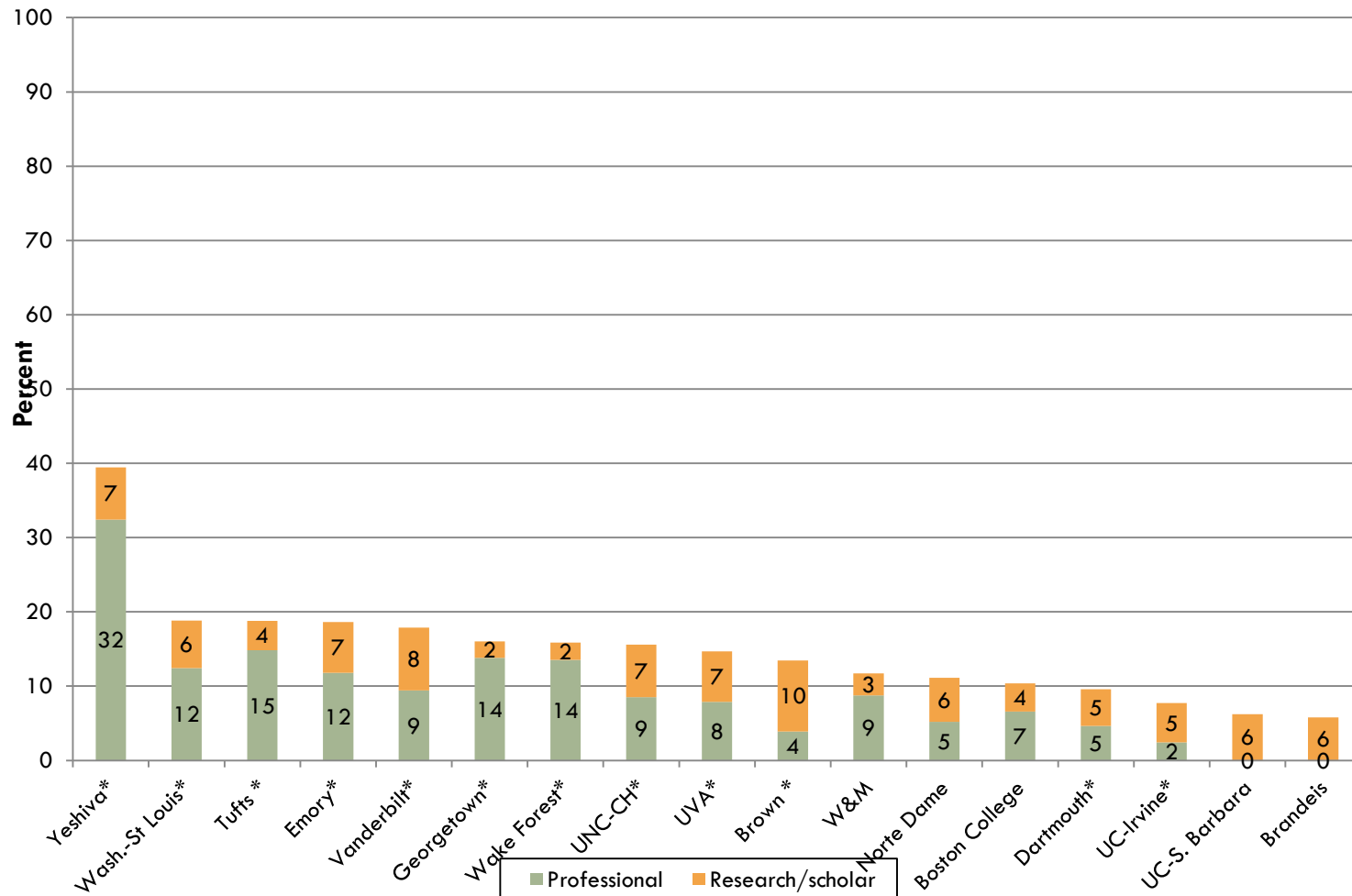

(Awarded between July 1, 2013 and June 30, 2014)



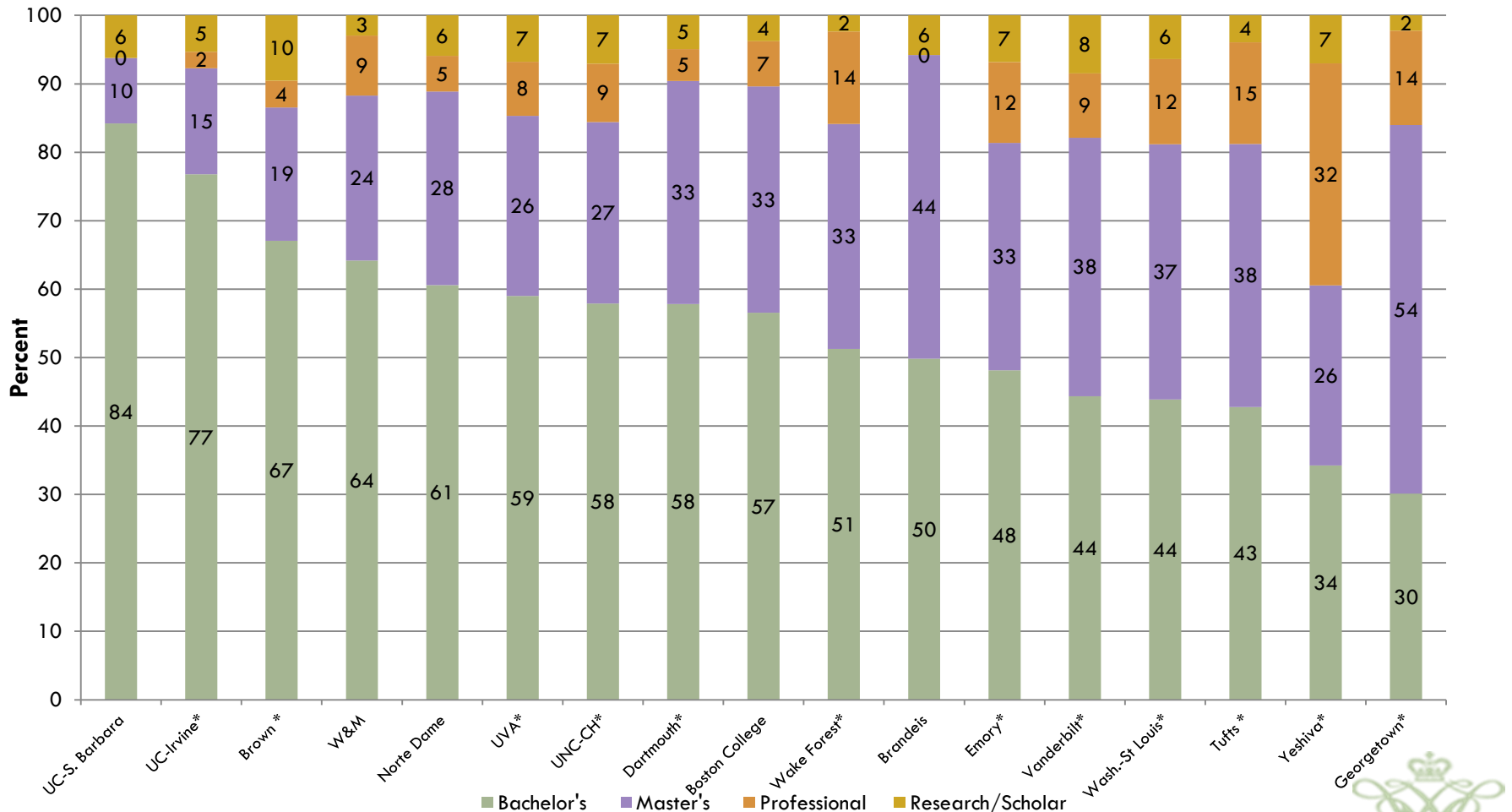

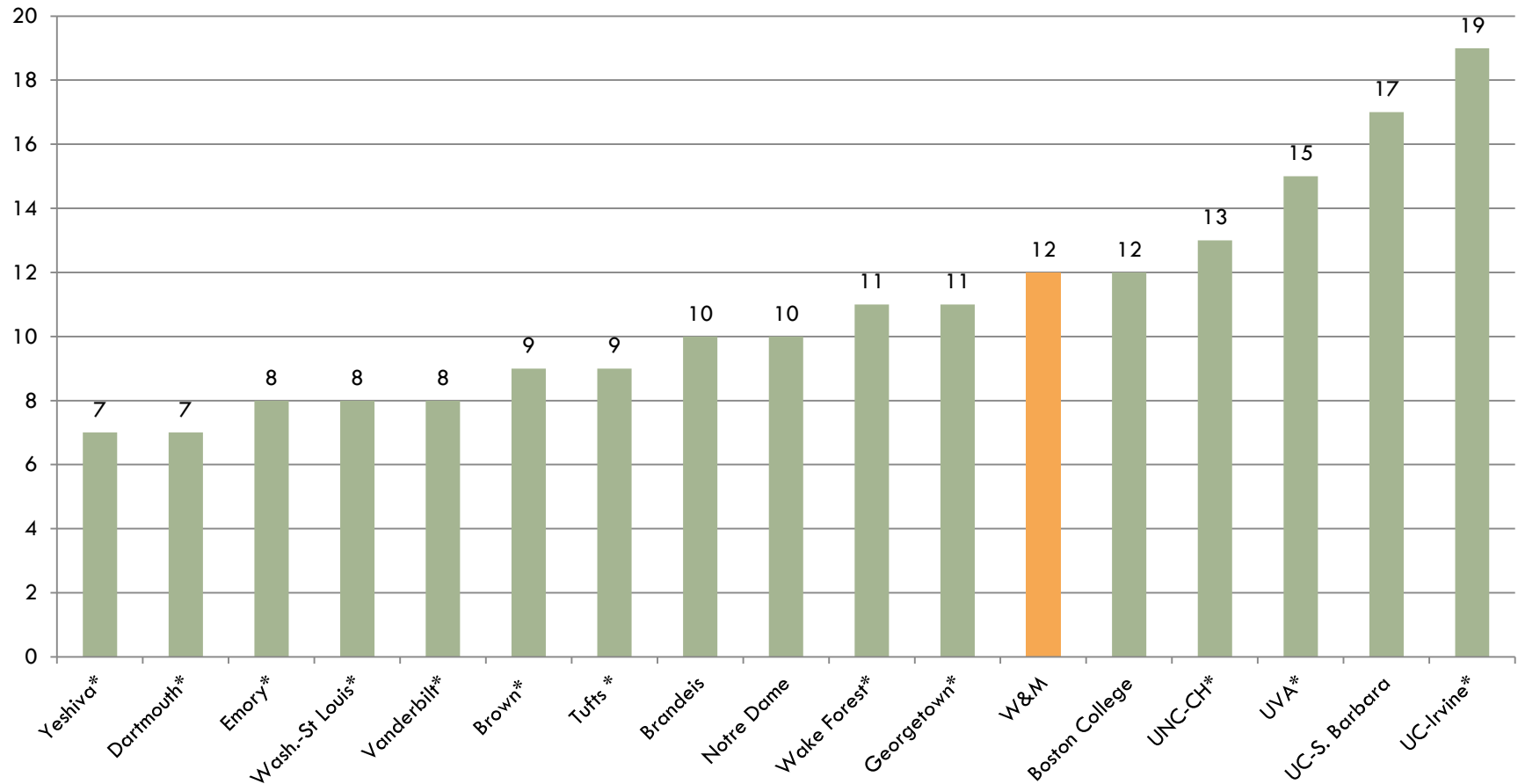

Student to faculty ratio (Fall 2014)



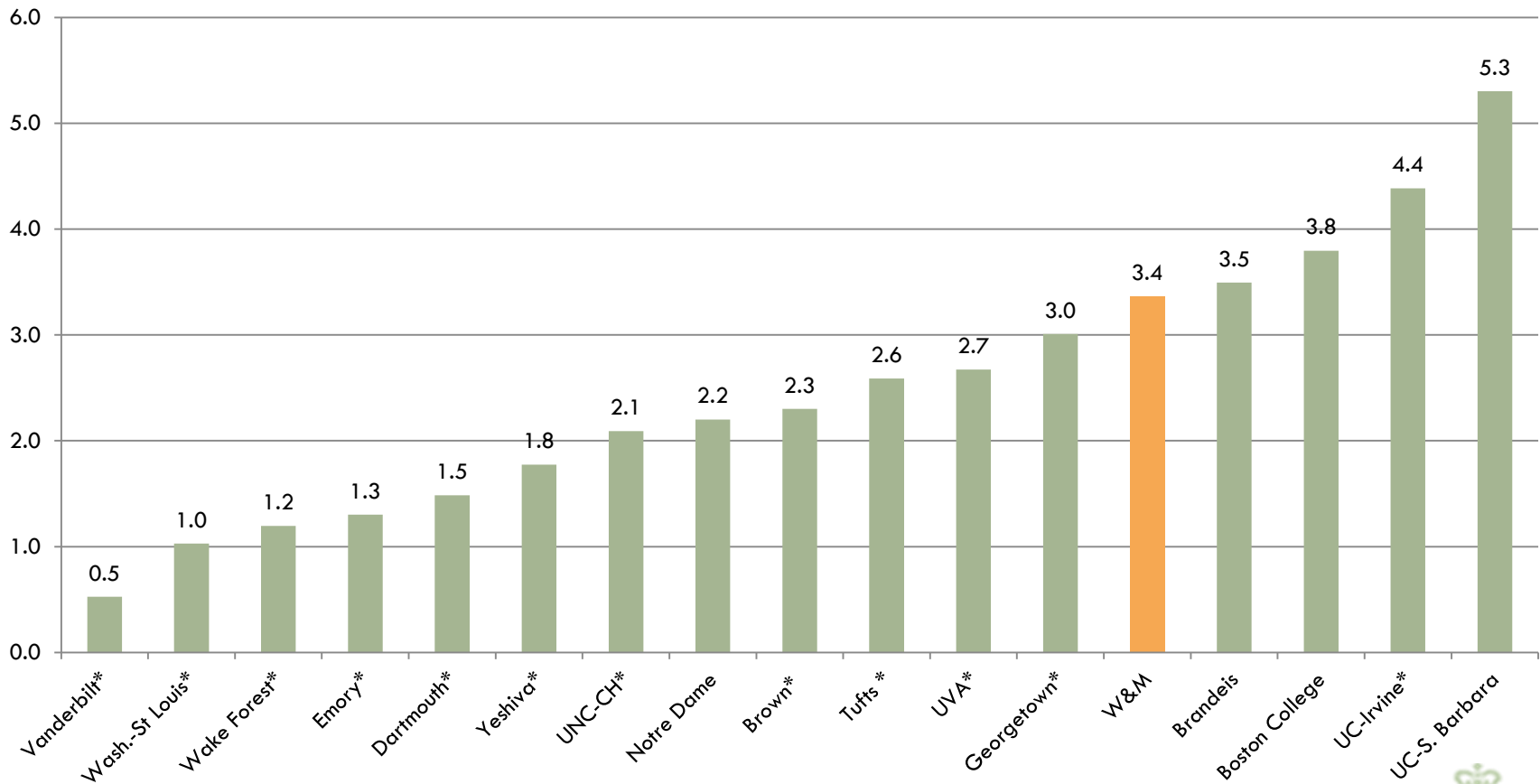

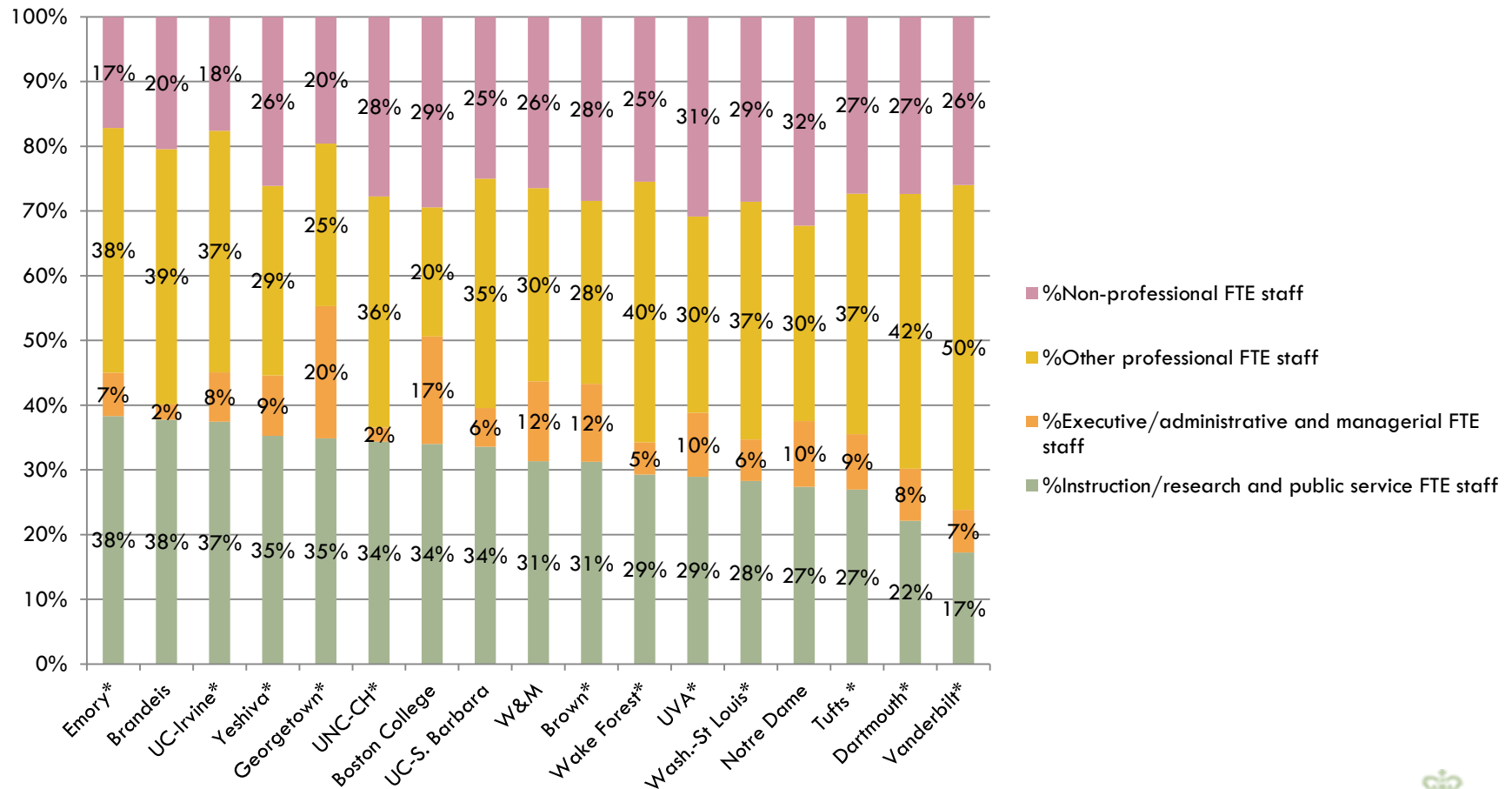

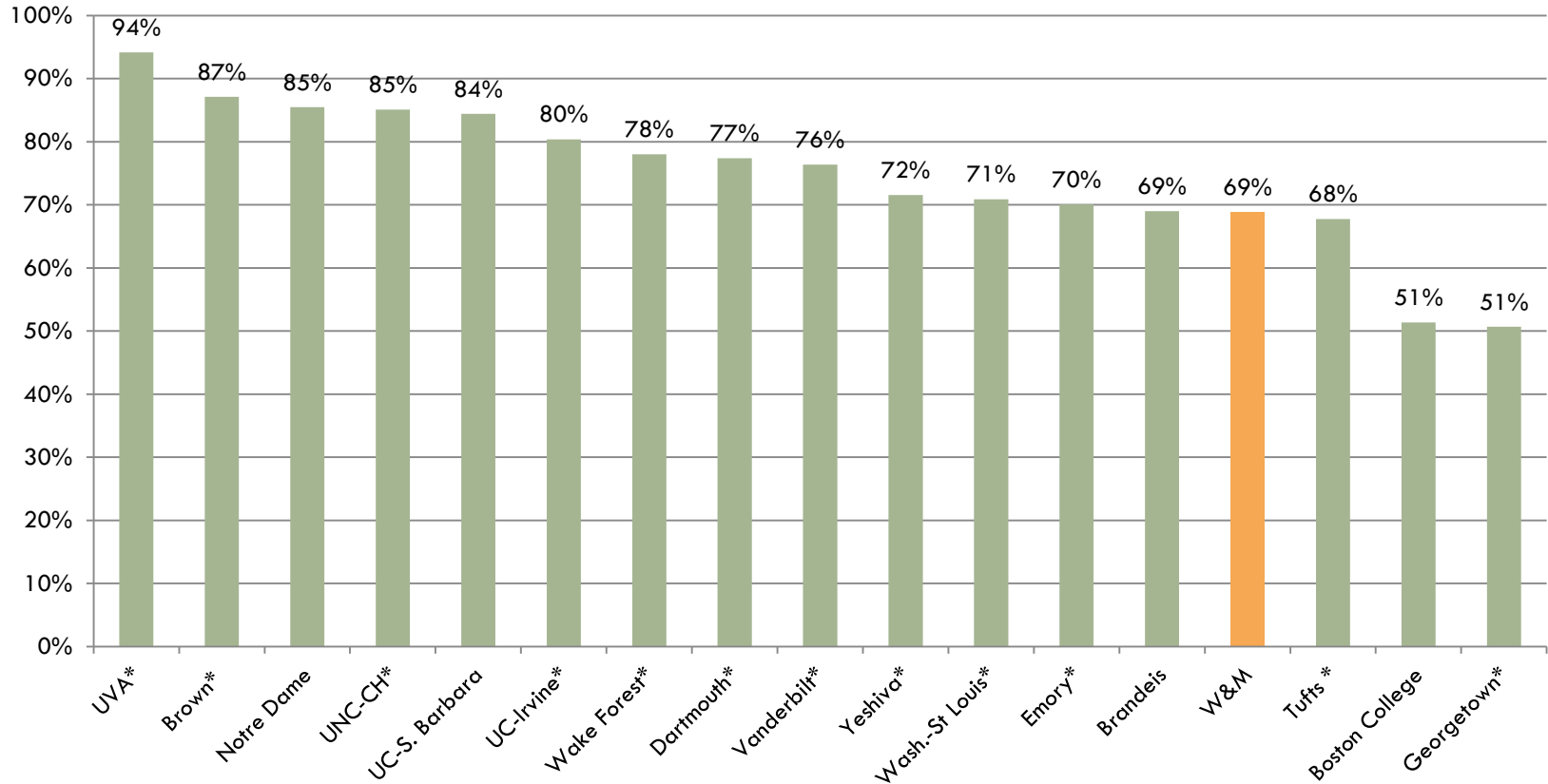

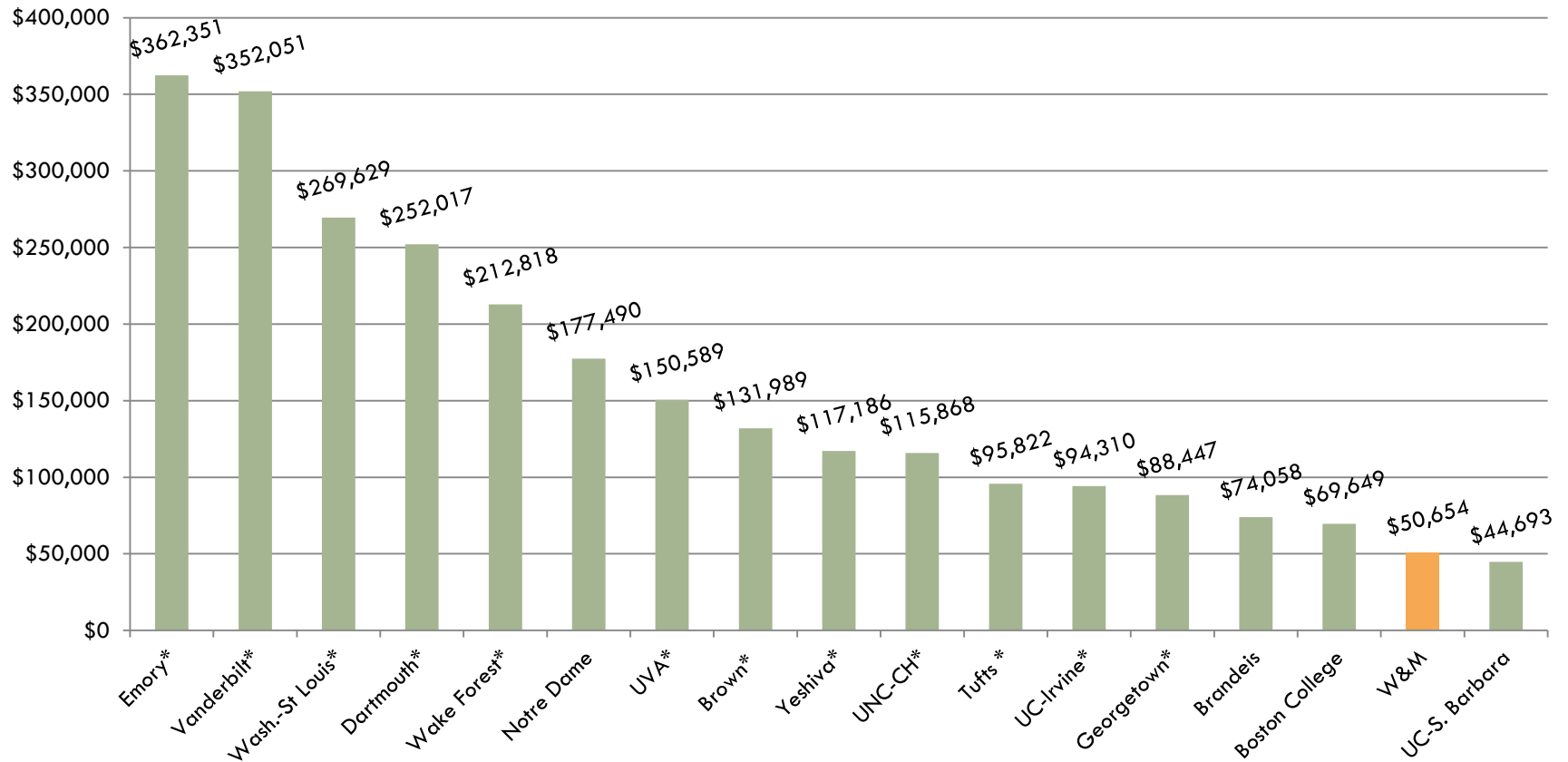

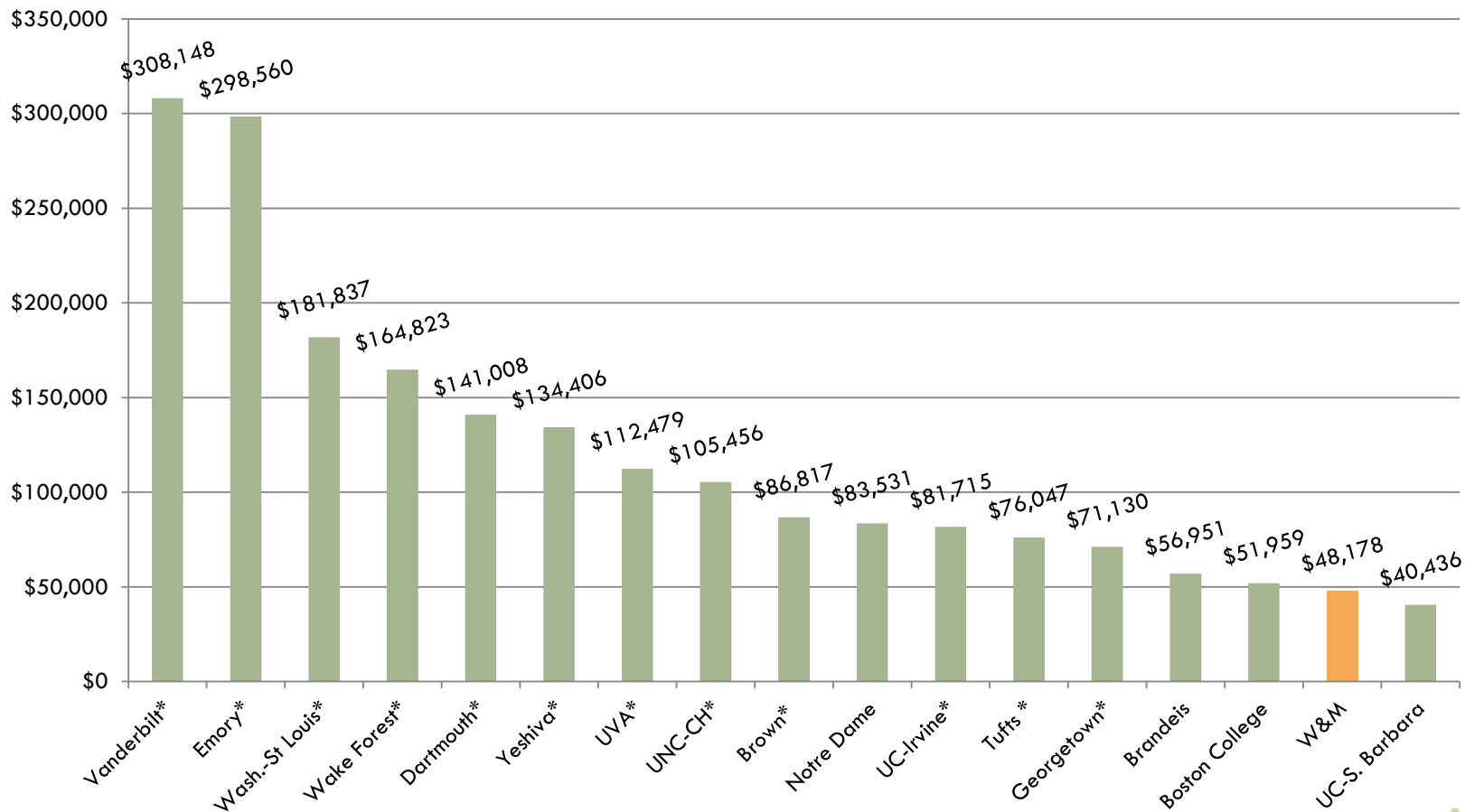
Total revenues per FTE student (FY2014)

Total expenses per FTE student (FY2014)

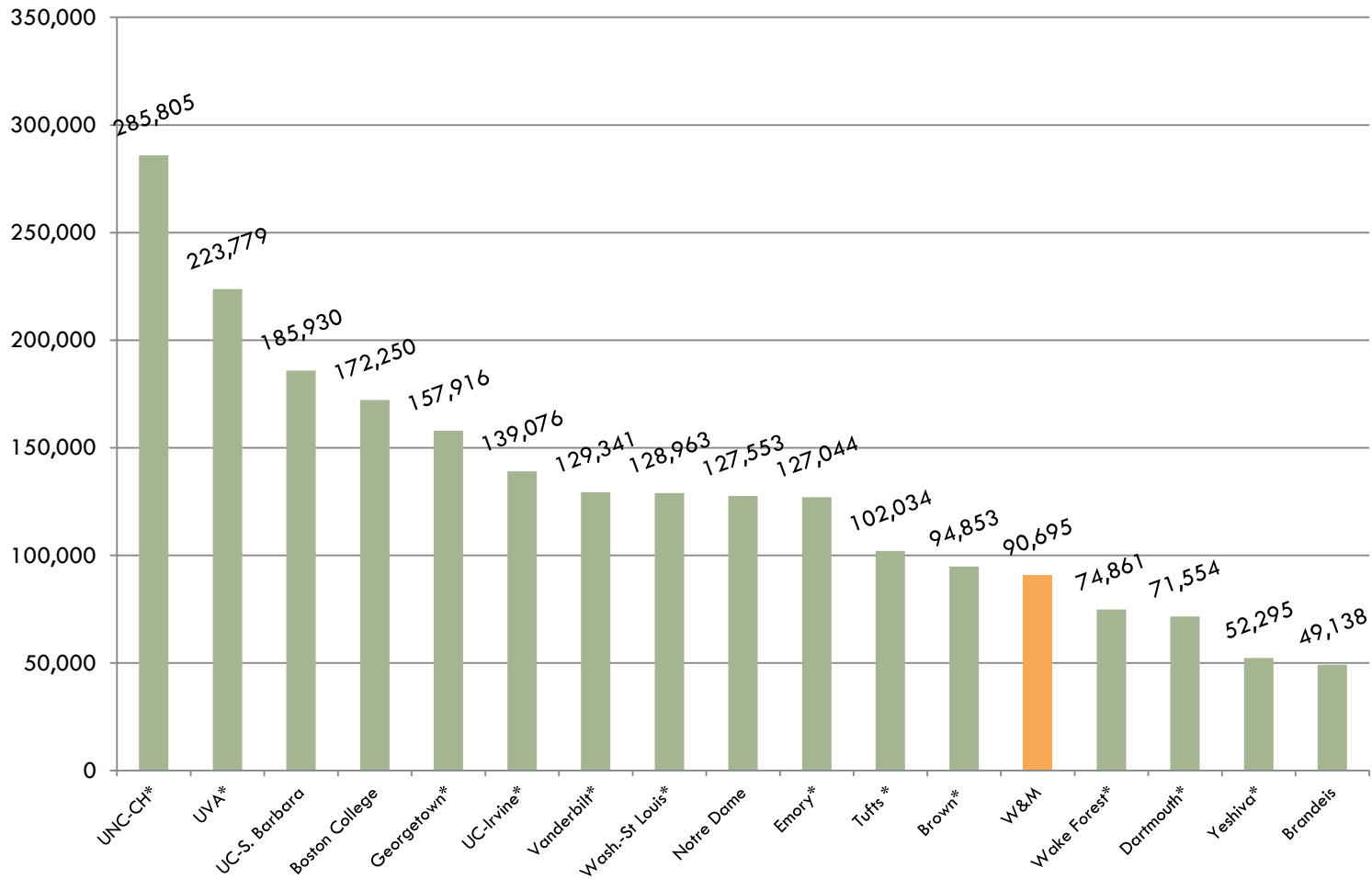

Number of alumni of record (FY 2014)

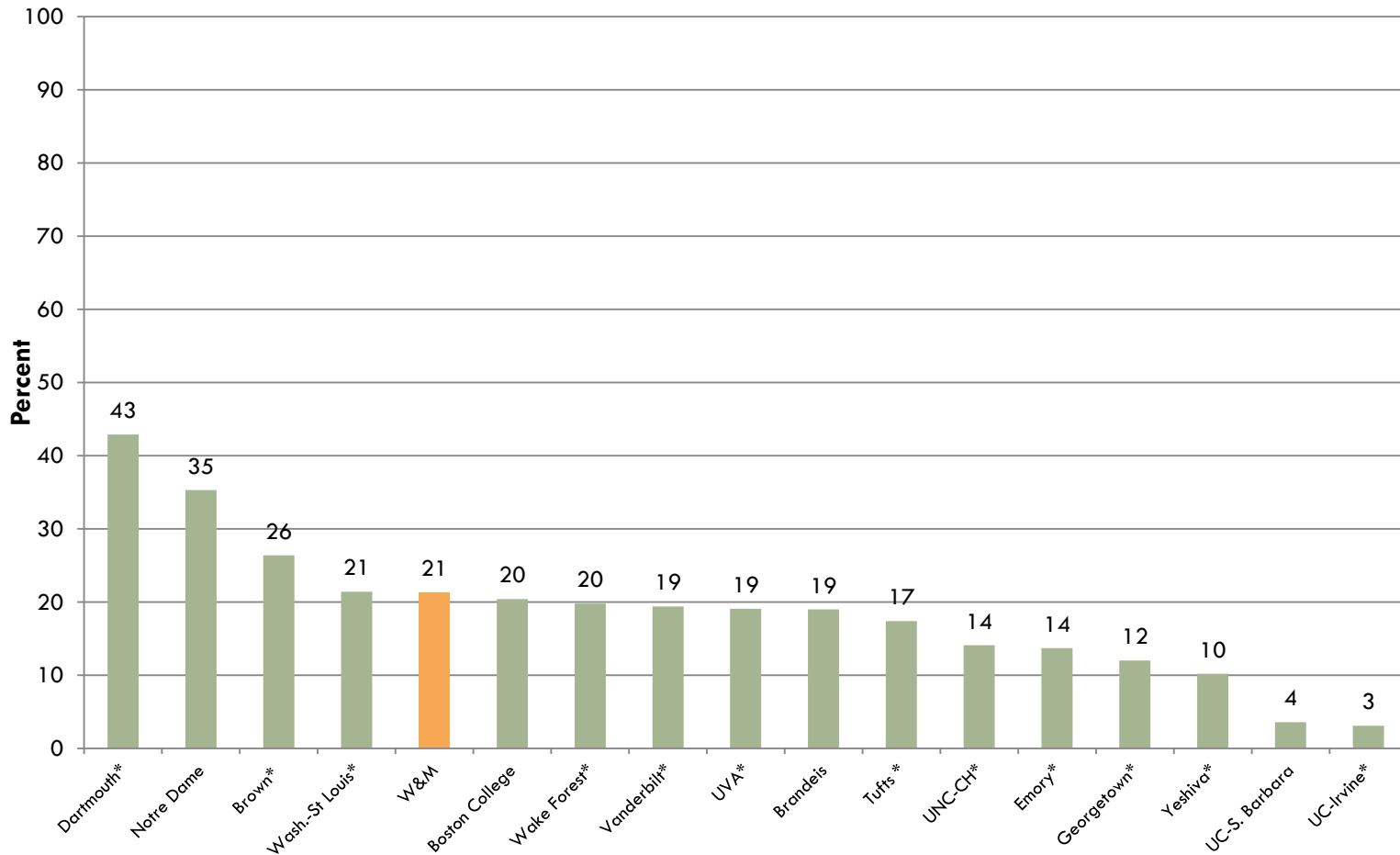

Alumni giving participation rate (FY 2014)

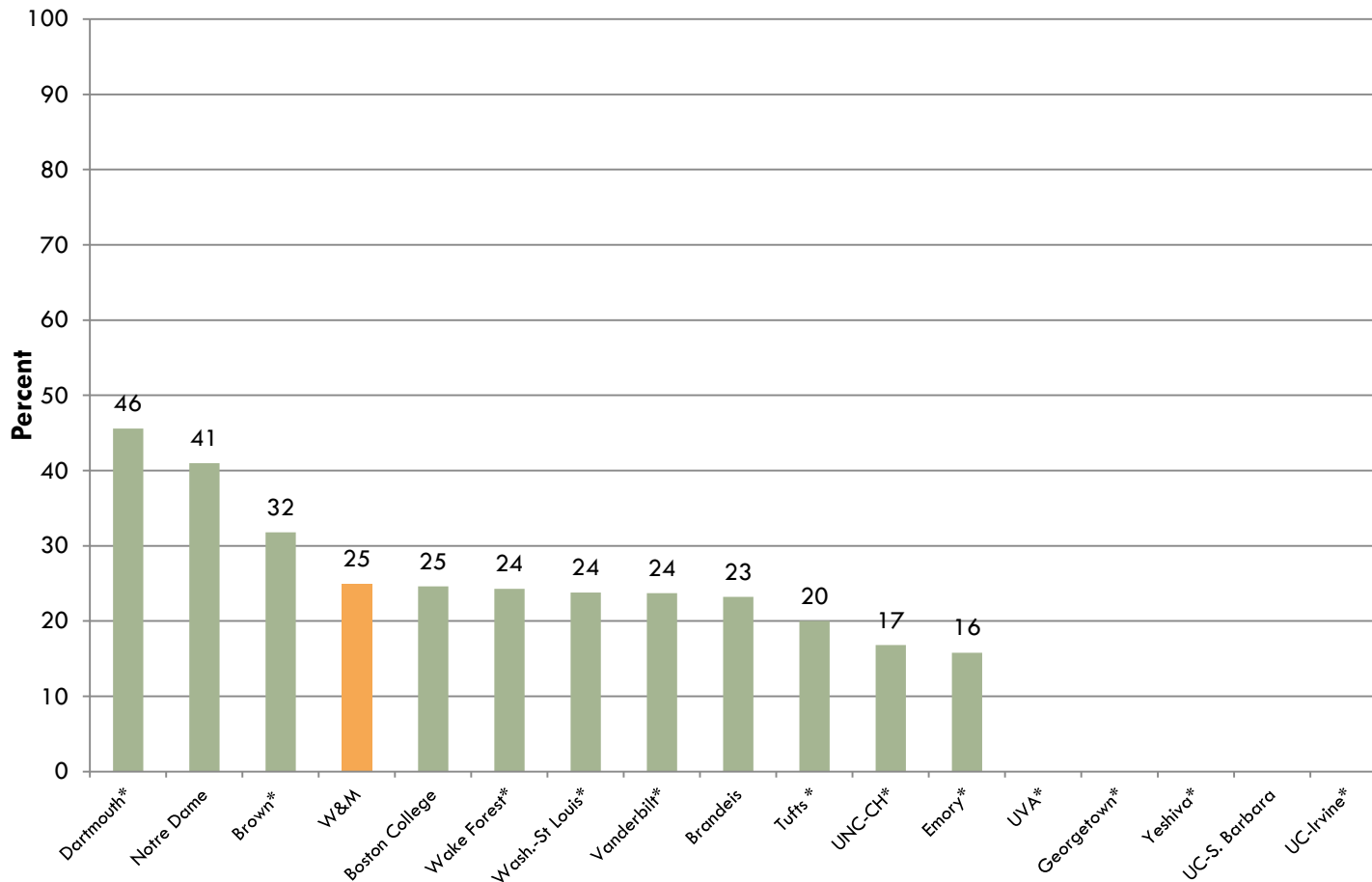

Undergraduate alumni giving participation rate (FY 2014)



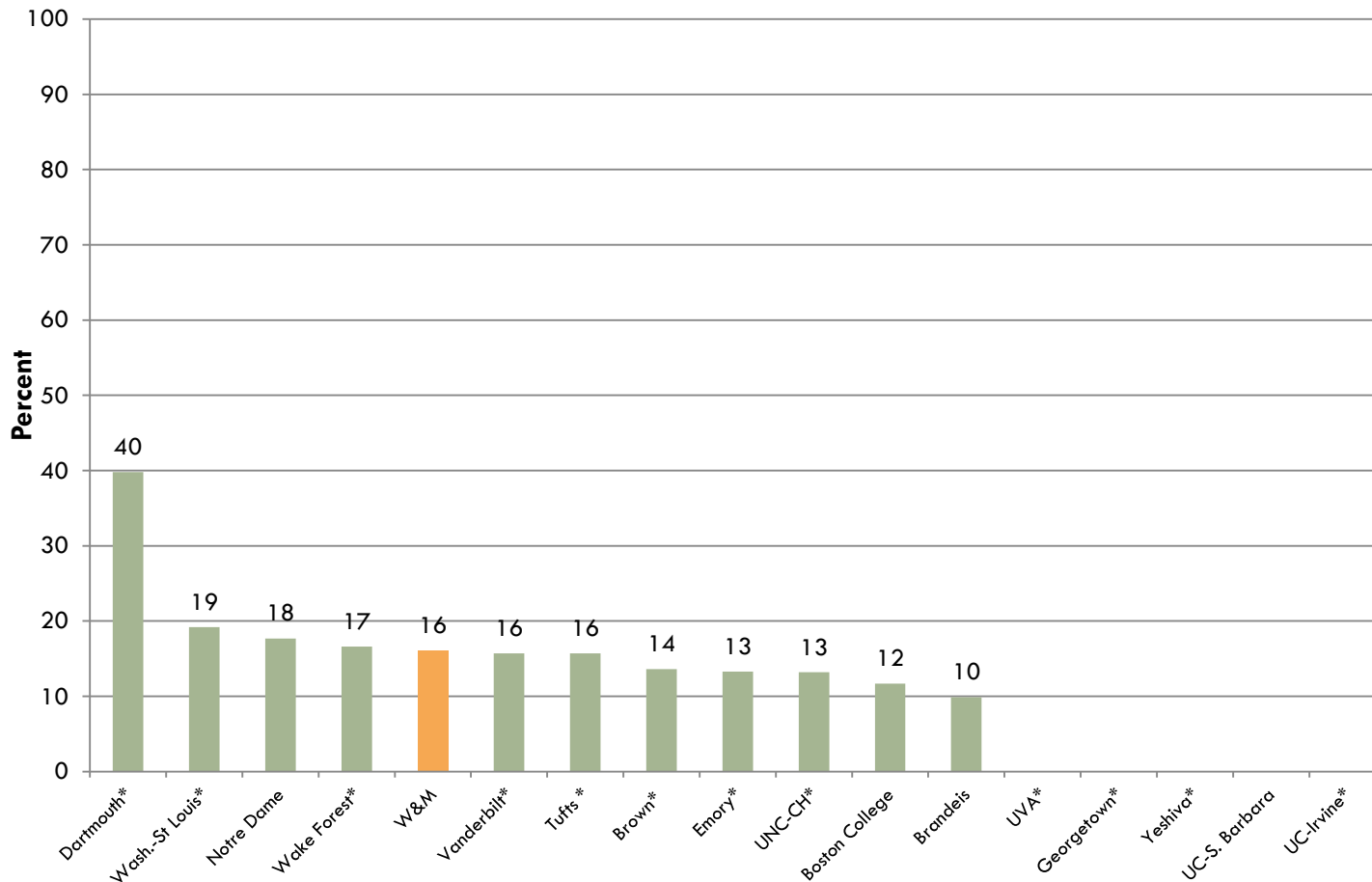

Graduate alumni giving participation rate (FY 2014)



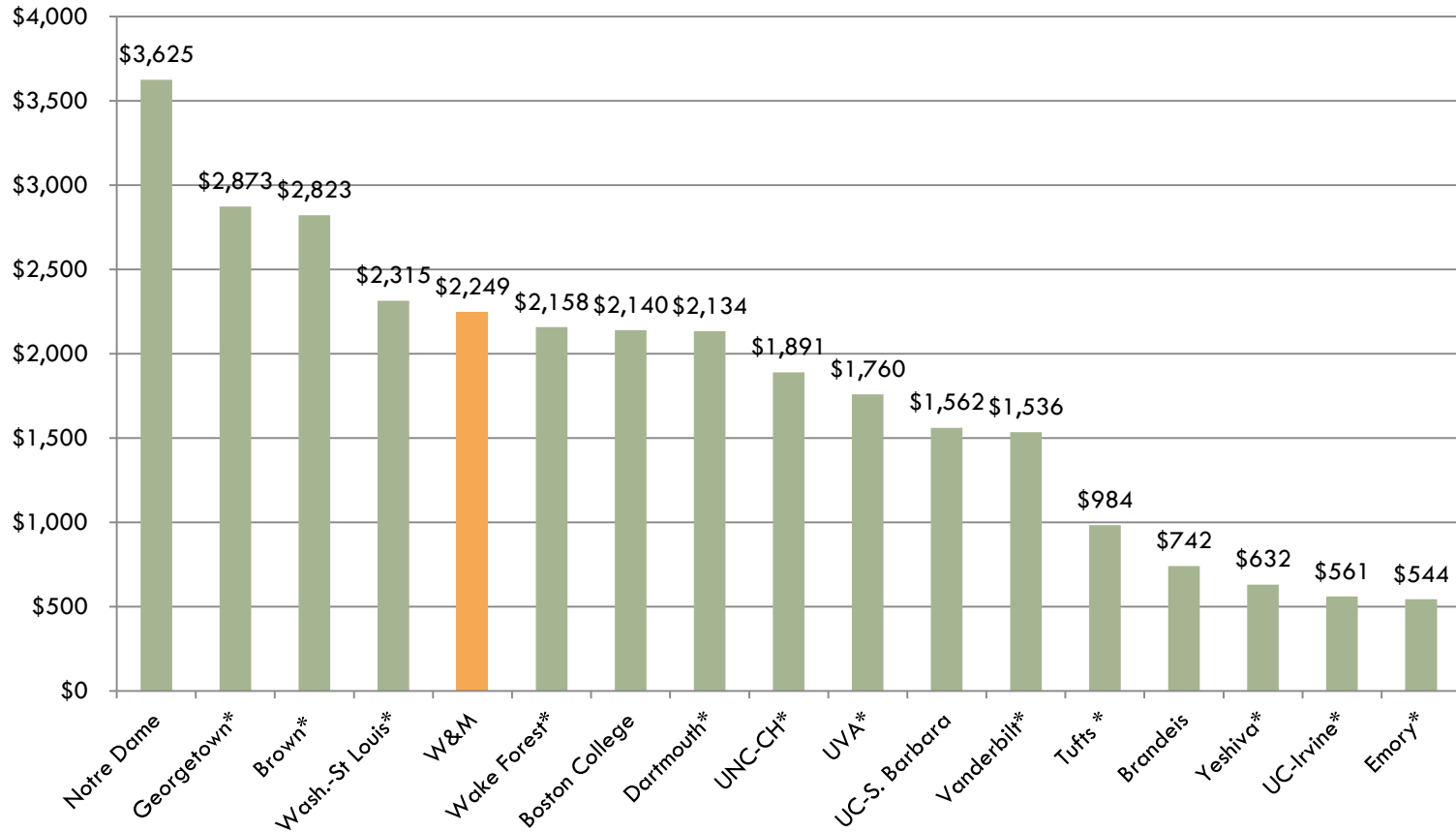

Average alumni donor gift (FY 2014)

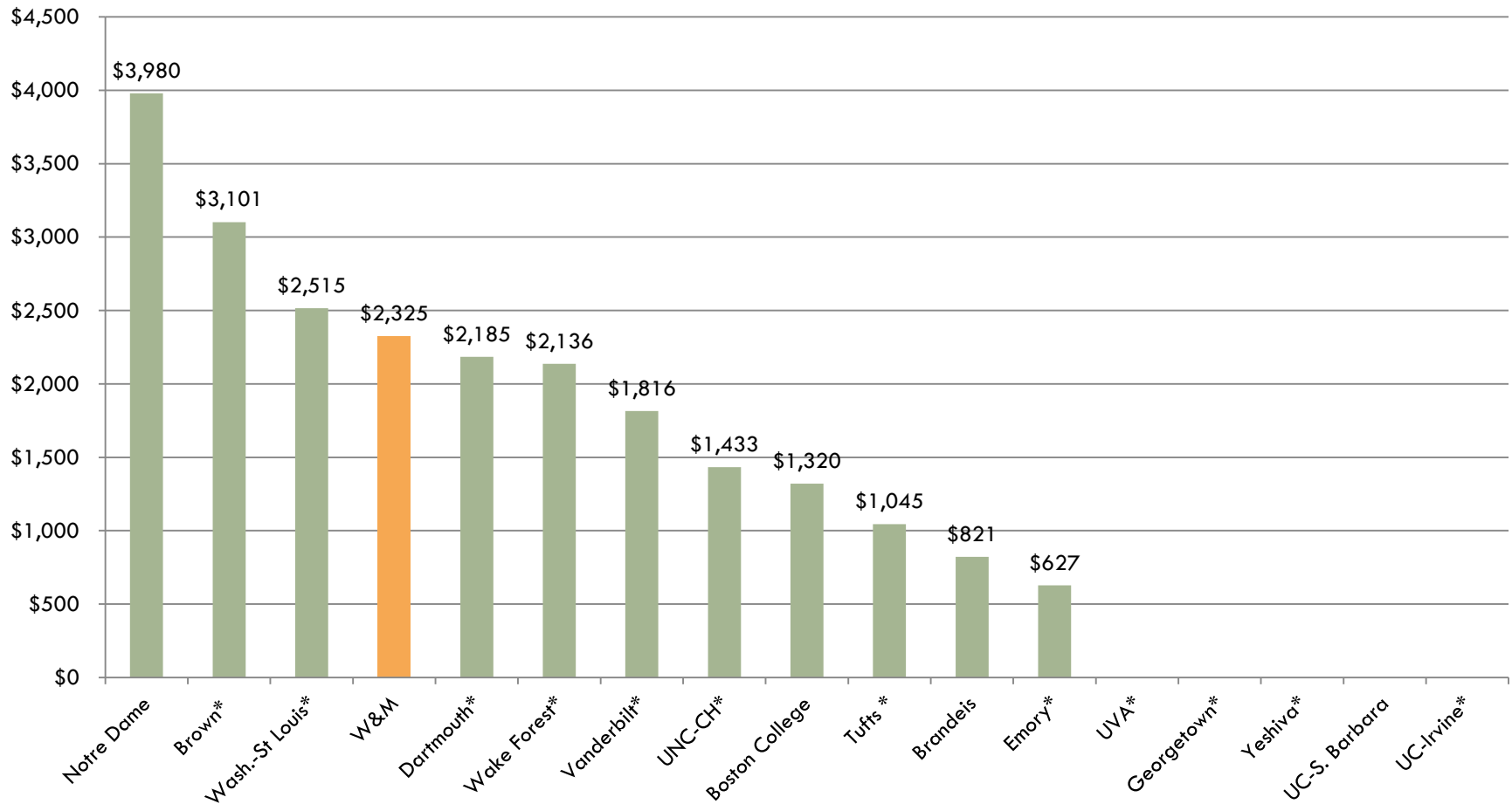

Average undergraduate alumni donor gift (FY 2014)



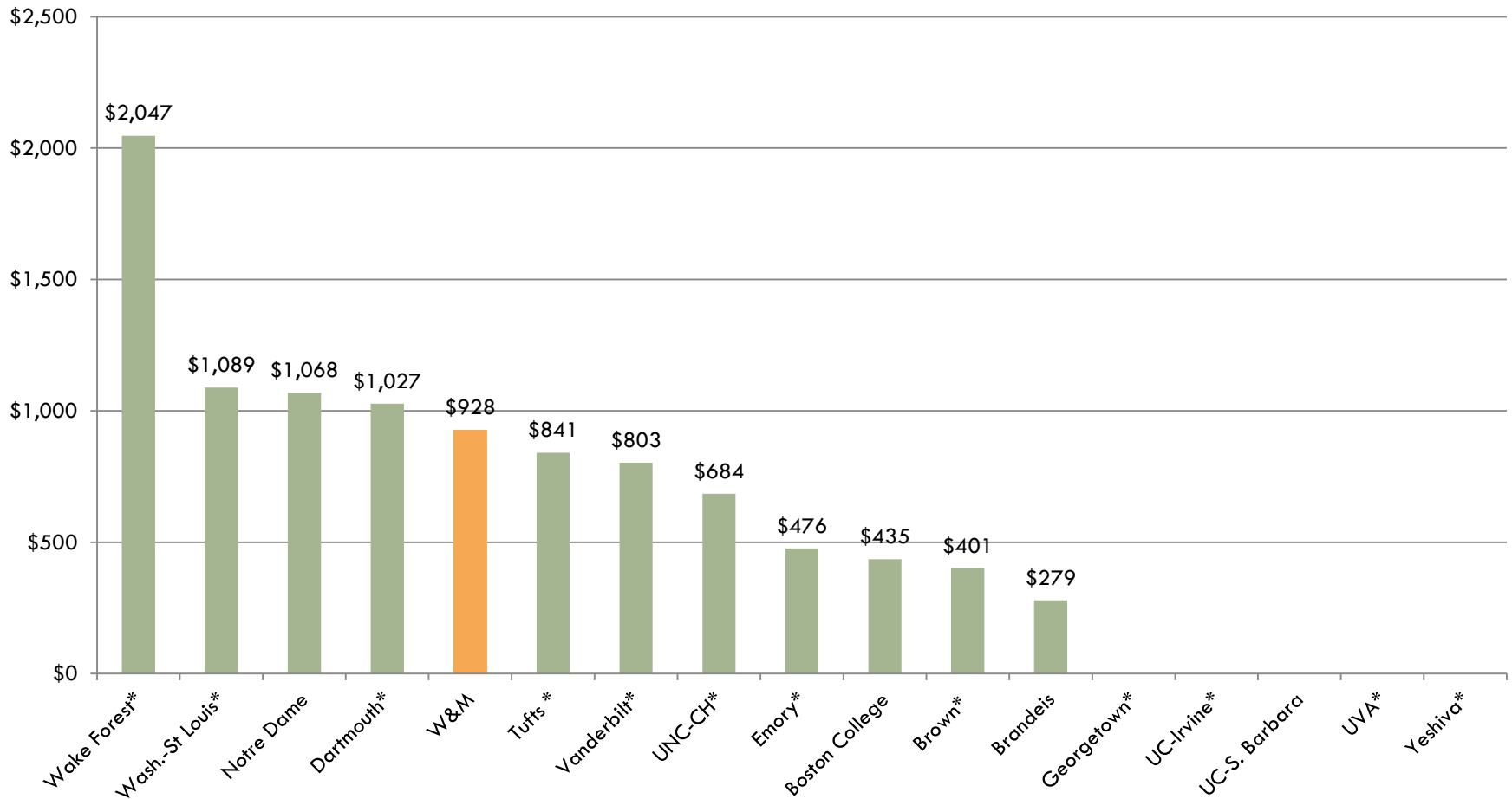

Average graduate alumni donor gift (FY 2014)



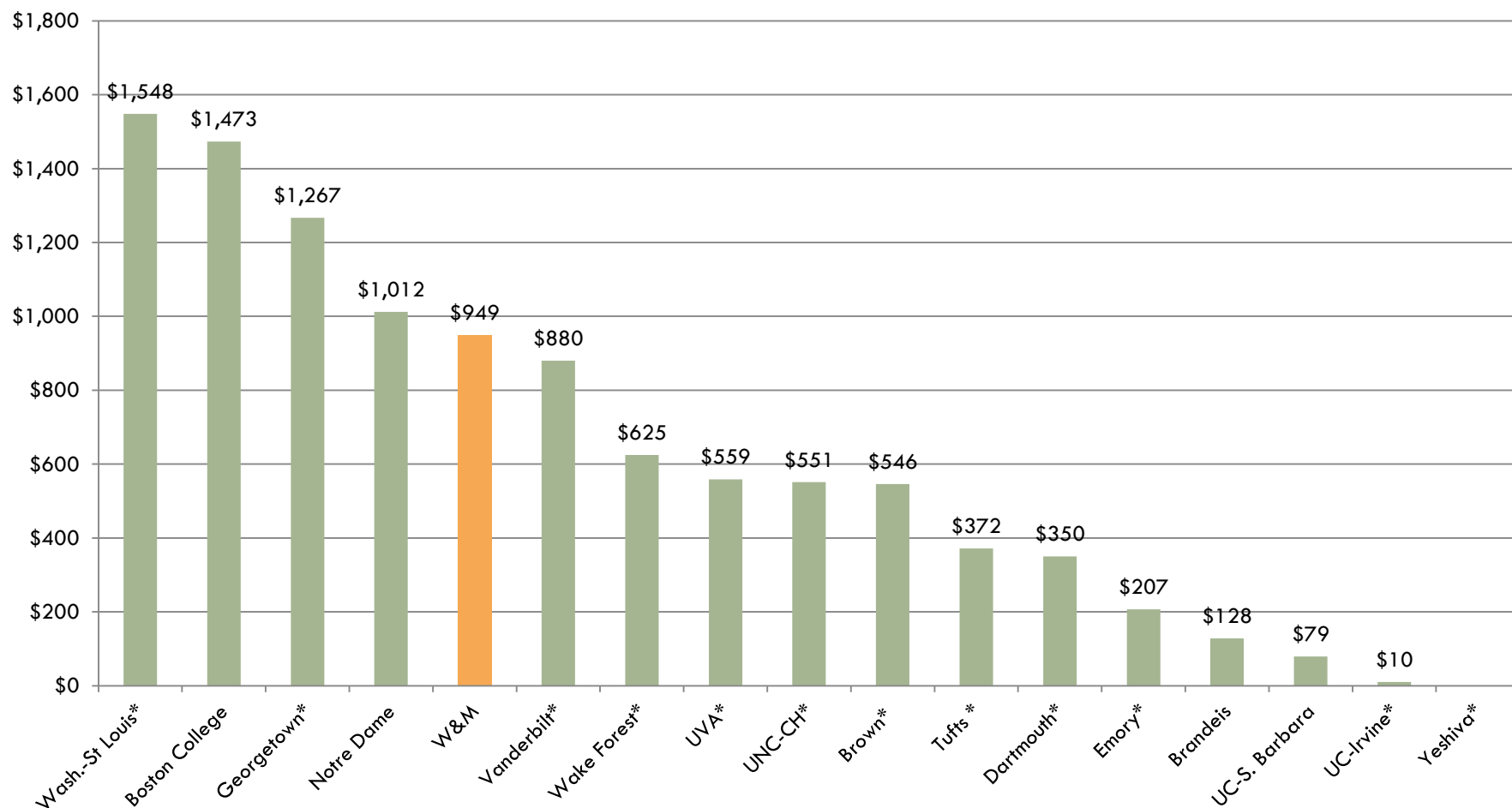

Average alumni giving to endowment per alumni donor (FY 2014)



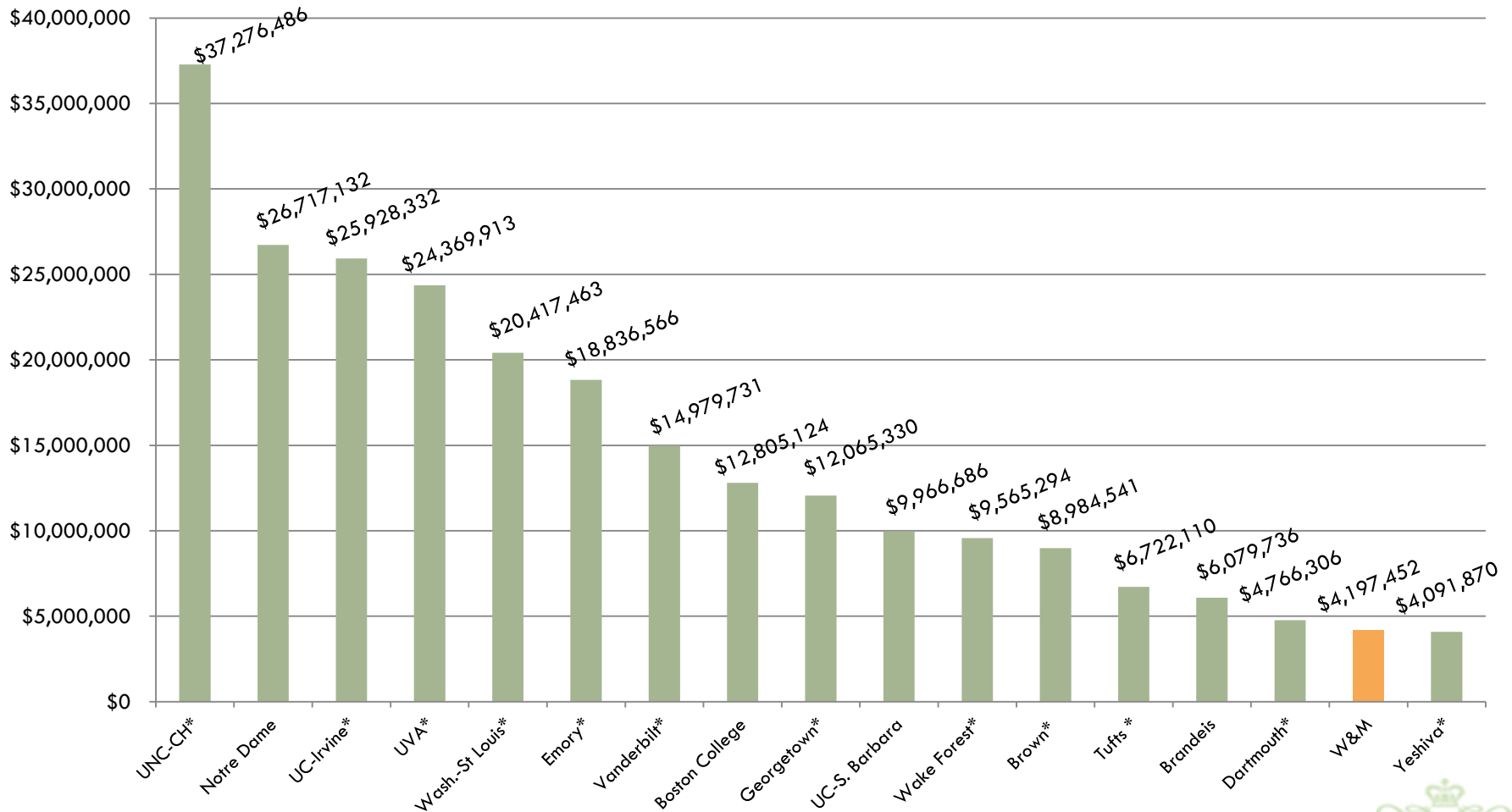

Total corporate giving (FY 2014)

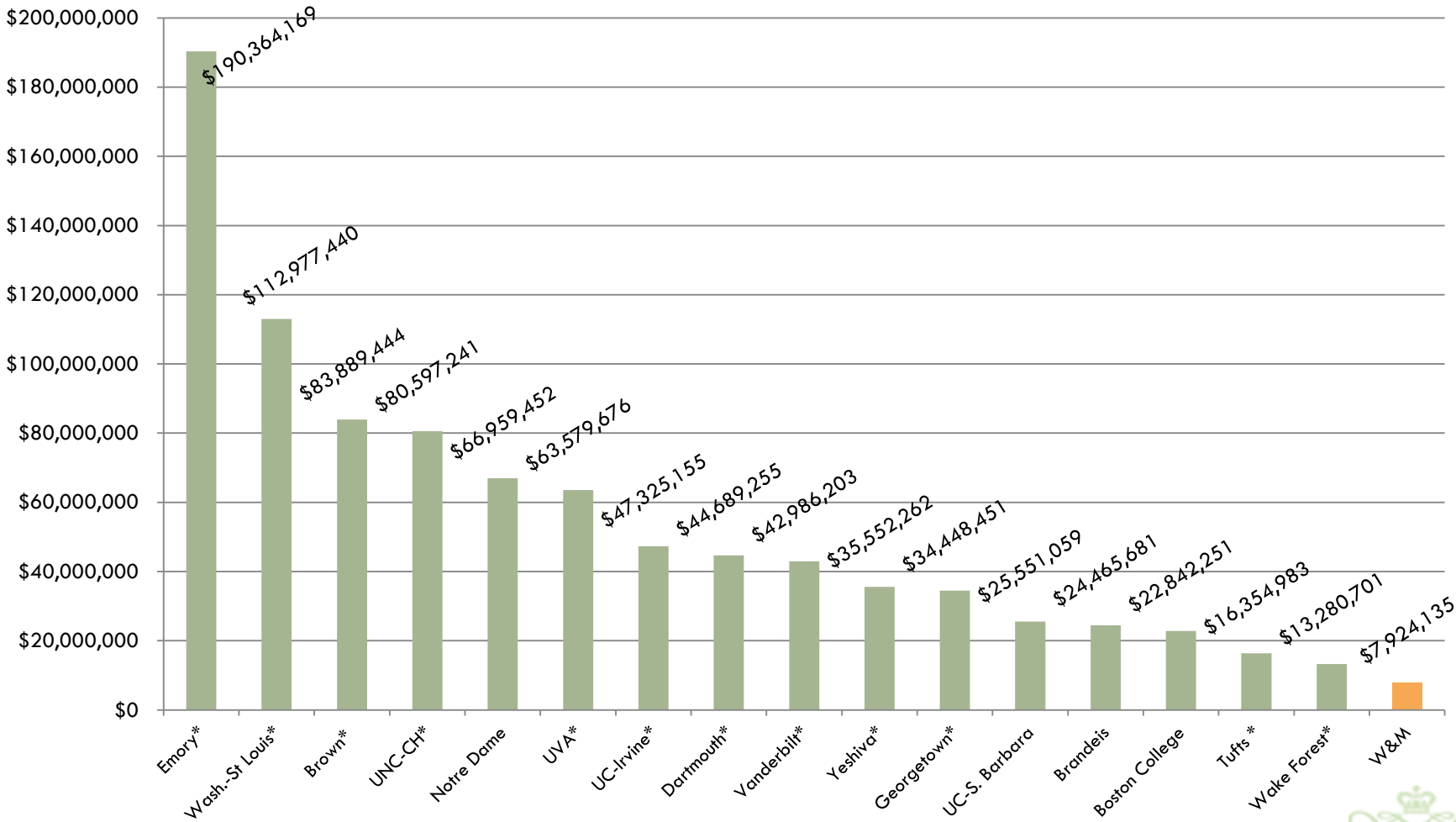

Total foundation giving (FY 2014)

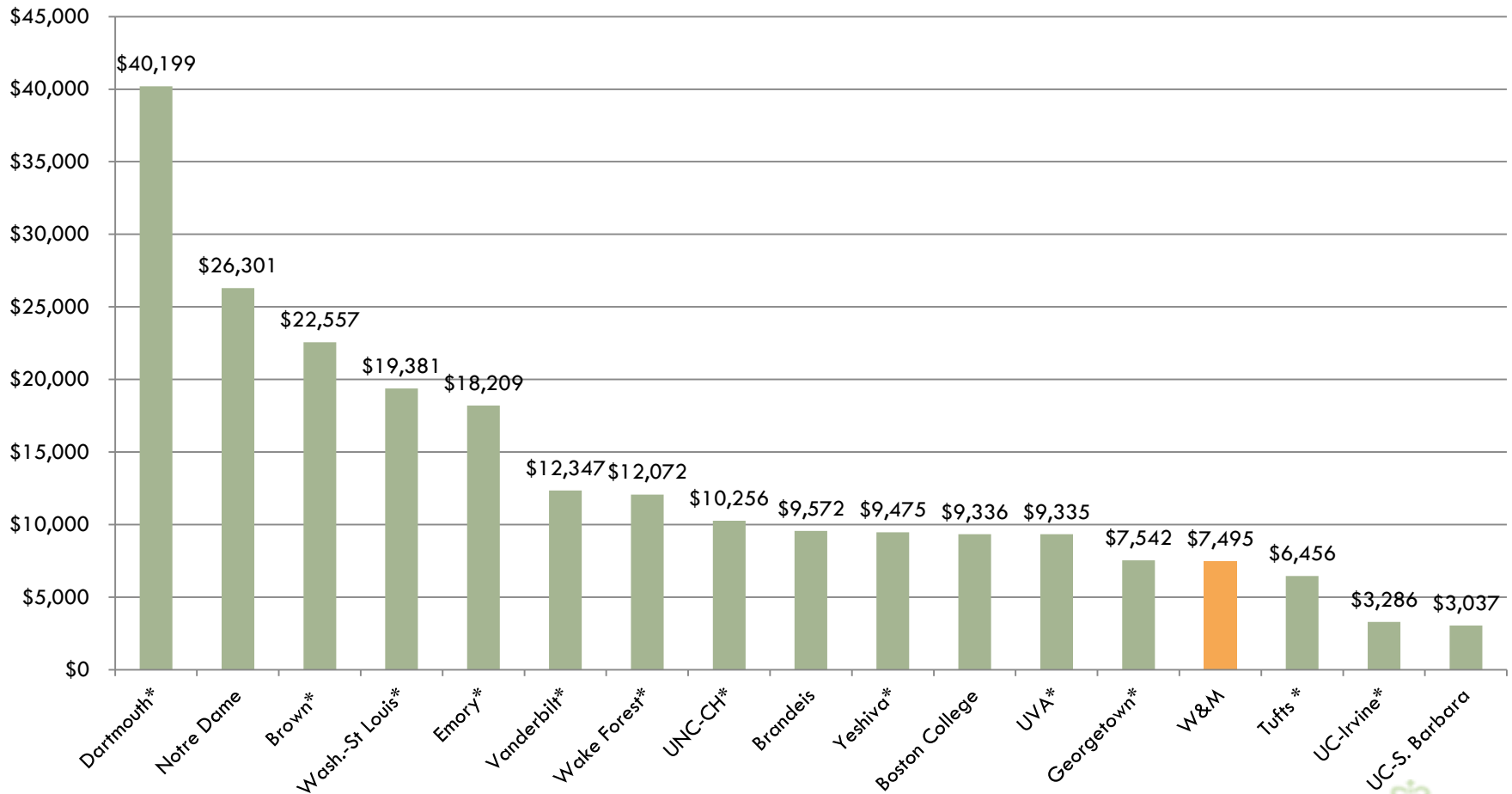

Total private support per student (FY 2014)

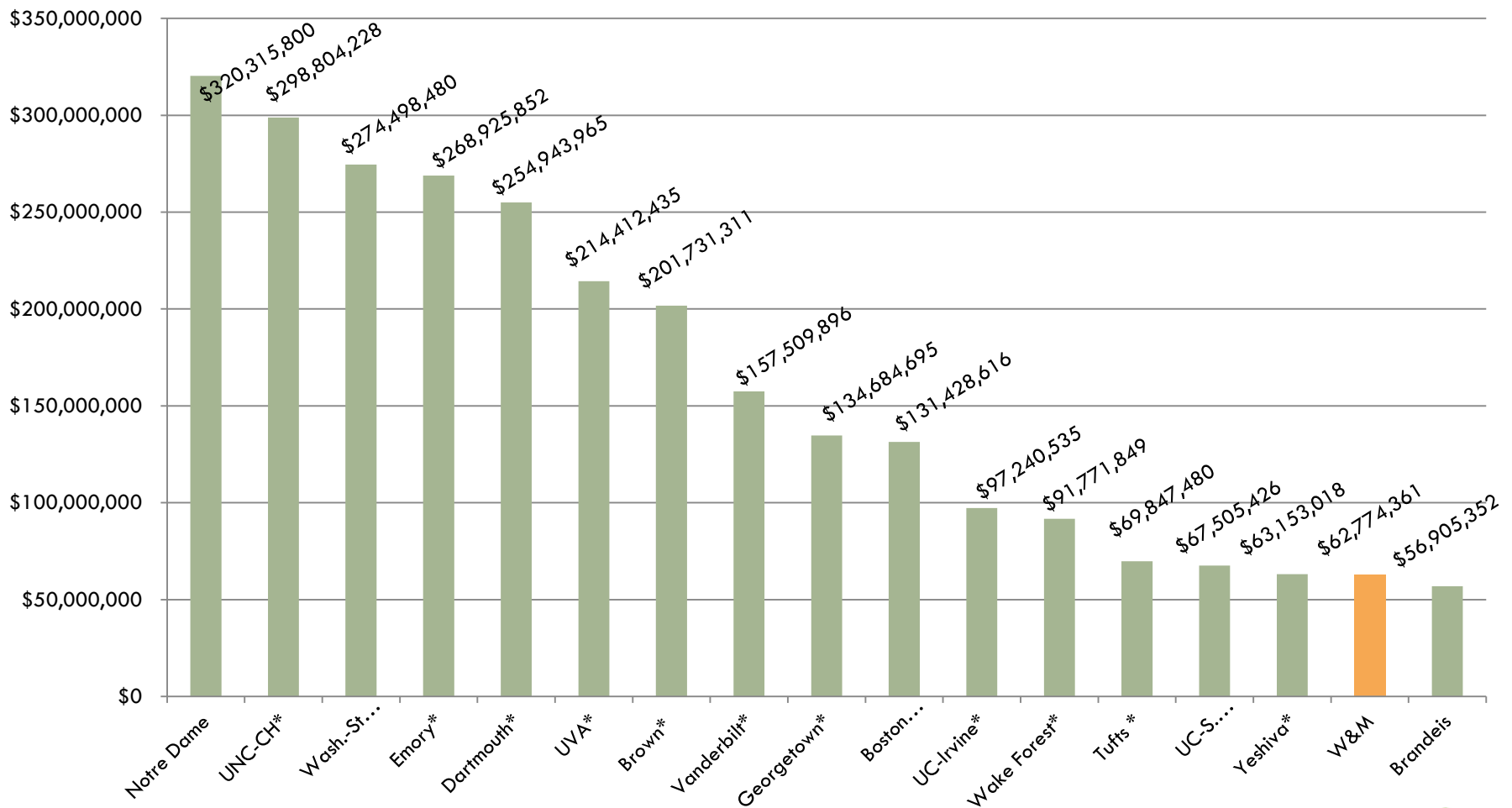

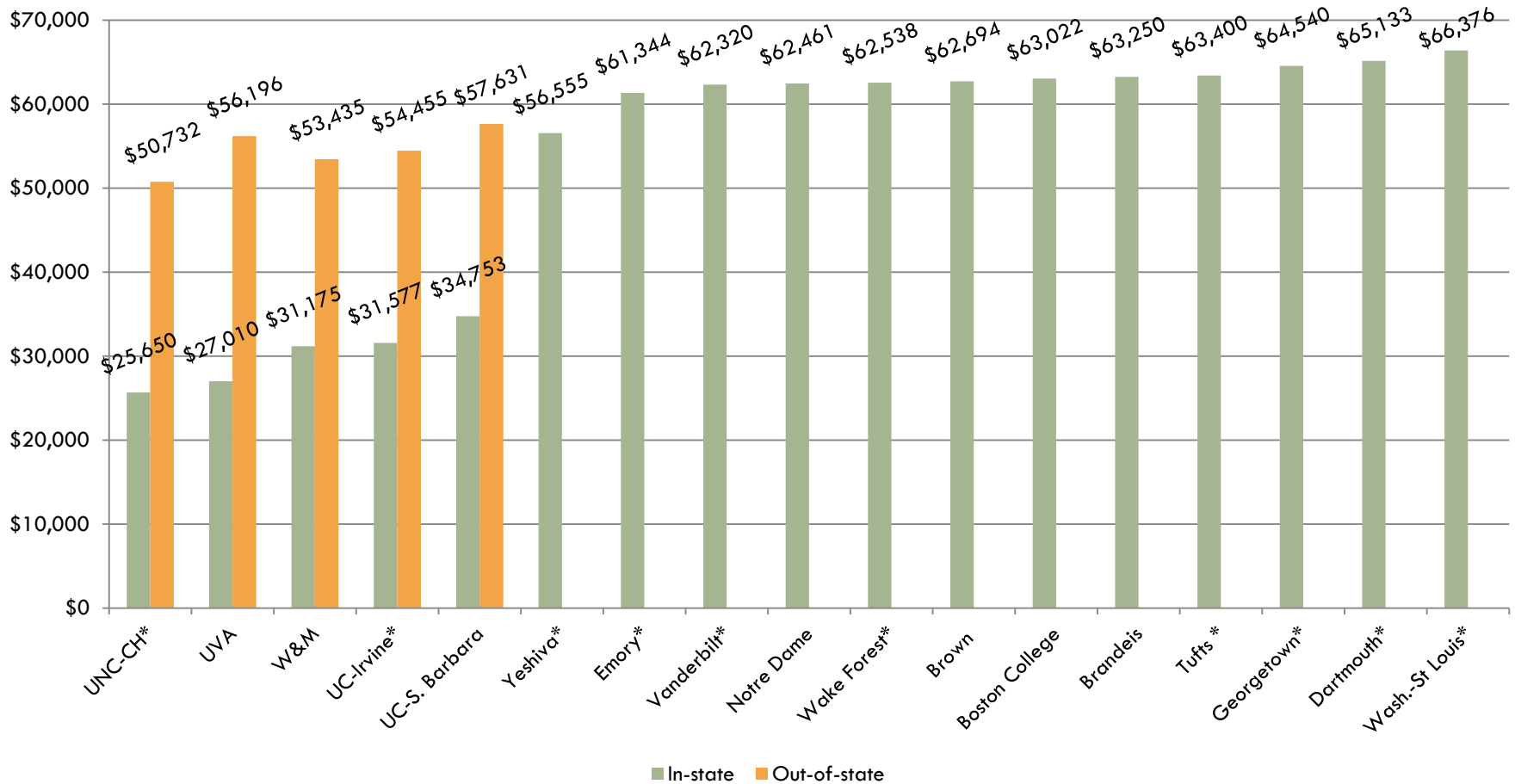

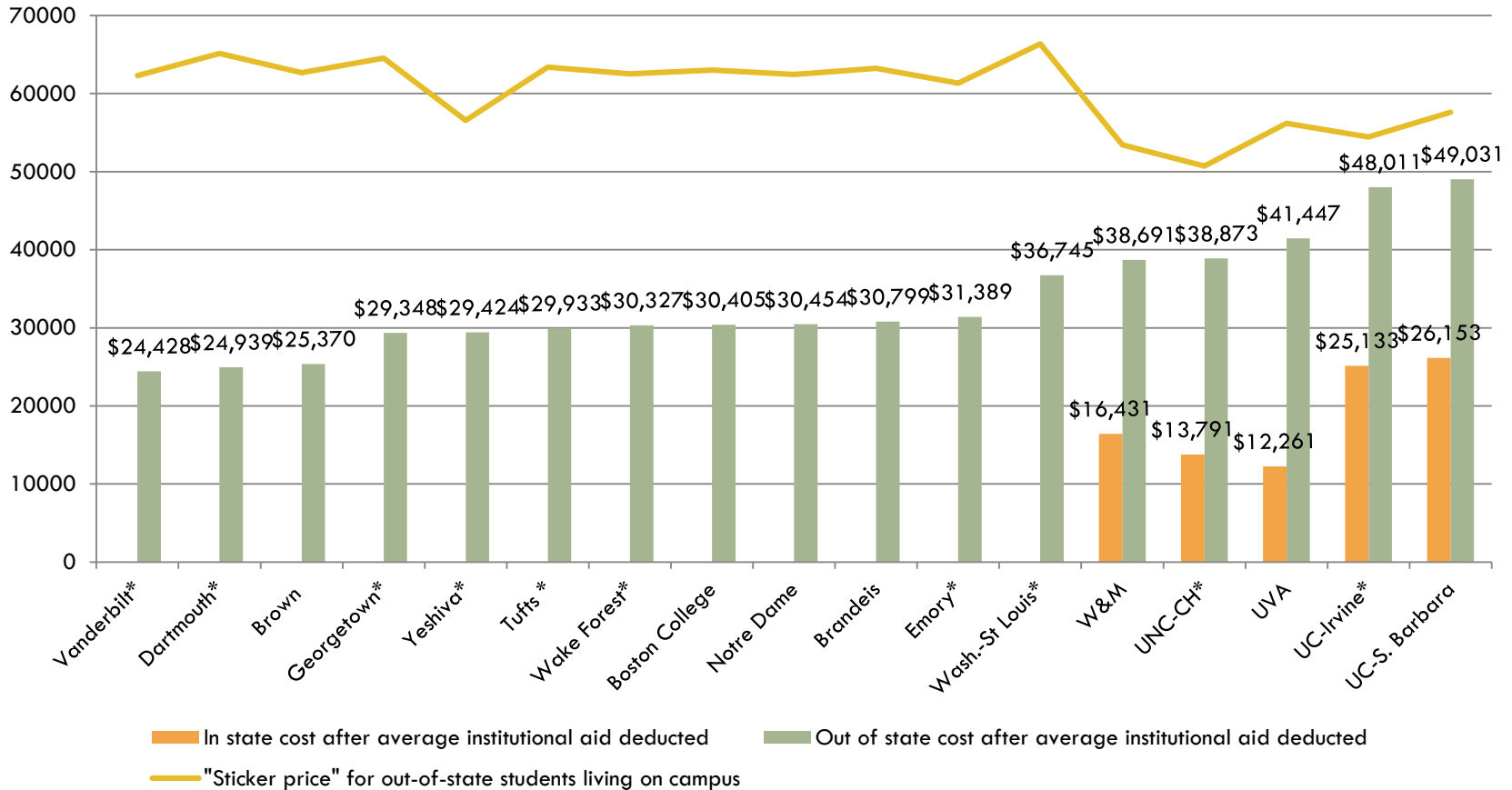

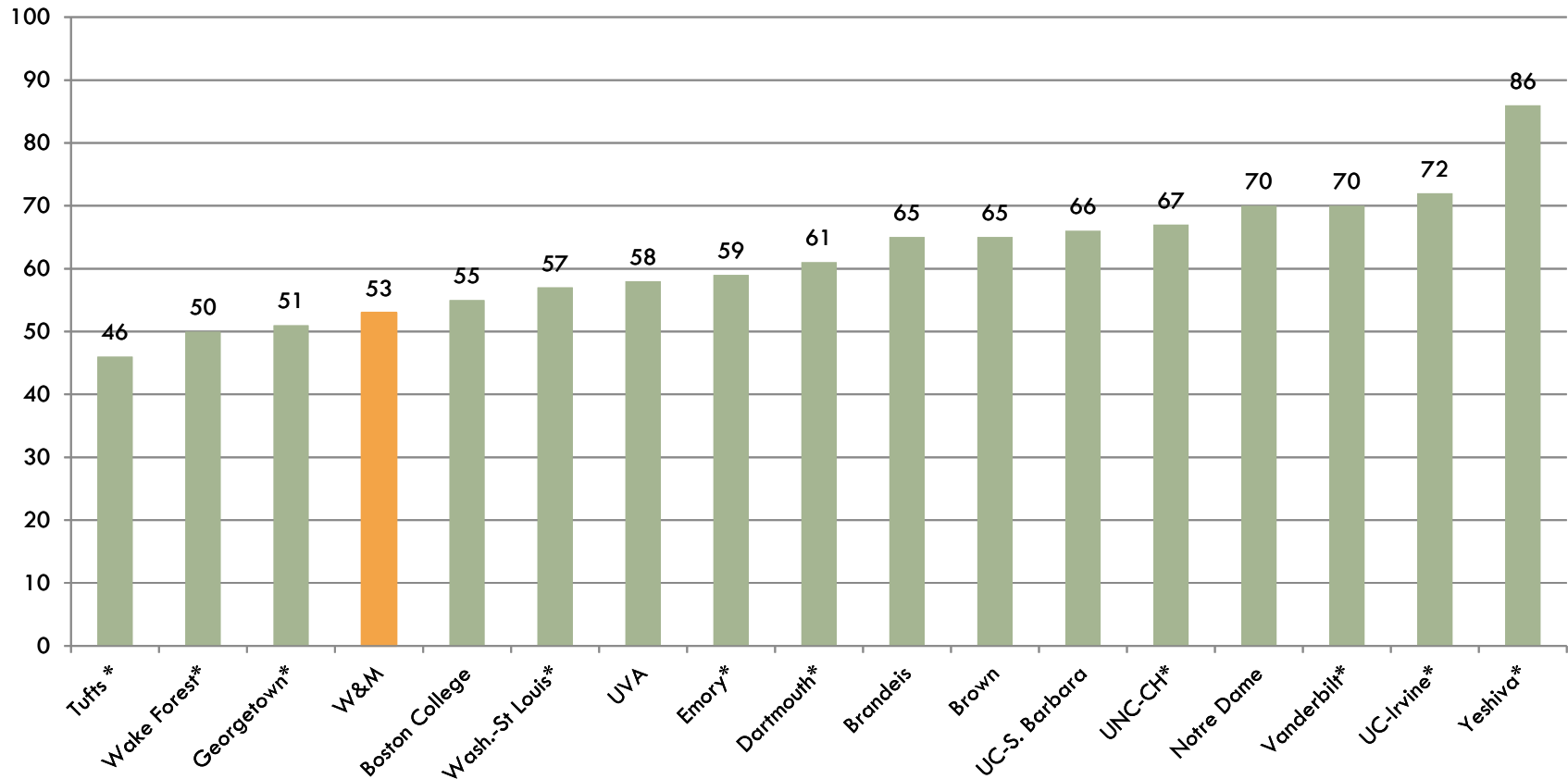

Percent of undergraduates receiving financial aid (2013/2014)



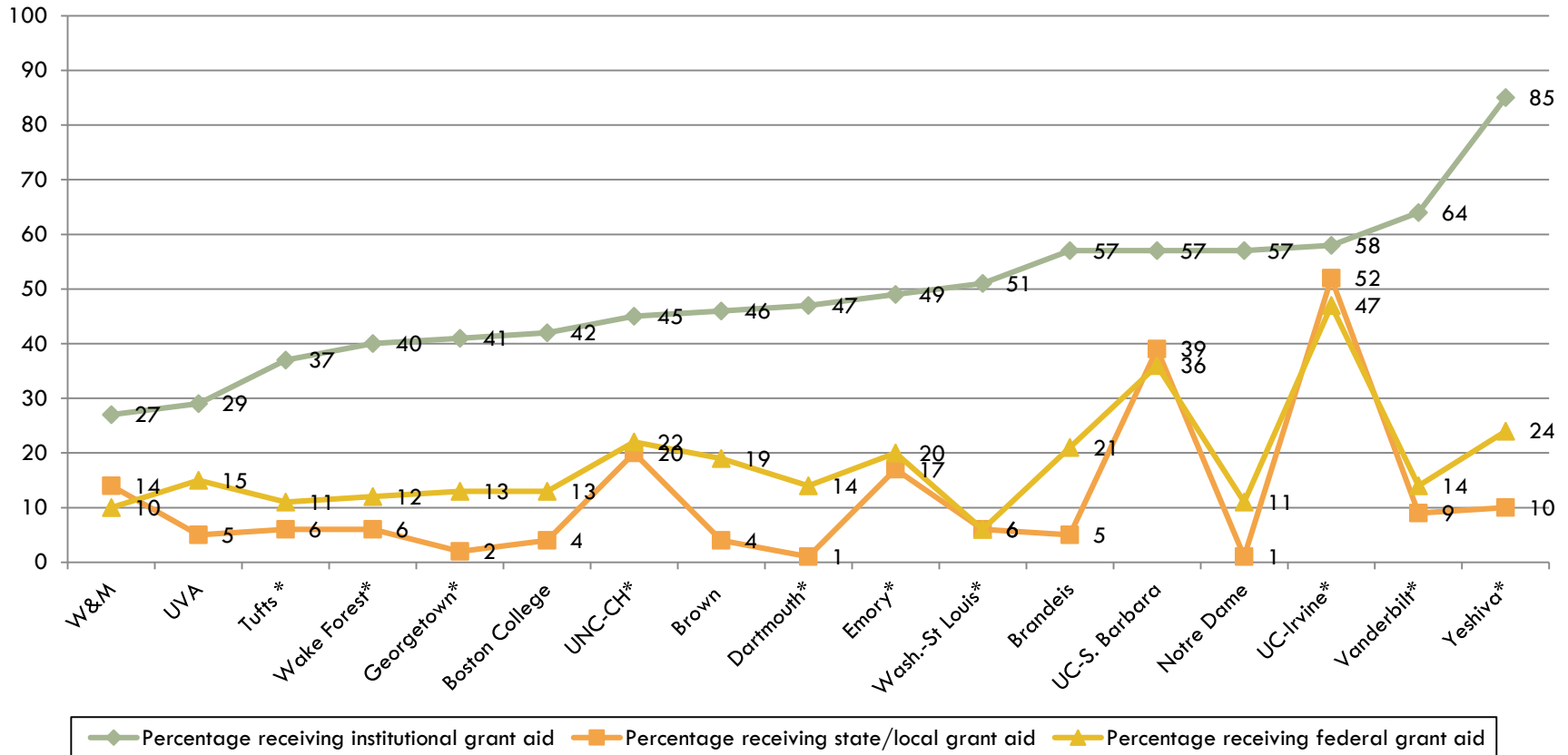

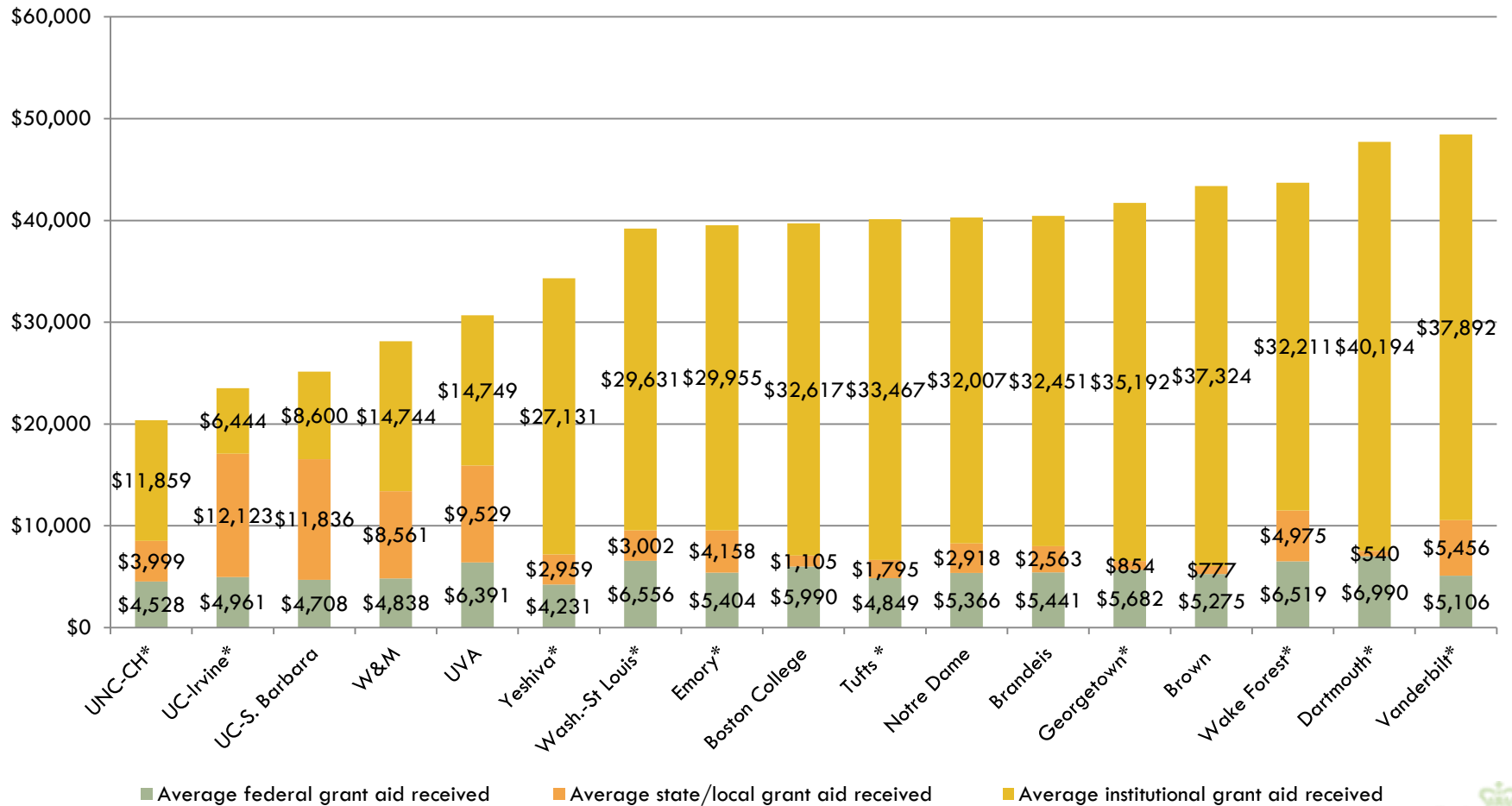
Federal: grants provided by federal agencies, including Title IV Pell Grants and Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants (SEOG).
