


Total enrollment: percent full-time and part-time (Fall 2016)





Undergraduate enrollment by race/ethnicity (Fall 2016)




Undergraduate enrollment: percent women (Fall 2016)






First time full time degree-seeking undergraduate retention rate (Fall 2016)


Undergraduate admittance and yield (Fall 2016)

SAT Scores: 25th -75th Percentile for Reading and Math (Fall 2016)




Undergraduate graduation rate

Undergraduate graduation rate by gender (Fall 2010 cohort, as of August 31, 2016)



Bachelors as percentage of total degrees





Percentage of total degrees by level




Student to faculty ratio (Fall 2016)


Ratio of FTE students to FTE total staff (Fall 2016)


Percentage of FTE staff by function (Fall 2016)

Percentage of full-time faculty (Fall 2016)






Total revenues per FTE student (FY2016)






Total expenses per FTE student (FY2016)




Number of alumni of record (FY 2016)






Alumni giving participation rate (FY 2016)


Undergraduate alumni giving participation rate (FY 2016)




Graduate alumni giving participation rate (FY 2016)






Average alumni donor gift (FY 2016)


Average undergraduate alumni donor gift (FY 2016)


Average graduate alumni donor gift (FY 2016)




Total corporate giving (FY 2016)






Total foundation giving (FY 2016)






Total private support per student (FY 2016)










Percent of undergraduates receiving financial aid (2015/2016)
