WHEREAS, each and every year, William & Mary relies upon the work of unpaid, student volunteers to welcome and guide the newest, incoming class;

WHEREAS, these Orientation Aides (OAs) are unpaid but work 120 hours, mostly outdoors, over the course of 8-9 days, with temperatures reaching up to 90 degrees;

WHEREAS, Student Assembly appreciates the long hours that OAs put in to familiarize the freshmen class with William and Mary's campus and with each other;

WHEREAS, there are typically between 250-300 Fall OAs;

WHEREAS, the appreciation breakfast will be held during OA training as a sign of this gratitude for their commitment to welcoming the next class of our university;

WHEREAS, future efforts should be taken to show Student Assembly's appreciation for tour guides and Griffin Ambassadors, who are also volunteers;

Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Student Assembly of William & Mary:

- 1. Allocates \$1,700 from the Student Assembly Reserves for;
 - a. \$200 for 300 stickers showing Student Assembly's appreciation of our OAs
 - i. Vendor: Sticker Mule
 - ii. Design:
 - b. \$1,500 for America to Go for 300 people;
 - i. Ex. Panera (Morning Pastries, Bagels, and Fruit Bowl); Bakers Crust Breakfast (Farmer's Casserole, Pastry Tray, Seasonal Fruit Array)
- 2. Charges the sponsors of the bill with executing and planning the event;
- 3. Stipulates that all unused funds will return to the Student Assembly reserves.
