

Setting up Eduroam - Android

This document will cover downloading and installing the SecureW2 certificate installer for Eduroam. **Because each Android version is different, images and menus may be different.**

1. Download and install the SecureW2 JoinNow application
2. Install the Eduroam certificate
3. Troubleshooting

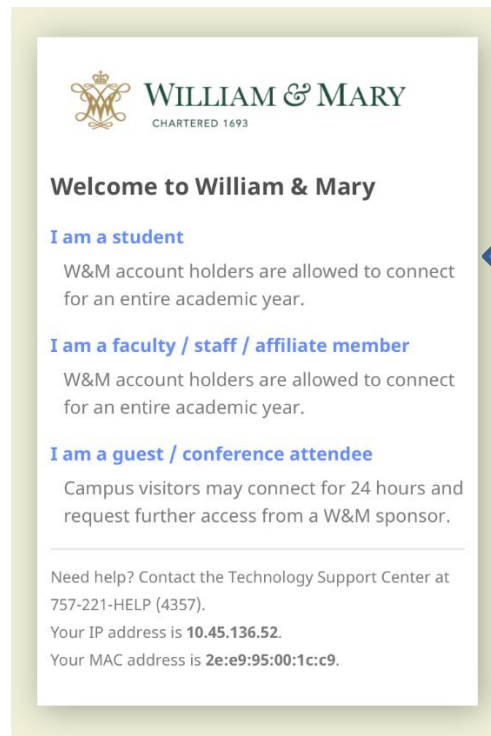
Download and install the SecureW2 JoinNow application

In the **Chrome** browser,
visit

Choose your role.

(Chrome is the only

this one-time setup)



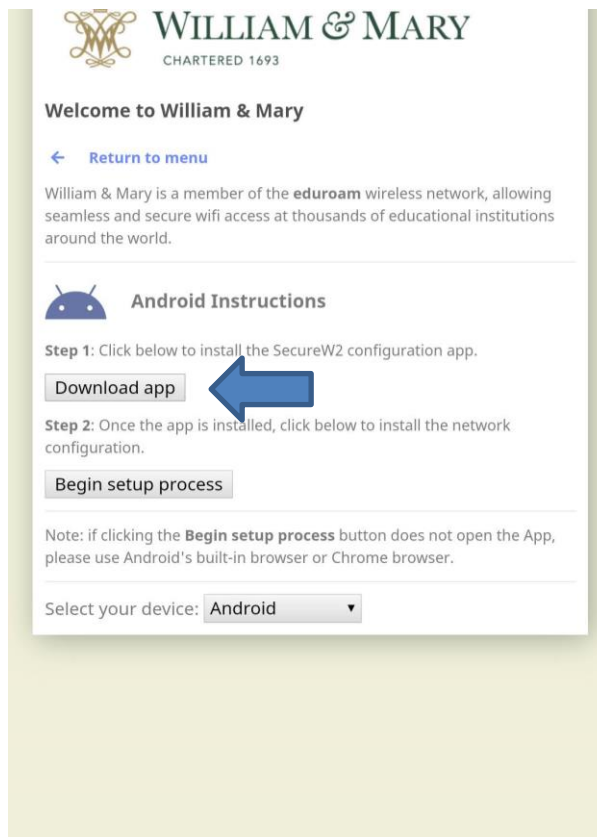

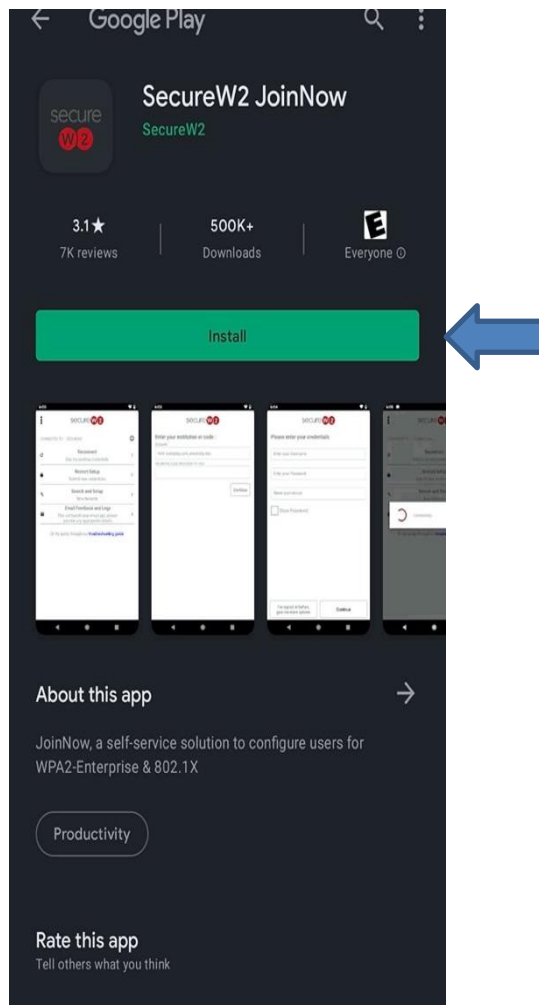

Install 'SecureW2 JoinNow'



Install the Eduroam Certificate

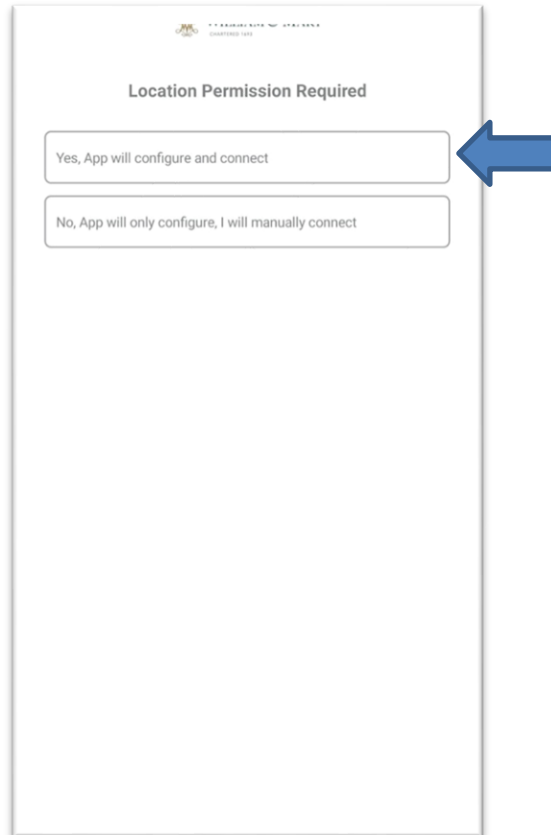
Once downloaded, the application will automatically open.

Choose “Yes, App to configure and connect”

(If the application does not open automatically, visit

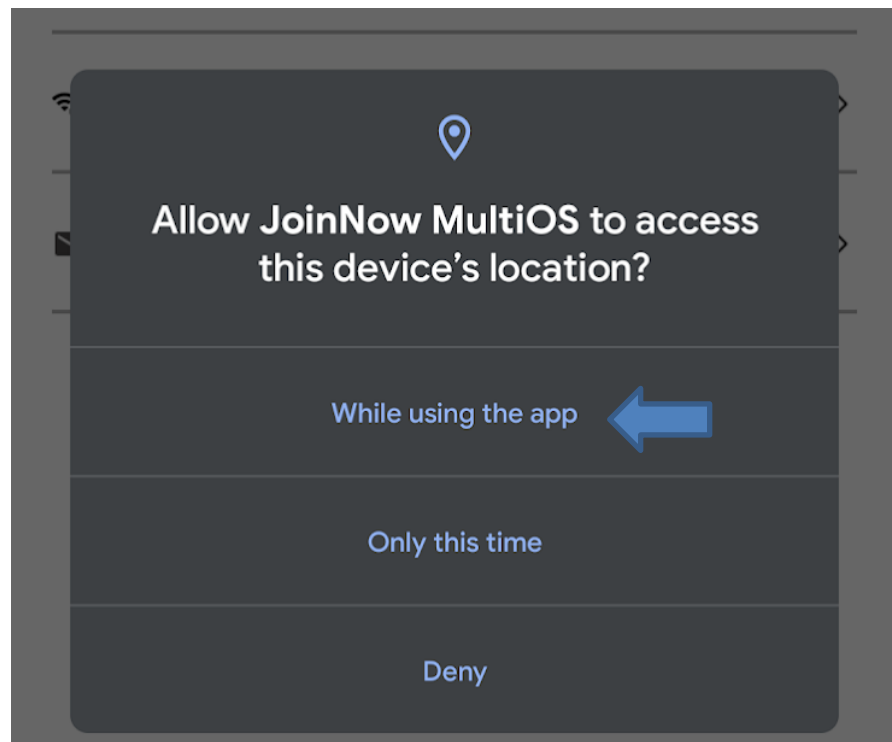
<https://connect.wm.edu>

from Chrome and click the ‘Install Network Configuration’ button.)




You'll get a pop-up asking when the phone can access your location.

Android uses the device location when automatically connecting to wifi networks. In order to automatically connect when moving around campus, you'll need to choose “**While using the app**”




Enter your Banner (CAS) credentials. Click login.

Click 'Next.'

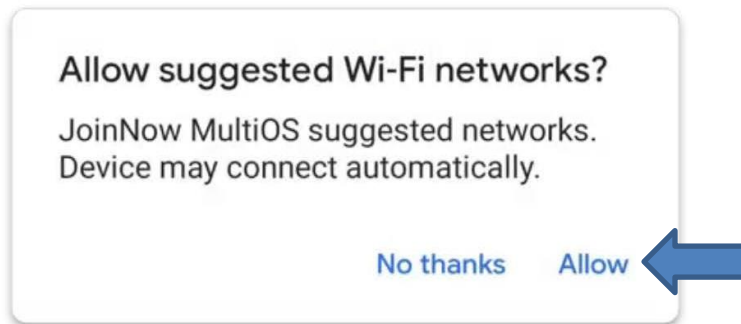


We're Almost Done.

After pressing **Next**, you may receive an Android System notification suggested by JoinNow MultiOS to "Connect to Wi-Fi networks?"

Press **Allow** on this notification.



IMPORTANT: JoinNow MultiOS will not be able to connect your device to the Wi-Fi network if you press **No thanks**.

If you decline this notification, your device will not be able to connect to the Wi-Fi!



Next

Because the Android operating system runs on many types of phones, you may have to make some manual adjustments to get connect to Eduroam. You can contact support@wm.edu for assistance.

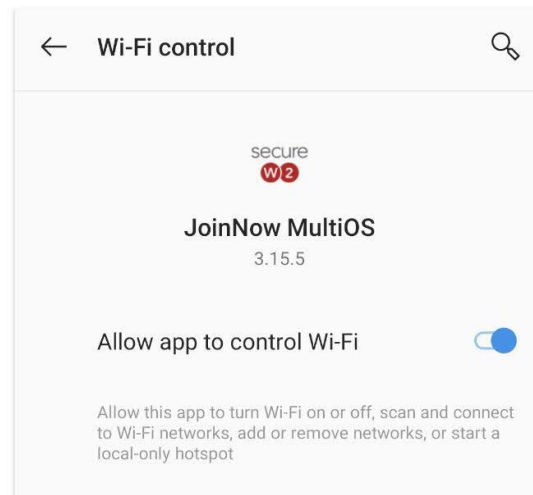


If you did see the prompt shown in the previous screen, but you pressed **No thanks**, you need to manually enable a Special App Access setting.

Allow App to Enable Wi-Fi

1. Navigate to Settings > Apps & Notifications
2. Then navigate to Special App Access > Wi-Fi Control
3. Find JoinNow MultiOS and enable **Allow app to control Wi-Fi** like in the screen shown below
4. Restart the App configuration from the beginning

Please note, vendors like Samsung, Oneplus, Redmi, etc. will differ in how to access this screen.



Alternatively, you can Uninstall the JoinNow Application and restart the configuration process if your're having difficulty with the steps above

If you accidentally delete SecureW2, you can download it again from your app store. After you download it, open the app and the configuration may still be on your phone. Then choose Restart Setup in the app to rejoin Eduroam.



If your device is still having issues connecting to the Wi-Fi network, the following tips can help.

Remove the Setup Network(s)

1. Navigate to Wi-Fi Settings
2. Select WM-Welcome and long press
3. Press Forget

Manually Connect to Network

1. Navigate to Wi-Fi Settings
2. Connect to eduroam Wi-Fi Network.

Don't Delete this App

If you delete this small 15MB application, your wireless connection may be lost. Only delete the app if you don't need to connect to the campus network anymore. Google has promised to fix this in a future update.

If you cannot automatically connect to Eduroam, you should be able to connect manually in your Network Settings. The settings should look like the provided screenshot.
