USNWR 2018 Highlights

- W&M remained tied for 32nd overall, 6th among public universities
 - Alumni Giving ranked 18th (up from 20th) among all leading national universities
 - Financial Resources ranked 111th (still the largest gap between overall quality and resources among leading universities)

USNWR Methodology Notes

- There is a lag in the data
 - For example, alumni giving is the two-year average of 2014-15 and 2015-16
 - Financial resources is the two-year average for FY15 and FY16
- Every university's raw score is divided by the top raw score, so the top school's score equals 100
 - Published overall score can move based on the numerator (us) or denominator (them)

WSJ 2018 Highlights

- W&M ranked 100th among more than 1,000 institutions in the United States
 - WSJ does not separate research universities, liberal arts colleges, etc.
- W&M ranked 65th in Outcomes (graduation rate, value added to graduate salaries, reputation and value added to loan default)

WSJ Formula Categories and Weights

2018

Outcomes

40%

- Value added to graduate salary 12%
- Graduation rate 11%
- Academic reputation (THE survey; total votes received for teaching excellence) 10%
- Value added to loan default 7%

Resources

30%

- Finances per student (teaching-associated spending adjusted using regional price comparisons) 11%
- Faculty per student 11%
- Research papers per faculty (Elsevier bibliographic dataset, 2011-2015) 8%

Engagement

20%

- Student engagement (THE survey; avg. score of four questions) 7%
- Student recommendation (THE survey) 6%
- Interactions with teachers and students (THE survey; avg. score of two questions) 3%
- Subject breadth (number of courses offered) 3%

Environment

10%

- Student diversity (likelihood of two randomly selected undergraduates being of different race/ethnicity) 3%
- Faculty diversity (same as student diversity calculation) 3%
- Proportion of international students 2%
- Student inclusion (proportion of Pell recipients and first-generation; normalized) 2%

WSJ Methodology Notes

- WSJ values wealth even more than USNWR
 - WSJ is 22% wealth-related variables; USNWR is 18%
 - Three publics among THE's global top-25, only one among WSJ's U.S. top-25 (THE provides reputational survey)
- Some WSJ metrics discount W&M
 - Subject breadth (number of programs) favors large institutions; no accounting for breadth of exposure (i.e., the number of subjects required of undergraduates)
