## What is consent?

Consent is clear, knowing, voluntary and ongoing agreement for sexual contact or activity. Someone who is incapacitated (for example by alcohol or drugs) or who is intimidated, threatened, or coerced cannot give valid consent. Learn more about <u>how W&M policy</u> <u>defines consent</u>.
