
# **Your Voice Has Impact**

On September 24, 2020, we asked all students to describe their current course workloads compared to Fall 2019. The most common response was that student workloads were **much heavier**, and the most common explanation for the difference was the **compression of the Fall 2020 semester**.

Provost Peggy Agouris cited this feedback as influencing the decision to **not similarly compress the Spring 2021 semester.** Responses to W&M&You polls will continue to guide university decisions as we move forward in 2021 and beyond.
