

## CONCENTRATION IN STUDIO ART

EFFECTIVE FALL 2021

A minimum of 37 credits (art & art history) must be earned in the major; a maximum of 48 (studio) credits may be earned. There is an exception to this rule: for the student preparing a portfolio for graduate study in studio art they may want to consider additional studio credits. The student may apply to take up to 12 extra studio credits beyond the 48 maximum credits.

## CORE REQUIREMENTS:

- ART 211: Drawing & Color – Suggested completion by end of freshman year
- ART 212: 3D Design: Form & Space – Suggested completion by end of freshman year
- Art 461: Capstone I (2cr.) – to be taken 2<sup>nd</sup> semester Junior year (or 3 semesters before graduation)
- Art 462: Capstone II (2cr.) – to be taken 1<sup>st</sup> semester Senior year (or 2 semesters before graduation)
- Art 463: Capstone III (1 cr.) – to be taken 2<sup>nd</sup> semester Senior year (or last semester before graduation)
- ARTH 200 level (at or above 230) - Suggested completion by end of sophomore year
- ARTH 200 level (at or above 230) - Suggested completion by end of sophomore year
- ARTH 300 level (at or above 330) - this must fulfill major writing requirement\*

\*Any art history course 330 or above (including ARTH 490) may fulfill the requirement. Follow points 1-3 below:

1. No later than the first week of class, students are to notify their art history faculty of their intention to fulfill the major writing requirement with the specified course.
2. Students are to file a major writing requirement form with the specified art history faculty. Major writing requirement forms can be found on the A&AH website under Student Resources (Forms). A link to a PDF version of this form is located under Student Resources (Forms)
3. After students have completed the course with a grade of C or higher, the instructor will file the major writing requirement form with the department chair. Students should follow up on the filing of this form.

## ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS:

In addition to completing the core requirements above, students will complete either a 2D track or 3D track to fulfill their 37 credit hours
