Beginning in Fall 2023, the Chemistry Department is piloting a mentorship/tutoring program targeted at students enrolled in General Chemistry I (CHEM 103). This program aims to engage students and provide valuable resources that promote success within the course and establish a sense of community and belonging within the department. Mentors serving in this program will work either as "specialists" or "generalists":

Specialist:

- Directly paired with a CHEM 103 professor (Bedford, Meldrum, Perrault, Pike)
- Attend CHEM 103 lectures
- Hold study/tutor sessions & other responsibilities that may occur as the semester progresses

Generalist:

- Aid in design and implementation of chemistry-themed programming
- Hold study/tutor sessions
- Assist with lectures when needed & tasks that may occur as the semester progresses

Due to the close ties to the Chemistry Department, preference will be given to chemistry majors: however, all applicants will be considered.

General Expectations:

- 5-10 hr/week for 15 weeks of the semester at \$12/hr
- Hold weekly tutorial sessions
- Participate in mentor trainings
- Work closely with faculty to support the program
- Act with a level of professionalism
- Encourage a sense of community and belonging
