Course Description

This course is intended to give an introductory look at the aggregate economic activity. Topics include national output and income, inflation, growth, monetary and fiscal policies, and international economic issues.

Course Materials

- **Textbook:** *Macroeconomics* by Krugman and Wells, either the 3rd edition (ISBN-13: 978-1429283434), or the 4th (ISBN-13: 978-1464110375). Using the 2nd edition is also acceptable.
- **Newspaper:** The *Wall Street Journal*. We will discuss articles from this newspaper on a regular basis. You can access *The Wall Street Journal* via Swem, or you can purchase your own 15-week subscription for \$15 by visiting wsj.com/studentoffer

Grading

Grades will be based on homework assignments, 3 midterms and a cumulative final exam. Grade percentages are as follows:

- Homework assignments (best 10 out of 11): 10%
- 3 midterms: 54% total (18% each)
- Final Exam: 36%
- **Homework assignments** will be available on Blackboard (under "Assignments"). There will be 10 problem sets and one short essay assignment. Problem sets will open on Wednesday and should be completed by next Tuesday evening at 11:59 pm. The short essay assignment will be due on the last day of classes at 11:59 pm. Late homework will not be accepted; however, one lowest homework grade will be dropped.
- **Midterm exams** will be given on the following dates:

 - o Midterm 2: Mar 14 (Wed), during class time
 - o Midterm 3: Apr 11 (Wed), during class time

Midterm make-up policy: If you know that you will not be able to attend an exam come see me ahead of time with a valid, documented excuse and we will attempt to arrange for you to take the exam before it is given. A midterm exam can be taken after the exam date ONLY if you miss it due to an emergency AND can provide a letter from the Dean of Students office. In all other situations, your final exam grade will be used in lieu of the missed midterm grade. This applies to one missed midterm exam only.

- Extra credit: You can earn a small amount of extra credit by answering practice questions in class and there will be a lot of them! For each correctly answered question, I will add 0.02 percentage points to your course grade; in other words, 50 correctly answered questions will increase your grade by 1 percentage point.
