You will choose the courses for your English Major in consultation with a departmental advisor considering your preparation, background, career expectations, and educational interests. Any full-time continuing faculty member can be a major advisor. The department encourages students to design a program of study that exposes them to a range of historical periods and critical approaches to literature. In addition to the requisite courses in English, a sound major program should include a coherent pattern of complementary elective courses in other departments and allied fields chosen in consultation with the advisor.

A common question: If I list a class on this form that I am planning to take, must I take that class or can I make substitutions? The answer: You can make substitutions as long as you meet the requirements for the major. It's always a good idea to consult with your advisor if you have questions or concerns about changes you are making.

<b>MAJOR ELECTIVES</b>				
Amongst your elective courses, you can count up to nine credits in creative writing (CRWR), expository writing (WRIT), and/or English linguistics courses toward your major. The English linguistics courses that can be counted are: ENGL 230; LING 250; ENGL/LING 303; LING 308; ENGL/LING 400; and ENGL/LING 410. You may also count one approved literature course taken in any of the Modern Languages or Classical Civilization, either in another language or in translation. Approved courses are listed on the English Department's website. Students may seek approval for courses not on this list by petitioning the English Department chair. A maximum of nine credits in this section can come from courses at the 100 and 200 levels.
