

Sample Transcript for Joint **International Relations** Program Student

This student has no transfer credits (AP or IB) and has not met the language proficiency prior to beginning the program (these assumptions are very unlikely to be met in practice. What you see here is “worst case scenario” in terms of preparation. In fact, it is very unlikely we would be admitting a student to an honors-level program without having taken some normal college prep courses and a foreign language, especially for someone interested in IR. In practice, the language requirement will have been met so student will have 4 additional course slots that are open for electives or more breadth. In addition, many incoming students now have some combination of Econ 101, 102, Gov 203, and Hist 192 as incoming freshman). The student’s IR curriculum and outside classes show a particular interest in international security issues and music.
