RE: Proposed Minor in Russian Language and Literature

The following proposal for a new minor has been reviewed and approved by the Policy Committee of the Department of Modern Languages and Literatures.

RATIONALE FOR THE MINOR IN RUSSIAN LANGUAGE & LITERATURE:

A minor in Russian Language and Literature (Area I) is meant to complement the present Minor in Russian Studies (with its emphasis in Area II). All of the necessary courses for the proposed minor are in place and taught on a regular basis in the department of Modern Languages & Literatures. Library and faculty resources are adequate for this minor, and random faculty contact with students suggests that students are interested in this track.

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE MINOR IN RUSSIAN LANGUAGE & LITERATURE:

7 courses beyond RUS 202, one of which may be Russian literature or culture in translation. No courses for the minor may be taken pass/fail.

Students would be able to choose from the following list of regularly-offered courses in order to fulfill the minor requirements:
