The Department of Anthropology would like to propose the following changes in the numbering of undergraduate courses that are compatible with the course numbering approved by the Committee on Graduate Studies and the Registrar. We have reviewed all the existing courses in the light of the proposed Ph.D. program in anthropology, have discussed cross-listing possibilities with History and American Studies for several courses (see the attached forms for new courses (Anthropology 429, 482, 484 and 490).

We would like to change the numbering system based on the following rationale.

150-310	General courses
311-325	Archaeology courses that correspond with graduate courses in historical archaeology
326-349	Peoples and Cultures courses
350-499	Topical and Thematic courses

I hope that you will accept twenty copies of this cover letter with the list of new and old numbers instead of twenty copies of individual courses, unless courses are new.

The following courses are new courses and I am enclosing twenty copies of each course:

- Anthropology 309 - Medicine and Culture (changed from Anthro. 371)
Health and Medicine in Cross-Cultural Perspective)
- Anthropology 429 - Exploring the African-American Past (New)
- Anthropology 482 - Arts of the African Diaspora (New)
- Anthropology 484 - Collecting and Exhibiting Culture (New)
- Anthropology 490 - Writing - and Reading - Culture (New)
