III. New Business

1. Website changes: GER applications to have the submitter provide more detailed information on how they are meeting the GER criteria. EPC

- discussed the idea of forming a sub-committee to review the GER applications for its GER criteria. The GER committee will bring to the EPC meeting their recommendation for further discussion.
- 2. The EPC approved a motion to limit the number of hours for which students can pre-register to 16. The motion derived from a concern that students are unable to register for classes because upperclassmen often pre-register for 18 hours and subsequently drop one or two classes at the end of Add/Drop. Ed Pratt will work out the details of this policy with the Office of the Registrar, the School of Business Administration, and the School of Education.
- 3. The EPC approved a motion to change Catalog wording concerning when students must declare a major. Under the previous system, some freshmen and first semester sophomores were required to declare a major, because they had entered the College with a significant number of AP, IB, and dual enrollment credits. Also, entering transfer students with 54 credits were forced to declare a major upon matriculation. The old and new language follows:

Old Language

Upon completing 39 credits students are eligible to declare a major. {In the Schools of Business and Education, declaration of major is not equivalent to admission to the program; check the catalog sections on these programs for information about admission criteria.) Declaration of a major shall occur before the end of the sophomore year, defined as when a student has earned 54 credits.

New Language

Students may declare a major after completion of 39 credits. Declaration of a major is required of students with 54 credits. Students who matriculated with AP, IB or dual enrollment credits, however, may wait, if they wish, until they have earned 39 credits since high school graduation. Transfer students entering with 54 or more credits may delay major declaration until the end of their first semester at the College. Students planning majors in the Schools of Business or Education must apply and be admitted. Check the Business and Education sections of the catalog for prerequisites and admissions criteria.
