1. Minutes of the last meeting

The minutes of the meeting on December 4, 2014, were approved unanimously:

II. Regular business

A. The following new courses were approved unanimously:

- CRWR 372: Creative Writing: Nonfiction
- ENGL 200: a topics course designation for COLL 200's in English. This was approved but some concern was expressed over how COLL 200's would be handled as topics courses.
- B. The following course changes were approved (unanimously unless otherwise noted):
 - CRWR 466, 468, 469 and 471, advanced workshops in various types of creative writing; course descriptions changes to clarify policy on repeating courses for credit
 - CHIN 320, Chinese Popular Culture: course number change to CHIN 220. This was approved, although with this course and with ENGL 200, concern was expressed that faculty were under the mistaken impression that COLL 200 courses needed to be numbered 200 or in the 2xx range.
 - CLCV 430, The Roman Home: course number and title change to CLCV/GSWS 455, The Roman Family.
 - HIST 408: NIAHD Field School in Public History. Amendment to the course description to allow the course to be repeated for credit.
 - PSYC 455, Autobiographical Memory: Removal of PSYC 311 as a prerequisite.
 - THEA 201, Beginning Acting: Change from 3 to 4 credits in view of the course's five regular contact hours and significant out-of-class requirements. This was approved by majority vote.
