1. The meeting started at 8:34 am; the minutes of January 26, 2016 were approved.
2. Two courses were retroactively approved for COLL 200 status for the current semester only:
 - JAPN 208/308, ALV, reaching out to CSI,
 - HIST 212, CSI, reaching out to ALV
3. The committee discussed plans for future faculty fora and potential motions to be sent to the FAS meetings later in the semester, regarding ACTV and teaching COLL 150 in languages other than English.
4. The committee discussed the pilot assessment of the Fall 2015 COLL 100 and 200 courses.
5. The following applications were approved:

ARTH 368 Golden Age of Spain approved as GER 4a.

SOCL 435 Crime and the Life Course approved for a permanent number.

SOCL 354 Qualitative Sociology approved for the ACTV designation.

Jack's idea for a COLL 300 progression (culminating with LING 480 Community-based study in Linguistics) was discussed but tabled for future consideration.

RELG 319 Mesopotamian Religion was approved as COLL 200, in both the ALV & CSI domains.

CHIN 322 20th C Chinese Lit was approved as COLL 200, ALV reaching out to CSI.

CHEM 201 Color, Light, Chem was approved as COLL 200 in the NQR domain, reaching out to both the ALV & CSI domains. A number other than 200 should be used, per the request of the Registrar's office. (CHEM 200 was listed in the Curriculog application.)
