1. Approval of previous minutes

2. Post-Baccalaureate Certificate in GIS (Geospatial Information System/Science)

Shannon gave a description of the proposed certificate program. The highlights are: the program is aimed at professionals only; courses are cross-listed as 400 and 500 levels; on-line courses may be offered in the future; the number of credits is fifteen but may be increased to eighteen for a possible GIS minor.

Sallie pointed out that there is no certificate program in A&S now. A task-force may need to be created to study policy and logistic issues.

EPC advised Shannon to start submitting proposals for new and modified GIS courses. Meanwhile, EPC will form a subcommittee that will include Shannon to start working in the summer or fall.
