1. Approval of Minutes from September 24, 2020 and Consent Calendar for October 2, 2020

Without objection, approval of the Minutes from 9/24/20 was tabled until the 10/8/20 meeting.

The Consent Calendar for 10/02/20 was approved without objection.

2. Proposals

CONS - 201 - Introduction to Integrative Conservation COLL 200

Some members requested a course syllabus at the 9/24 meeting. Although a syllabus was posted 9/25, some members requested additional syllabic details on how methodologies for the COLL domains would be applied.

No vote was taken. Josh will contact the instructor for additional detail on how the course handles the COLL domains.

FMST - 351 - Washington DC News & New Media Winter Institute COLL 300 Global Studies - Latin American Studies Curriculum Change

Several members noted that the cross-cultural and/or global component was not well described in the proposal of syllabus.

The proposal was not approved. Josh will inform the instructor and express the members' concerns that the COLL 300 criteria was missing or unclear.

KINE - 380 - Introduction to Clinical Practice New Course

Proposed changes were not discussed under this title, but were discussed under the item Bioethics in Clinical Practice.

KINE - 380 - Bioethics in Clinical Practice New Course

Josh clarified that the proposal was for a change in course title and course description, rather than for a new course. Members reviewed the syllabus which focused on topics covered rather than course logistics. Cory noted that this is an established course.

The proposal was approved.

THEA - 320 - Creativity is not just for the right brained: The business of the Performing Arts. New Course

The proposal was approved.

3. Kinesiology and Health Sciences - Change of B.S. degree name to “Human Health”

Josh clarified for the group that this proposal is a curricular change to KINE regarding their degree name, not a course change as originally uploaded to Curriculog. Su noted that the degree name change is a different process than the department name change.

KINE has been preparing to change its SCHEV designation to the STEM/Health classification. Therefore, they propose to change the degree name to “BS in Human Health.”

The proposal was approved. This change will be announced at the A&S meeting on Tuesday, 10/6.
