ECON 300 - Emerging Cities, Migration and Informality

The application was resubmitted and has not yet reached the EPC step, so it will be considered once the application returns to EPC.

Global Studies - Asian and Middle Eastern Studies Curriculum Change

The catalog description is not complete, so EPC will revisit the application after it is modified.

## Foreign Language Proficiency (FLP) for Portuguese

The syllabi for LAS 101-202 (Portuguese and Brazilian Culture) are consistent with standards for modern languages. However, there are two main concerns remaining: First, there was concern that LAS would not be able to guarantee staffing of the courses every year, in which case some students could begin the sequence with 101-102 but then not be able to complete the sequence. Second, the comparison was made to languages that are taught in MLL, which have several layers of oversight including class visits by other faculty, all intended to share suggestions and ensure consistency in the quality of those courses.

Magali Compan (Modern Languages and Literatures) noted that there was a report on lesser-taught languages from an ad hoc committee formed by Dean Conley in 2018. She will try to obtain the report and forward it to the rest of EPC.

Dean Donahue (Educational Policy) will speak with Dean Donoghue-Velleca (A&S) to consider staffing concerns and gauge her opinion on the issues raised by EPC.

Sallie Marchello (Registrar) mentioned that the catalog description for the Foreign Language Proficiency appears to imply that any language course at the 202-203 level will satisfy the FLP. This would include LAS 202 by default. EPC will consider whether the intent is only to include "approved" languages at the 202-203 level, and if so to tighten the catalog language.
