COLL 300 review update

A subcommittee has begun to meet to review and propose a revision of the COLL 300 requirement.

The subcommittee is composed of Ben Boone (CLA), Francie Cate-Arries (ISAC), Josh Erlich (EPC), Christine Nemacheck (CLA), Kristin Wustholz (EPC). John Donahue (Dean of Educational Policy) supervises and Denise Ridley-Johnston (Institutional Accreditation and Effectiveness) advises.

Over the break, the subcommittee reviewed surveys conducted by the CLA of faculty and students regarding effectiveness of the COLL 300s, and held two focus groups of faculty who had taught COLL 300s. A draft of proposed catalog language for COLL 300 was presented.

In February the subcommittee plans to host two town hall meetings with faculty to consider proposed COLL 300 revisions. EPC will present the final COLL 300 proposal at the March FAS meeting.
