**COLL 300 review update**

Discussion of the COLL 300 revision language included a request to clarify whether courses focused on indigenous/U.S. protectorates are allowed; and a suggestion to replace “others’ ways of thinking” with “diverse ways of thinking” or similar. There was an appreciation for the focus on courses rather experiences, but confusion as to whether generic study-abroad courses satisfy the learning expectations of COLL 300.
