2. Discussion of CONS concentration with John Swaddle (Faculty Director of the Institute for Integrative Conservation)

The discussion highlighted several points of clarification:

- 1) Relation to ENSP: the CONS concentration curriculum would not belong in ENSP. Students could double major in CONS/ENSP, even though both would be concentrations in INTR.
- 2) Availability of external partnerships for the research/internship component of the concentration should be guaranteed before the concentration is opened to students.
- 3) Hiring of instructors of required courses after the concentration is opened to students would be risky.
- 4) In case of high demand for the concentration, it will be important to have a way to either limit enrollment or else accommodate enrolled students.
