Description of summer institute courses as currently planned - 7 credits over summer:

- 3 credit content course accelerated over first 2 weeks (Mike Tierney and David Trichler – grading)

May not fit the criteria for COLL 300 any longer – Kristen Wustholz will continue conversations with Erin Battle about this.

EPC discussion of the rationale for 1 credit for reflection course vs. 0 credit. There was a suggestion to modify the course credit and structure to have a 6 credit summer program where the reflection course is combined with the 2-week content course for a total of 3 credits (in addition to the 3-credit internship course).
