**4. Website & Curriculog form updates**

- Discussion regarding Curriculog forms
- Confusion regarding indication of new course or change to existing course
  - Suggest separate boxes added to better delineate between these two types of proposals
- Reviewed revised webpages on “Submit Proposals to EPC” and “Proposal Deadlines”
  - Updated information on cross-linking, delinking, and type of instruction
  - Attempt to make deadlines that are more stable year after year
- Reviewed revised COLL200 Curriculog Form
  - Suggestions for correcting hours necessary for summer school
  - Added language at the end to reiterate best practice to include COLL200 language and goals in syllabi
  - Try to clarify between domains or equally anchored domains
  - Change how course type is identified – TOPICS vs PERMANENTLY NUMBERED
  - \*Cory made the suggested changes in real-time to current form
- Plan to roll out new forms at the same time, next for discussion/review will be COLL300
- Request from the Dean’s Office that EPC consider (marinate) on the idea of setting minimum enrollments to
  - 25 students noting that there will likely be many exceptions
  - Suggestion that the cap be 24 to accommodate better small group divisions
  - Discussed how EPC might partner with the Dean’s office such as justification on proposals for smaller classes
  - Need to also consider making better use of space
- Update from team COLL that work on language revisions has begun
