The By-laws of the committee were approved unanimously at the Sept. 2 2003 faculty meeting and went into effect immediately.

Our first meeting was held October 20, 2003. John Oakley presided until Bruce Campbell was elected Chair.

Our work during the Fall 2003 semester was in four general areas:

- translating its duties under its Bylaws into practical activity: this is an ongoing process.
- selecting Resident Directors (RD) and other faculty for study abroad programs
- evaluating existing and potential new study abroad programs
- conducting other business: this often involved serving as a bridge between the Reeves Center and other campus interests

Work in the Spring will take up the supervision of the International Studies, International Relations and the various Area Studies programs, and continue ongoing aspects of Fall semester work.

To date, we have:

-- approved Resident Directors and other faculty for the following study abroad programs for the summer of 2002 or the 2004-2005 academic year:

Montpellier (Prof. Don Monson approved)  
Florence (Prof. Suzanne Hagedorn approved)  
St. Petersburg (Prof. Bella Ginzburgsky-Blum approved)  
Cadíz (Prof. Cate-Arries approved)  
Cambridge (Prof. Alan Ward approved as RD, Profs. Clyde Haulman and Tom Heacox approved as participating faculty)

--examined or revisited five existing study abroad programs :

--A new agreement between the Université Paul Valéry and the College of William & Mary was approved

--numerous issues regarding the Beijing Program were discussed, without definitive resolution

--the existing student exchange program with the University of Exeter was agreed to be revived

--the timing of the summer program in Florence was discussed to meet the needs of the 2004 RD

--the issue of again awarding William and Mary credit for the Münster Summer Program was discussed, and no change in the current procedure was made.

and

--examined 5 new study abroad or exchange programs

--A new exchange program with the National University of Singapore was approved.

--new programs in Prague, Barbados, Sicily and Nottingham are still under discussion.
