The purpose of this course is to provide the student with the medical terminology to communicate clearly with health professionals and patients. Common medical terms from each of the human body systems will be examined, translated, and pronounced. The format of health records will also be discussed in relation to the use of medical terms.

"Find Med Term" Assignment – this will be a semester long project in which you are tasked to find Medical Terminology in the world around you. This can be in media (TV, movies, etc.), in print (NON MEDICAL RECORDS), or in figures (CDC produced materials, etc.). You are to post in a discussion board and reply to your own post two times – each post will be a separate example for a total of three examples. Each example should also include an explanation of the context and meaning of the term. I will also use examples that you provide in our in person discussions. This will be graded at the conclusion of the semester. All three entries are due by December 3, 2021.

SOAP Note Assignment – this will be due by December 3, 2021. This assignment will require you to pick a condition discussed in the class and write a SOAP note (the type is completely up to you!) that might be observed in a clinical setting for someone with the chosen condition. I will provide a rubric via Blackboard by October 1, 2021. This assignment may be completed any time between the release of the rubric and the last day of classes.

<u>Grading Scale</u> – The grades in this course will be given based on the following scale. In the event of a curve, I will post on Blackboard the change to the scale. All final grades will be rounded to the nearest whole number (0.5 rounds up; 0.4 rounds down).
