WHO WE ARE

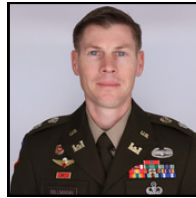
The RGB is a combined Military Science program between the College of William & Mary and Christopher Newport University.

We are 130 cadets strong and welcomed new Cadre during the Spring 2025 semester.

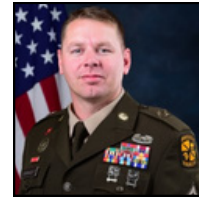
WHAT WE DO

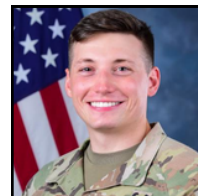

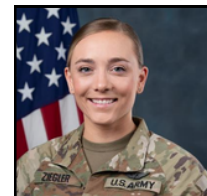

RGBEASTS OF THE SEMESTER

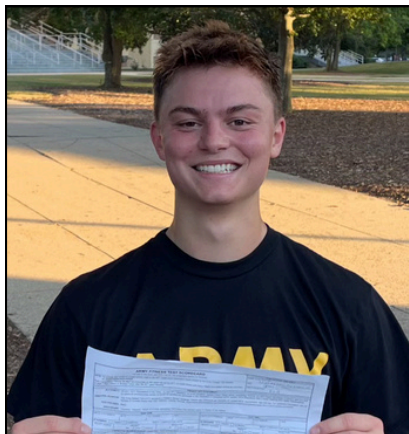
We give our congratulations to these cadets that have been recognized for a mixture of military knowledge, athletic ability, and overall military bearing.
