- We welcomed 1,848 new students to the Tribe in August and shared our commitment to community values through the Honor & Conduct Pledge at the Wren.
- We've emphasized increased collaboration between the Honor Council, Conduct Council, and Conduct & Honor Advisors Program (CHAP) through group trainings & activities focused on personal & professional growth.
- Our Alternative Resolution Pathway continues to engage students in reflective conversations and restorative action plans when they are referred for the conduct process.

Last year, nearly 85% of our conduct cases resolved using this process grounded in the philosophy of restorative practices.

I currently serve as the Regional Co-Chair of the Association of Student Conduct Administrators, and several of our staff recently presented at ASCA’s Summer Conference. Marc Sloan, our Assistant Director, just won national recognition as the Hank Nuwer Anti-Hazing Hero!
