	The student plagiarized significant portions of the student's Ph.D. dissertation. Specifically, the student copied significant portions of other students' Ph.D. dissertations/M.A. thesis. The panel found that the student lied to the dissertation committee by presenting the committee with a product that included work not of the student's work. Further, the panel found the student responsible for plagiarism as significant portions of the student's dissertation included directly copied material from other, unattributed sources. Although the student presented mitigating evidence, the panel felt the evidence did not mitigate from the egregious nature of the violation and believed Permanent Dismissal was the only appropriate sanction.
