Please describe your payment plans, if provided:

Gamma Phi Beta provides two payment plan options for both New and Initiated members. The first option is to pay by lump sum at the beginning of the semester the entirety of the cost of their dues. The first option will be due by October 1st in the Fall and March 1st in the Spring. The second option is to pay in three separate installments throughout the semester. These installments will be due by the 1st of October, November, and December in the Fall and on the 1st of March, April, and May in the Spring. There is no limit on the number of members on a payment plan.

Excused status provides an option for reduced dues if an Initiated Member is experiencing financial hardship, inability to attend chapter meetings/activities, or a combination of the two. Initiated Members must follow international procedure and apply to be placed on Excused Status, which is valid for one semester. The procedure includes providing a written statement to the executive council and receiving approval from the Financial Advisor and Chapter Advisor. No more than 3 Initiated Members may be placed on Excused Status in a given semester. All New and Initiated Members may disclose their preference for a Payment Plan at the beginning of the semester, while Excused Status is reserved only for Initiated Members.

Please describe scholarship options for new and current members, if provided:

The Gamma Phi Beta Foundation provides need and merit-based scholarships that a member may apply for at www.gammaphibeta.org/FinancialAid. Applications for the 2027-2028 school year will open in late fall of 2026.

Sorority residency requirements:

All 17 spots must be filled. All members are required to sign an agreement committing to living in the house if a vacancy arises that cannot be filled. If spots remain open after volunteers are requested, eligible members agree to be pulled via a random lottery process. Seniors, members who are bound by lease agreements at the time of the vacancy, and members whose housing accommodations cannot be adequately met are considered ineligible.

All Sorority Housing is owned and operated by Residence Life. The per-term cost includes room, deposit, wireless internet, and air conditioning. Housing costs for the 2026-2027 academic year are set by Residence Life. Sorority housing is billed at the standard double room rate, which can be found on the William & Mary Residence Life website.

What fees may a member encounter that are separate from dues and fees billed by your chapter?

Gamma Phi Beta members typically spend around \$100-150 on big-little clue week; however, taking a little sister is optional. While apparel is optional, members can buy apparel amounting to approximately \$50 per semester. Members may choose to buy new outfits for date parties/formal/mixers which can amount to \$150 per semester. Depending on recruitment dress code, members may need to buy new clothes amounting to \$100 if needed. A system for lending recruitment clothing between sisters is set up to help reduce the costs of purchasing new clothing when possible. There are no associated fees for missing events, however members are instead assigned to participate in event set up or cleanup or participation in other committees. If your dues payment is late, you will be issued a 3% late fee every month that the payment remains unpaid.
