Payment Plan Options:

Members can select a monthly payment plan and pay dues in 4 different installments throughout the semester (each billed on the 1st, due on the 15th of the month). Members must reach out to the chapter's Vice President of Finance to be put on a payment plan. There is no limit to the number of members who can be on a payment plan.

EFMS (Emergency Financial Membership Status): Members may apply for EFMS if they are facing financial hardships. EFMS requests must be approved by the Chapter President and a Council Advisory Board Member. The EFMS dues breakdown is the same as the study abroad dues breakdown plus the Panhellenic Dues. Three people may be on EFMS for both the Fall and Spring semesters.



IMS (Inactive Membership Status): Members may apply for IMS if they are facing extraordinary circumstances such as a change in academic commitments, study abroad, or other circumstances and need an alleviation of attendance requirements. The IMS breakdown is the same as the EFMS breakdown except those abroad are not required to pay the Panhellenic Dues. Five people may be on IMS for the Fall semester and seven may be on IMS for the Spring semester.

Scholarship Opportunities:

National Kappa Delta provides scholarship opportunities on its website. Applications go live in Mid October and close in Mid-December. These scholarships can only be applied to tuition and academic expenses, not towards dues expenses.

Sorority residency requirements:

All 14 spots must be filled. Members may volunteer to live in the house. If there is greater demand for spots than there are spots available, members are chosen to live in the house based on a point system. Members can earn points by taking on various leadership positions within the sorority, and those with more points will be given higher priority to live in the house. If the spots are not filled through volunteers, all members are entered into a lottery unless they have previously lived in the house or have already signed a lease for the upcoming year. All other members will be entered into the lottery and are chosen at random to be pulled into the house.

All Sorority Housing is owned and operated by Residence Life. The per-term cost includes room, deposit, wireless internet, and air conditioning. Housing costs for the 2026-2027 academic year are set by Residence Life. Sorority housing is billed at the standard double room rate, which can be found on the William & Mary Residence Life website.

What fees may a member encounter that are separate from dues and fees billed by your chapter?

Big-Little: Chapter members typically spend some money during their time as a big during big-little clue week. This is typically in the fall of the year after the member joined the chapter, but can vary based on when a member would like to take a little. There is no expected amount to be spent, but members can spend around \$100-\$150.

Apparel: Apparel is optional and is available once per semester; prices for apparel items typically range from \$15-65, and there are usually 3 different apparel items available for purchase (\$45-195/semester).

Philanthropy: Members must also pay additional fees for philanthropy shirts in the fall semester (typically about \$20). There is also a minimum amount of money (typically \$35) each member is required to raise for the spring philanthropy event. If this minimum is not met, members may have to pay out of pocket.

Sisterhood: Members can choose to participate in additional sisterhood or philanthropy events that are partially subsidized (\$5) and may have to pay out of pocket if they choose to attend events that are not fully subsidized.

Fines: Chapter members must pay fines for certain violations to chapter bylaws, but the chapter tries to avoid fines and seeks all other alternative options prior to fining. Late chapter dues payments are fined 2% for every 30 days a payment is late. Member fines are donated to local philanthropies.
