### Please describe your payment plans, if provided:

An unlimited number of members can choose to be on a payment plan (with no penalty):

- For new members, dues are split into two installments due one month apart, with the first installment due before initiation.
- For initiated members, dues are divided into three installments due on the 25th of the first three
  months of the semester. The first installment payments are due in August for the fall semester
  and January for the spring semester.

## Please describe scholarship options for new and current members, if provided:

The Alpha Chi Omega Foundation offers both merit-based and need-based scholarships for members through an annual application process. This application period opens around March 1st each spring, with awards to be used for the following academic year. New members are eligible to apply.

### **Sorority residency requirements:**

Alpha Chi Omega has 14 available spots in the house, all of which must be filled. Alpha Chi Omega has a live-in requirement that allows members to express interest and sign housing contracts in mid-October of the fall semester each year. The process for filling the facility begins with members expressing interest followed by an open lottery system for remaining vacancies beginning with the newest new member class.

All Sorority Housing is owned and operated by the University Housing Office. Items included in the perterm range amounts are: Room, deposit, wireless internet, air conditioning.

Housing costs for the 2025-2026 academic year are set by the Office of Residence Life. Sorority housing is billed at the premium room rate, which can be found on the William & Mary Residence Life website.

What fees may a member encounter that are separate from dues billed by your chapter: All regular fees are included in the original billing, however there will be merchandise orders and other optional activities that members may take part in. During big-little clue week, members who choose to take a little typically spend around \$75-\$100. After a five-day grace period, our billing software will assess members with overdue invoices a 5% late fee.
