

## Examples of Online and Hybrid Course Attribute Codes

Although this is not an exhaustive list, the examples can give some idea of the differences among the Online and Hybrid Course Attribute Codes.

### TRADITIONAL ON-CAMPUS COURSE CODE:

Code	Example
A	Traditional on-campus lecture or seminar where students and instructor are present for most class sessions. Also courses in which receiving instruction in a secondary on-campus location by videoconference is elective (e.g., courses offered on VIMS campus with videoconference hookup to classroom on main Williamsburg campus). <b>This is the “Default” attribute code and as such is not usually indicated as a course attribute in Banner.</b>

### FULLY ONLINE COURSE CODES:

Code	Example
O	“Typical” online course that is typically completed without the students and instructor ever being in the same place or assembling online at the same time.
N	Online course where instructor and students do not meet in person, but all instruction is held at the same time via videoconference (such as Skype or Adobe Connect).

### HYBRID COURSE CODES:

Code	Example
B	A course meets in a classroom for the first part of a semester. For the rest of the semester, students are away from campus but everyone calls in for a shared weekly videoconference (such as through Skype or Adobe Connect)
C	A course meets 3 days a week. For one day, students and instructor are present. For the other two days, the instructor expects students to complete work online on their own schedule. Even though assignments might have deadlines, the students can read or view instructional materials at different times.
D	An instructor is traveling for a semester and wants to offer a course that takes advantage of their location. So, the first day of the course students gather in a classroom with a faculty member who introduces the course and answers questions. For the rest of the semester, class sessions are held via videoconference (such as through skype or Adobe Connect).
E	An online course is mostly “self-paced”, but the instructor requires students to come to campus to take exams.
K	A course is scheduled to meet regularly someplace other than the Williamsburg or VIMS campuses.
L	A hybrid 3 cr. course is offered specifically for students in the Norfolk area. Every week, instruction is delivered via a videoconference, except for 5 sessions when they all meet in a classroom at Norfolk State for exams or student presentations.
M	A hybrid 3 cr. course is offered specifically for students in the Norfolk area. Instructor and students meet together for 5 sessions. For the rest of the term, the instructor expects students to complete work online on their own schedule. Even though assignments might have deadlines, the students can read or view instructional materials at different times.
