Academic Year 2015-2016

The estimates herein are provided solely for I-20 and DS-2019 issuance. All international students who will apply for F-1 or J-1 visa/status must show adequate financial support for their program of study in the United States. The I-20 or DS-2019 cannot be issued until the student has provided financial documentation to show that he/she has sufficient funds to study for the first year and a reasonable expectation that funds will be available for subsequent years. Students will upload their documentation through iStart.

*Students beginning the joint degree program at St Andrews University will pay tuition to St Andrews for all 4 years of the program and thus only need to show funds for living expenses. Students beginning the program at W&M must show both tuition and living expenses.

Bringing dependents?: Add \$5,500 per dependent (spouse or child who will accompany you on an F-2 or J-2 visa)
