USS Monitor: Historic Landmark Award



Olga Trofimova attended the ASM International Historic Landmark Award Ceremony on June 6th. The award ceremony was held at The Mariners' Museum in Newport News to recognize the USS Monitor. Opening remarks were presented by David Krop, USS Monitor Conservation Project Manager. The highlight of the evening was the unveiling of the USS Monitor engine which was recently removed from electrolytic reduction treatment.

According to ASM International, the ASM Historical Landmarks Designation was established in 1969 to identify permanently the many sites and events that have played a prominent part in the discovery, development and growth of metals and metalworking. In 1987, the scope of this award broadened to include all engineered materials.
