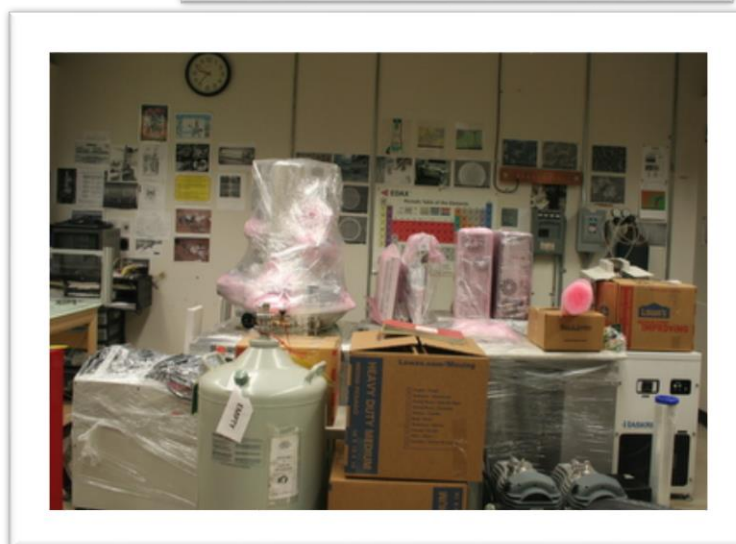
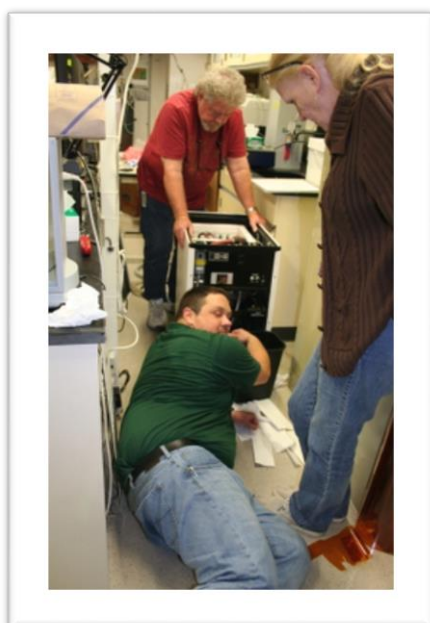
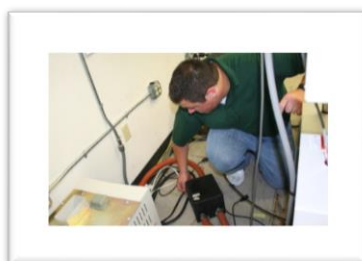


## July 2016 - Lab News
