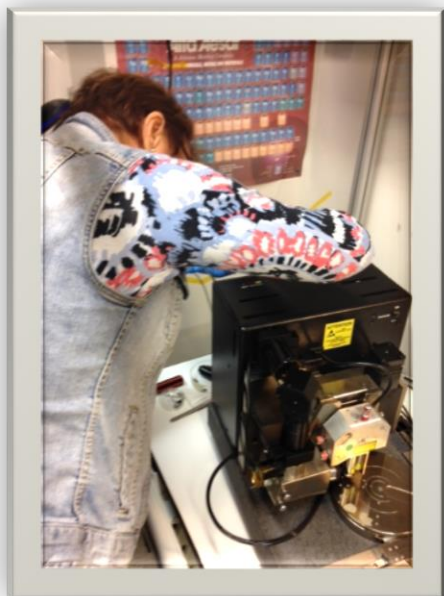

Olga is pictured here performing maintenance on the AFM.

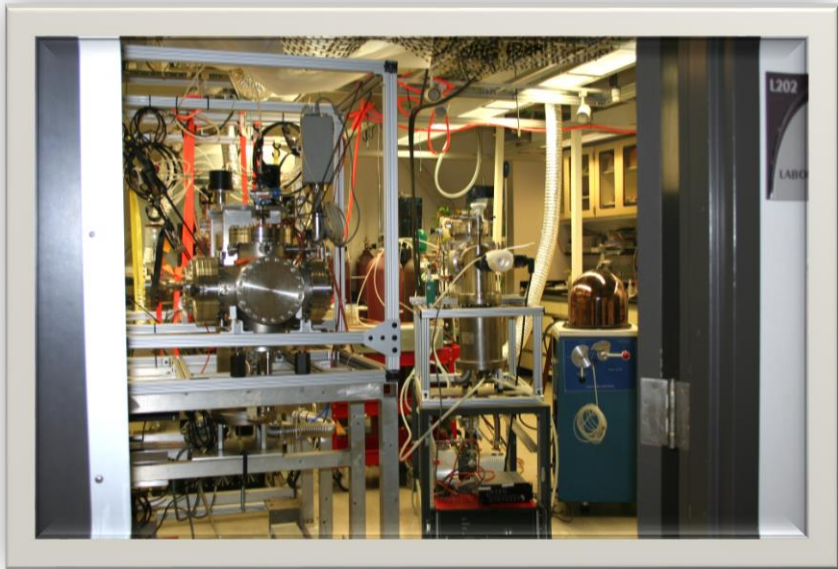
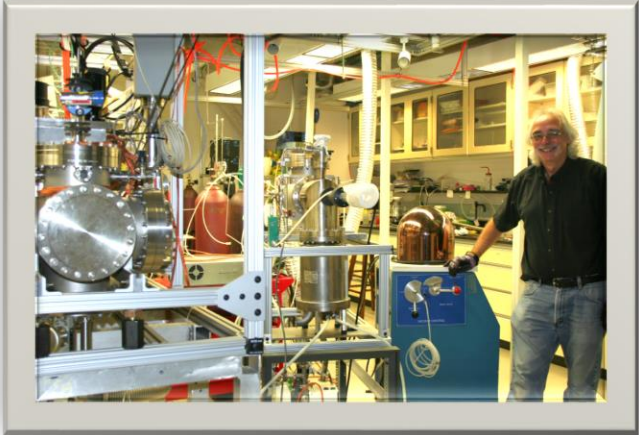
