

Residence Life at W&M

- Housing 4,560
 - 75% of undergraduate students
 - 15% of graduate students
 - o in 65 buildings
- Budget \$23 million
- Room rates for 2010-11 range from \$4,764-\$6,526 per year
- 163 student staff supervised by seven Masters level Area Directors
- RA to resident ratio
 - freshmen 1:25
 - upper-level 1:35
