 By 2018, 820,000 of the expected 1.3 million job vacancies in Virginia will require postsecondary credentials

 64% of all Virginia jobs will require postsecondary education by 2018

College Access

 Historically, college attendance (and associated benefits) has been least accessible to traditionally underrepresented populations, including persons from low-income families, first generation students, persons with limited English proficiency and persons from a variety of racial and ethnic groups.





Virginia College Application Week

- 97% of students think their high school should continue to host
- 28% of students hadn't planned to submit a college application before
 VCAW
- 27% of students said VCAW made a difference in their plans for life after high school
- **45%** of students didn't know about college application fee waivers prior to VCAW
- 46% of students used a college application fee waiver during VCAW
- 71% of institutions surveyed said their institution benefitted from VCAW
 and that it helped satisfy institutional objectives and goals related to access
 and outreach

- Virginia's campaign to increase FAFSA completion will occur between September 2013 and May 2014
- •4% equals approximately 15,000 more FAFSAs than last year
- •Submitted FAFSAs will be tracked by the U.S. Department of Education's Office on Federal Student Aid
- Progress will be posted on the VASFAA.com website
